

The White House has begun floating trial balloons for candidates President Obama might appoint to the U.S. Supreme Court to replace retiring Justice John Paul Stevens.

Stevens, who turns 90 on April 20, announced Friday, April 9, that he will retire from the high court at the end of June. Some court observers credit Stevens with having forged a majority of



the court to overturn laws banning private sexual relations between persons of the same sex when the court overturned the Texas sodomy law in Lawrence v.

The "who will nominated" guessing game is a well-known ritual,

played by anonymous White House sources, a willing and competitive media — and even justice-wannabes who know how to capitalize on the power of the rumor mill.

The Associated Press is, thus far, winning, claiming that it has "confirmed" the names of seven potential nominees on a list of candidates it says is 10 people long.

The seven include nominees that are generally

Cathedral of Hope celebrates final beams of Interfaith Peace Chapel

The final beams for the \$3.7 million Interfaith

Peace Chapel at Cathedral of Hope were hoisted into place on Wednesday, April 14.

The chapel is part of a larger design by architect Philip Johnson that was his major project before his death at age 98 in 2005.

Before the final two girders were lifted into place and secured to the structure in front of a

crowd of more than 100, Muslim, Jewish and Buddhist prayers of peace were said by representatives of each faith.

The Rev. Jo Hudson, the Cathedral's rector and senior pastor, led a Christian prayer.

"What a great moment this is," Hudson said.





Jenkins, Villarreal win runoffs

New constable, county judge candidate win big in LGBT precincts

Clay Jenkins and Beth Villarreal both won the gay vote on their way to victories in Dallas County Democratic runoffs on Tuesday, April 13.

In what Stonewall Democrats of Dallas has identified as the county's most heavily LGBT precincts, Jenkins received 60 percent of the vote to Larry Duncan's 40 percent. Overall, Jenkins defeated Duncan by a margin of 65 percent to 35 percent to become the Democratic nominee for county judge. He'll face Republican Wade Emmert in November.

Villarreal, meanwhile, trounced Precinct 5
Constable Jaime Cortes in the most heavily LGBT precincts, capturing 75 percent of the vote to the incumbent's 25 percent. Overall, Villarreal defeated Cortes by a margin of 58 percent to 42

Developer announces plans for ilume Too

Acquisition of acreage across Cedar Springs is first step in expanding luxury, gay-oriented complex

The developer of ilume plans an expansion of the posh, gay-oriented complex on 4 acres across Cedar Springs Road.

The Crosland Group, which recently completed the five-story, 340-unit ilume, announced this week that it has acquired the property that was once the site of the Douglas Park and 4242 Cedar Springs apartment complexes.


The previous owner of the property, the Lane Co., demolished the complexes last year after they sat vacant for more than 18 months. The Lane Co. was unable to secure financing for a development it planned, and the property went into foreclosure.

Luke Crosland, chairman and CEO of the Crosland Group, said he hopes to complete a 220-unit complex, called ilume TOO, at the site within the next two years.



Police investigating charge 2 men drugged, raped a third man

Dallas police are investigating an alleged sexual assault that began when two suspects put a drug in the victim's drink at Station 4.

Sen. Cpl. Kevin Janse, a spokesman for the Dallas Police Department, said the victim reported that the suspects offered him a Red Bull at S4 shortly after midnight on Sunday, April 11.

The suspects then told the victim they'd put a drug in his drink, and he began going in and out of consciousness, Janse said. The suspects carried the victim out of the Cedar Springs Road nightclub and put him in their vehicle. They drove him

to an apartment, where they sexually assaulted

The victim told police that he fled the apartment when he woke up the next morning, Janse said. The victim went to Parkland Hospital, where police responded at about 8:15 p.m.

The victim is a 29-year-old white male. The suspects are described as two white males in their

Janse said Wednesday, April 14 that police were still working to identify the suspects.



Activists gathering for State of the State conference in Austin

Equality Texas Foundation hosting daylong event to educate LGBTs on current Texas policies and how to work to change them

AUSTIN — Hundreds of LGBT activists from across Texas will gather at the Capitol on Saturday, April 17 for the second biennial State of the State Policy Conference.

The daylong conference is hosted by the Equality Texas Foundation in off legislative years. This year's installment will feature more than 60 experts in panels and plenary sessions on topics from safe schools to hate crimes to workplace equality.

Chuck Smith, interim executive director at Equality Texas, said the goal of the conference is two-fold: to educate people about current policy on LGBT issues in Texas, and to show them what they can do to change it.

"If you really do want equality, this is like the

nuts and bolts," Smith said. "You can stand on a street corner with a sign and demonstrate, and you might get your picture on the news, and that is helpful, but if we're talking about changing laws, this is how you change them."

Smith said he expects up to 150 people to attend the conference, and panelists will include four members of the Texas House. The conference will aim to build momentum for next year's session, when Equality Texas will again be trying to pass the state's first pro-equality legislation since 2001.

"It's not impossible to achieve progress in the state of Texas, but it does require a lot of work, and it requires continuous work," Smith said. "This is kind of an update, and a pat on the back and a kick in the butt to keep at it."

The conference is free and includes a breakfast and lunch. Online registration will continue through Friday, April 16 at www.EqualityTexas.org. Those who show up at the door without registering can get in but may not be able to eat.

The conference will be from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. in Room E2.002 of the Texas Legislative Conference Center at the State Capitol, 1100 Congress Ave. in Austin.

Dallas consultant dies in Thailand

Rumors Perry Upchurch was murdered untrue; cause of death appears to be stroke

Perry Upchurch, a prominent gay design consultant from Dallas, was found dead in his hotel room on the island of Koh Samui, Thailand, on April 5. He is believed to have died from a stroke.

Upchurch had arrived for a visit that weekend and spent Sunday with friends touring the island.

Because Upchurch fell and hit his head, police initially suspected foul play but later ruled it out.

Former Dallas retailer Ken Knight called Upchurch "the eternal Southern frat boy."

Upchurch graduated from Wake Forest University and lived in Memphis before moving to Texas in 1975. He had several design-related businesses in Dallas.

His current business, Perry Upchurch Design, was a retail and wholesale consulting firm on Hall Street at Oak Lawn Avenue.

One of Upchurch's recent clients was Nicholson-Hardie Nursery and Garden Center on Lovers Lane in Dallas. In the July 2009 issue of Garden Center magazine, Nicholson-Hardie credited Upchurch with tripling their gift and home décor sales since 2007.



Before moving to Dallas, Upchurch lived in Memphis and opened stores across the South for furniture retailer John Simmons.

While working for Simmons, Upchurch became a partner in Brandon Christopher Inc., a Dallas showroom at Dallas Market Center. He moved here and became president of the design, merchandising and marketing service for retail and wholesale showrooms.

That was the first of a number of Market Center businesses he owned and managed through his career

Upchurch is survived by his parents Bill and Beth Upchurch of Durham, N.C.; two sisters, Kay Upchurch Brooks and Sarah Upchurch Owen; and his beloved rescue dog Ms. Bentley.



percent. Villarreal will become constable in January, since there is no Republican in the race.

"Obviously as a PFLAG mom, she enjoys that sort of support in the gay community, and unfortunately Jaime had a rather up and down relationship with the LGBT community for quite a while," said David Morris, the openly gay treasurer and co-manager of Villarreal's campaign. "So when the corruption issue started coming forward, it was not unusual for the community to relook at Constable Cortes and say, 'Well, maybe not.""

Cortes was endorsed by Stonewall Democrats, but Morris said the incumbent's efforts to win over LGBT political leaders didn't resonate with rank and file voters.

Precinct 5, once represented by openly gay Constable Mike Dupree, includes the city's most heavily LGBT neighborhoods in Oak Cliff and Oak Lawn

In the county judge race, Jenkins said he was "honored" to receive 60 percent of the vote in the LGBT precincts. While Stonewall Democrats endorsed Duncan, who campaigned as a longtime ally, Jenkins also had his share of gay supporters, including Dallas County District Clerk Gary Fitzsimmons.

"I think Dallas County Democrats reaffirmed their message from the primary last night," Jenkins said Wednesday. "I think what they said was, it's time for new leadership at the Commissioners Court that brings people together to get things done."

Despite the sometimes bitter clash between

LGBT supporters of the two candidates, Jenkins is hoping the community can unite behind him in November.

"I hope to have the support of all Democrat groups and the majority of every community in Dallas County," he said.

Stonewall Democrats of Dallas

Erin Moore, president of Stonewall Democrats, said the group will meet Saturday, April 17 to reendorse in races where its endorsed candidate was defeated — including four of Tuesday's seven runoffs.

"We're all one big party now again instead of individuals fighting for the nominations," Moore said. "We supported who we thought would be better on our issues, but that doesn't mean the other candidate not a good candidate and not a good Democrat."

Moore said Stonewall Democrats will also be endorsing in May school board elections. Saturday's meeting will be from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Resource Center Dallas.

"It'll have similar features to ilume, but it'll have a little different amenity package, so members at both places can go back and forth," Crosland said. "It's all about socializing and bringing our community together. We've built a community here around the GLBT culture."

The Crosland Group is now seeking financing for the new development, which Crosland said is only possible due to the success of ilume, where more than 60 percent of residential units are already leased.

Three businesses have also opened on the ground floor of ilume: Beyond the Box, Dish and Red Mango. Crosland said he expects to announce retail leases next week for a sushi lounge and a Southwestern cantina.

The new complex won't have any retail, but will include a fitness center, a dog park and a private movie theater, Crosland said. The Crosland Group is "ilume-inating" the Lane Co.'s existing plans, which had already been approved by the city.

Pricing will be comparable to ilume, where units lease for about \$1,000 to \$1,200 monthly.

Scott Whittall, president of the Cedar Springs Merchants Association, said he'll be glad to see a return of residents to the property that was initially closed down more than two years ago.

The Douglas Park and 4242 Cedar Springs property has been the most visible example of recession-stalled redevelopment in Oak Lawn.

"There's no question that we've felt the impact of all the units not being there anymore," Whittall said. "Those people that we used to see every single day, we've said goodbye to so many of them, because where they lived is no longer there."

Whittall said there's also "no question" that the addition of ilume has benefited the opposite end of the strip, where three new businesses have opened or been announced in recent months.

"After seeing what they've done where they are now, and what they've brought to the street already, the buzz and the excitement, to double that is pretty darn exciting," Whittall said. "It's created an awareness of Cedar Springs by a lot of people who in the past have not come to Cedar Springs."

Whittall also said the Crosland Group's decision to cater to LGBT residents has helped preserve the traditional gay neighborhood.

"It helps us a great deal when you have something as big and important as ilume saying that they're a gay community," Whittall said.

Crolsand said the new complex will take two years to build, and he hopes to break ground in the next six months. In the meantime, he's discussing with the Merchants Association the possibility of holding special events on the vacant property.

She said that people who attended the ceremony would always remember this as one of the important milestones in the history of the church.

Hudson introduced several of the people involved in construction of the chapel. Among them was Gary Cunningham, the local, on-site project architect who took the concept and translated it into a physical building.

The project manager spoke and thanked people involved with the construction including the person "in charge of tearing up the parking lots."

Because the church is in the glide path to Love Field, special clearance for the crane had to be obtained by the church before construction began, and the FAA had to be notified each morning before work began.

The crane is tall enough that it reportedly showed up on Love Field radar.

Groundbreaking for the building was held for November 2007, and construction was expected to take nine months. Because of the economy, actual work was postponed until January 2009.

Construction is expected to continue through September and the chapel should open in November.

The building covers more than 8,000 square feet and at its highest point stands 46 feet tall, higher than a four-story building.

Cunningham added a basement that was not in the original Johnson design.

Beau Heyen, the church's youth minister, said he was excited that it would give him additional classroom space. He said the basement also would provide storage space for groups that use the building.

The 175-seat chapel is intended for weddings, memorial and interfaith services, and other religious and meeting functions.

Cunningham said the building could not have been built as efficiently three years ago. A new computer program allowed him to create exact specifications for each steel beam, which were sent to a steel foundry in Fort Worth.

"They bend steel from our computer disk," he said. "Every stud is different."

The pieces arrived numbered so that they knew exactly where each girder went.

He said the building is lighter and stronger than it would have been had it been constructed without this technology.

"It's a green building and sustainable," Cunningham said.

That raised the price of construction some, he said, but it will be much cheaper to maintain in the long run. He called it the most automated building ever built.

Cunningham said that the computer did not completely replace the human eye: "One window, it didn't see a funny blip."

That took people to make the correction.

An adjoining building would seat 2,200 people and cost an estimated \$40 million.

On April 11, the Cathedral had the final beams displayed outside during Sunday worship services. Members were invited to sign them before

Love named executive director of Soulforce

Abilene pastor brings combination of business acumen and religious experience to activist organization

ABILENE — Cindi Love, former leader of the national MCC church, has been named executive director of Soulforce, the organization founded by the Rev. Mel White in 1998 to confront the religious right on LGBT issues.

White said Love, who recently stepped down after four years as executive director of the Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches, brings a combination of business experience and spiritual and organizational knowledge.

"Let her show what can be done," White said. "I'm very grateful she's willing to take over."

Love said that she hopes to forge alliances with other national and local groups to focus on acceptance. While some things can be legislated, she believes real equality will only be achieved when people believe God sees gays and lesbians as equal.

"We must stand together on this issue," she said.

Soulforce is perhaps best known for its Equality Rides. LGBT students travel by bus to campuses not normally seen as gay friendly to engage in dialogue.

"I love watching them work," Love said.

Last week, the equality riders visited two campuses in Abilene and were allowed only limited access to talk with students, Love said.

"No one was arrested or thrown out," she said, adding that neither is always a bad thing. "But we can't heal while we're afraid to talk."

Love said her approach to Soulforce will be a dual strategy of protest and dialogue. She likened it to ACT UP demonstrations balanced by com-

munity leaders talking to elected leaders.

"There were always people working behind the scenes," she said. "The two parts of the process are both equally important."

She referred to acceptance of gays and lesbians by churches as "consumer adoption." And she said she doesn't believe that most religious people reject the LGBT community.

"We just allow fundamentalists to have the

loudest voice," she said.

Love will maintain her office in Abilene. Some administrative functions, such as accounting, would continue in the Soulforice's Austin office established during the tenure of Jeff Lutes, the previous executive director. White will continue his work in Virginia where he works and lives, across the street from Jerry Falwell's church.

Love described Abilene as "the third most con-

servative city in America," making it a perfect home base for Soulforce.

From 2005 until April 2009, Love served as executive director of UFMCC, also based in Abilene. But before that her background was business.

She started several companies and INC Magazine named her a Top 50 entrepreneur in 1990.

She received a commendation from Gov. Ann Richards for bringing a computer-based education system developed in Israel to the U.S. The program was used in countries with a large influx of immigrants. She said it helped children in grades K-4 increase reading scores by a year-and-a-half in just a few months.

Love encouraged dialogue on prejudice and discrimination in her book, "Would Jesus Discriminate?" about her experiences as a corporate executive and her entry into the ministry through her leadership of MCC.

While working as executive dean at Brookhaven College in Dallas, she completed her requirements for ordination by MCC. She said Rev. Margaret Walker of Exodus MCC in Abilene encouraged her.

"She saw something in me I never saw," Love said.

White said, "She'll take the organization to new heights." $\hfill \blacksquare$

Wednesday's topping off ceremony.

Johnson is probably best known for designing the New York State Theater in Lincoln Center. However, he has made a mark on North Texas architecture as well.

His contributions to Fort Worth include the Water Gardens and the original Amon Carter Museum built in 1961 as well as the 2001 addition. In downtown Dallas he created the Kennedy Memorial, Thanks-Giving Square and the Comerica Tower. And while he has more skyscrapers in New York City, his Pennzoil Place in Houston is considered a landmark in high-rise construction.

Cunningham called the Interfaith Peace Chapel one of Johnson's most important designs.

friendly to the LGBT community, based on what little is known of them right now.

They include Solicitor General Elena Kagan, Michigan Gov. Jennifer Granholm and Homeland Security Secretary Janet Napolitano. The other four include three circuit court judges with brief, but friendly, records on gay civil rights, and a former Chief Justice of the Georgia Supreme Court who is at least liberal enough to be disliked by anti-abortion groups because — they say — she protects constitutional rights to privacy against efforts to legislate morality.

Not on the list — at least not confirmed by Associated Press — are two openly gay candidates mentioned last time around: Stanford professors Kathleen Sullivan and Pam Karlan. The likelihood of their being considered, given the hostile partisan climate of the Senate right now, seems nil.

The seven who are reportedly under consideration include:

• Former Georgia Supreme Court Chief Justice Leah Ward Sears, who was the first African-American woman to serve as chief justice of any state supreme court — and she did so in Georgia.

During that time, she twice sided with decisions overturning the state's laws against sodomy. "The individual's right to freely exercise his or her liberty is not dependent upon whether the majority believes such exercise to be moral, dishonorable, or wrong," wrote Sears in a concurring opinion in Powell v. State in 1998.

She is also friends with conservative Justice Clarence Thomas, who would likely be an asset in persuading conservative senators to give her their support.

• 9th Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals Judge Sidney Thomas, who was appointed by President Clinton in 1995.

He dissented from a 9th Circuit decision that said it was permissible for San Francisco police to do strip searches and body cavity searches of all arrested persons — even those arrested for nonviolent acts of vandalism during a gay Pride event. He also agreed with the full circuit's refusal to hear a school district's appeal of a decision that found it unconstitutional for a school to bar a gay student from wearing a gay Pride T-shirt.

• Solicitor General Elena Kagan, whose position is sometimes referred to as the "10th justice" because of the importance of that role before the nation's highest court. From the moment Obama nominated Kagan to the position, speculation began that she would eventually be his nominee to the court.

She was a clerk for liberal Justice Thurgood Marshall and, as dean of Harvard Law School, defended a non-discrimination policy that barred military recruiters because of their discrimination against gays. That, coupled with her status as single and having served as a research assistant for the great defender of gay civil rights, Laurence Tribe, has right-wing conservatives up in arms.

• 7th Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals Judge Diane Wood, who clerked for liberal Justice Harry Blackmun and was appointed by President Clinton. She has a mixed record on gay-related cases,

something that probably bodes well for her prospects for confirmation.

In 2000, she joined a panel decision against a gay man, Robert Mueller, who violated the terms of his release from prison for having refused to file his tax returns because he could not file a joint return with his partner. But two years later, she dissented from a panel decision that found no fault in a school district's failure to prevent harassment of a teacher for being gay.

She also dissented from a 1998 panel decision that allowed students to object to their student fees going to gay groups and other organizations of which they disapproved.

• Homeland Security Secretary Janet Napolitano, who was appointed by President Obama. She was governor of Arizona and, prior to that, its attorney general.

As governor, she said she opposed an amendment to the state constitution to ban gay marriage but her reasoning was not that such a ban would be unconstitutional, rather because the state already had a statute that banned gay marriage.

Like Kagan, she is unmarried and subject to frequent speculation about her sexual orientation even though, according to the Arizona Republic, she has described herself as "just a straight, single workaholic."

• D.C. Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals Judge Merrick Garland, who was appointed to the appeals bench by President Clinton and clerked for one of the high court's liberal icons, William Brennan. Garland is the most conservative of the seven nominee candidates.

He joined a decision that upheld a gay Navy man's discharge even though two discharge boards said there was insufficient evidence to merit discharge. He joined a decision that upheld a Federal Communications Commission action against the operator of a low-power radio broadcaster serving the gay community. And he joined then-D.C. Circuit Judge John Roberts Jr. in a decision rejecting police liability for misconduct by officers who sprayed a chemical deterrent on members of a pro-gay protest group during President George W. Bush's first inaugural parade.

• Michigan Gov. Jennifer Granholm, who is labeled a "long shot" by her home state newspaper the Free Press. But her name keeps coming up.

She opposed an amendment to the state constitution to ban same-sex marriage and, following that, sent a letter to constituents assuring them she was not ending benefits for domestic partners. She riled right-wing conservatives recently by issuing a statement calling on state legislators to pass an anti-bullying bill, which the American Family Association sees as part of the gay agenda.

President Obama is meeting with several members of the Senate next week to hear their thoughts on filling Stevens' seat.

Richard Socarides, who worked in the Clinton White House, said he thinks all the potential candidates mentioned thus far would be "pretty outstanding" and "pretty reliable" when it comes to gay civil rights cases.

But he said the president's chief considerations now are "who he connects with best on a visceral level" and "who is most likely to be confirmed."

Lies, damn lies and statistics

How the right wing is distorting the information in the DSM IV-TR in an effort to defeat the Employment Non-Discrimination Act

t is unfortunate that the DSM IV-TR is available to the general public. First of all, it is not a new model of car or an electronic gadget. It is a book.

To be specific it is the "Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders," fourth edition text revision, and it is a handbook intended to be used by trained practitioners in mental health fields. In fact, the introduction of the DSM IV warns against its use by untrained professionals, specifically mentioning its use in legal settings as potentially dangerous.

It is published by the American Psychiatric Association, and is intended as a semantic roadmap for mental health professionals, giving them a common language.

It was an earlier edition of this book that relegated gays and lesbians to the ranks of the mentally ill, and it was a later edition that — with a few words — magically cured us all.

Of course, it took a lot of work in the background by the Caucus of Gay, Lesbian and Bisexual Members of the APA as well as the sincere belief by many doctors that the empirical evidence showed that homosexuality did not belong

This very brief background is intended to give you an idea of what the DSM IV-TR is. The fact that anyone can buy a copy means it can be used by folks who have no business even opening it - folks like the Traditional Values Coalition, to

If you haven't guessed, the TVC is a right-wing fundamentalist group with a decidedly antihuman rights agenda. They are spreading lies about the Employment Non-Discrimination Act (ENDA) and their words are in turn being used by the Republicans to bash LGBT people.

No surprise there. These people are using the DSM IV-TR to back up their claim that if ENDA is passed it would have a cataclysmic effect.

Here is one of the big lies they are propagating:

"What you may not know is that ENDA normalizes and provides special federal protection for 30+ bizarre sexual orientations listed by the American Psychiatric Association the so-called 'Dirty 30.' These 30+ fetishes include behaviors that are felonies or misdemeanors in most states.

LCR, HRC and DADT

I have been reading the recent discussion in Dallas Voice regarding the effectiveness and bloated budget of the Human Rights Campaign. I'd like to contrast this to recent efforts of Log Cabin Republicans and our David and Goliath fight to bring down "Don't ask, don't tell."

On April 5, Log Cabin Republicans filed further action in the United States Central District Court of California against the United States of America and Robert Gates, secretary of defense (http://online.logcabin.org/lcr-opposition-tomsj.pdf) The case is the best hope for judicial action against the legal standing of DADT. The Obama administration is expending substantial resources to defeat our efforts to overturn DADT in this case.

I bring this up in order to contrast Log Cabin Republicans to HRC. With minimal funding and even less staff support than HRC, we are having an impact in real world terms while exposing the hypocrisy of the Obama administration regarding this issue.

We support many of the goals of HRC in achieving equality. athy Griffin owes us big time — and she knows it. She routinely does shout-outs to "my gays," and is attempting to break her personal appearance attendance record not at some mainstream event, but at Milwaukee's PrideFest.

And even when she appears, as she will this Sunday and Monday at the Meyerson with the staid Dallas Symphony Orchestra ("Nothing makes me happier than to use the F bomb much more than the first cello," she says), she expects her gay following to be the torchbearer.

"I don't think of Dallas as the Deep South — my next Bravo special will be filmed in Knoxville, so believe me: You guys are like Chelsea — but whenever I play any of those markets, people warn me. But those shows are the most raucous. That's because the gays will make the drives. They will come three hours to see me. It might not represent the most accurate cross section of Dallas but it's a good crowd. And let's not leave out the seven heterosexual men who were dragged there."

Griffin knows where her bread is buttered. And the surest evidence that she's a true FOG (Friend of the Gays): Even when she's not obligated to be gayfriendly, she gives us props. For instance, when her house got a room makeover on HGTV's Next Design Star, she asked for (but did not get) a gay designer. And when she attempted a rare dramatic acting role on Law & Order: SVU, she played gay.

"They told me I was gonna play 'a white Al Sharpton.' I was so there. I'm actually friendly with Al Sharpton — I love almost every controversial person. I mean, not Ann Coulter — I'm not that nuts."

Griffin even planted a same-sex kiss on series star Mariska Hargitay — though it didn't make it in he final cut when the aired episode.

"[Executive producer] Dick Wolf ended up cutting the lesbian kiss because they thought it went too far. But it will be the buzz of the Dinah Shore," she cracks. Still, the experience was surreal for her.

"You know the demographics for that show is my mom, who's 90, and older people. I never had my Twitter blow up until I committed to *SVU* — they put the gays to shame. It was very exciting," she says. "But the gays are all up in that shit, too. The gays love Chris Meloni and the lesbians love Mariska."

It also made her wonder about the sexual orientation of Hargitay's character.

"The day we shot the kiss, it was a big deal on the set — you could hear a pin drop. She's tough and she's sexy — they almost purposely play her like she's gay," she opines. "Her character has *never* slept with the Chris Meloni character in, like, seven years. I personally don't know any woman who could go seven minutes and not sleep with him."

The guest spot was a departure from *My Life on the D List*, her Bravo reality show for which she won two Emmys...

Putting the 'Q' in Quebec

Montreal's gayborhood, The Village, puts a French twist in North America

Originally named Ville-Marie or City of Mary for you Anglophones, Montreal is a chic, sophisticated gay destination. After Paris, it's the second-largest primarily French-speaking city in the world, though most residents speak English and getting around without fluency is pretty manageable.

For a city with a metro population of more than 3 million residents, Montreal is maneuverable. The gayborhood — called simple Le Village — is the largest in area in North America. Luckily for out-of-towners, it's also easy to find. If you journey down Sainte Catherine Street (the major downtown artery), you'll start seeing rainbow flags and gay porn shops at about Rue Berri. The Village stretches to Rue De Lorimier, in between you'll find a plethora of bars, clubs, coffee shops, boutiques and restaurants, all serving the local and foreign LGBT community.

No matter what you are looking for, you'll be able to find the right place to stay. There are many inexpensive, quaint B&Bs and non-chain hotels, like the Hotel Dorion. A cozy property if you're on a budget, it couldn't be closer to all the action. Situated on Rue Dorion, you can get a standard room or upgrade your stay with a Jacuzzi or other amenities. The Hotel Maritime Plaza is more expensive and about two miles away from the Village but gay-friendly and the service is always on-point.

A truly cosmopolitan city, Montreal (and specifically the Village) offers an eclectic mix of great cuisine, including Le Bato Thai, Restaurant La Strega (Italian) and Le Club Sandwich. More than just a great place to grab a sub, Le Club Sandwich is an institution, diner-style complete with jukeboxes.

If you like cruising with your meal, Le Drugstore is a treat for all of the senses. Part restaurant, part bar, part boutique, it's a huge complex that has a hot wait staff and hosts a large LGBT clientele. There's a variety of menu options, but the best is a burger with a generous helping of the popular favorite *poutine* (a dish of French fries, cheese and gravy; some restaurants put

ketchup or peas on top).

By night, Le Drugstore turns into a popular lesbian bar with three levels of drinking, dancing and debauchery. Parking is the best dance club for the boys only (women are only allowed to join the party on Wednesdays). Also located in the Village, it plays great music spun by local and international DJs. If you want to see nearly naked guys do the dancing, take a swing by Campus and get a lap dance from one of the hot (and usually straight) male dancers. Once again, women are not allowed most nights of the week.

The biggest and most popular gay club in Montreal is the triple-decker Club Unity on Sainte Catherine Street. On the bottom floor you'll find a bar, on the second two bars with a *huge* dance floor and the third offers more bars and another dance floor, all playing a different kind of music. True to its name, the crowd at Unity consists of men and women of various ages, types and orientations.

After the club, if you're looking for a late night "dip," there are a few bathhouses to choose from, all within stumbling distance of the gay clubs. Oasis and Sauna Centre Ville are among the most popular with locals and tourists.

There are beaucoup things to do outside of the Village. Montreal is a city bursting at the seams with museums, landmarks and classic architecture. Visitors who need a shopping fix can get lost at Eaton Centre. Located on Sainte Catherine, Eaton is the largest shopping mall in eastern Canada, serving more than 1 million visitors a week.

If you're looking for a faster but thrilling way to burn through your money, venture over to the Casino De Montreal. Open 24 hours, it offers more than 3,000 slot machines and more than 100 gaming tables, plus a cabaret show for nongamblers.

French, English and other influences fused harmoniously. If you're looking for a uniquely Euro experience, but don't want to leave North America, Montreal is an ideal destination.

The brilliant uncleanness of 'Reasons to Be Pretty'

Every performance of one of the "beauty plays" by Neil LaBute that the Dallas Theater Center shows in repertory in their studio theater is followed by a "cast-audience talk-back." They should be followed by a chemical scrub and complimentary relationship counseling.

I mean this in the best possible way. Some playwrights are merely gadflies who provoke for provocation's sake. But you sense a personal connection between LaBute and his topics, as if he's working out his own issues onstage. His characters tend to be identifiable but unrelatable, like a rare species of bacterium. There's real pain here, and he doesn't care how uncomfortable it makes you feel to witness it.

strous witches who are all pre-menstrual ids, incapable of logic or empathy who delight in public humiliation; all of them are quite dumb as well. (Greg reads classic literature, but it's un-

clear whether he gets any of it.)

LaBute, assisted by the able cast (Adair especially is a chameleon) and director Joel Ferrell, has perfected the art of passive aggression, toying with the audience as mercilessly as the characters toy with each other, setting verbal

traps and all around making you feel a little dirty. But the flashes of recognition — how these characters intrude on the facts of our own relationships — border on the profound. You don't exactly enjoy *Reasons to Be Pretty*, but, like the audition weeks of *American Idol*, it's difficult to look away.





Cooped up

Chickens aren't just for hawks anymore. Urbanites have taken to them as both pets and a lifestyle

When you stop at Chere Hickock's house in East Dallas, you'll be overwhelmed by a slew of things: The garden in the driveway, the architectural beauty of the house and Dashiell, the grey and white dog who comes out to quietly greet you. Immediately you feel the natural comfort of the tucked away spot by White Rock Lake, but it continues to the back where Hickock has another menagerie all cooped up. Literally.

"I've had chickens since 1983 and have loved them ever since. They are totally a blast to have," she says.

Hickock is on the planning committee for A Peep at the Coops Urban Coop Tour, the first of its kind in Dallas. Her house is one of the stops and serves as headquarters for the tour — all because she's happy to spread the good word about owning chickens.

Twelve coops through a self-guided tour highlight this slow food movement happening in this pocket of the city. The tour also educates and displays other sustainable practices like beekeeping, composting and rainwater harvest. Proceeds from the tour benefit the Our Saviour Community Garden and the gardens at Stonewall Jackson Elementary.


But the stars are the chickens. Not only can they be pets, they add to a self-sustaining and green lifestyle. And according to Hickock, the gays love

"There are so many!" she says. "You'd expect it to all be us lesbians, but the urban chicken is the new big thing. I know several gay people who have them and *not* out in the country. Of course, they have these architecturally-designed coops. Gay men take chicken-keeping and gentrify it and make their urban flock fabulous.

For a map of homes, visit Hickock is right there with them. Her self-built run APeepAtTheCoops.blogspot.com (where chickens roam) is a long fence over an area adjacent to the coop where the little cluckers go in and out at night. It's utilitarian and rustic but with enough design to match her

Her renovating background has even turned into a business. Hickok owns Custom Coop Co. and designs coops for her fellow urban chicken owners — but with flair.

If you're thinking about joining the clucking ranks, Hickock says it's eas-

"It's cheap! [Ed. note: pun intended.] For food, you just go to feed stores or Northaven Gardens. They fill that niche. Once you have feeders and waterers, you don't need much else."

New owners need to be aware of predators: Bobcats, raccoons, coyotes,

even dogs. "Lots of things will kill your chickens," she warns. "Just make sure they are secure at night."

Pets or not, the sustainability of chicken-raising is a big plus and a closed loop. Organic scraps feed the chickens, which then create waste for the compost, which is turned into the soil for the garden. Lest we forget, it's also about connecting with the food source.


"It's reconnecting to a simpler time," she says. "There's something about having your own eggs. And the eggs taste so much better and so fresh.

Hazard assessment

Designer Roger Hazard from 'Sell This House' talks up Texas, TV and interiors

Let's face it. There are two reasons to watch Sell This House. The second would be learning how to stage your home to sell better. And in this market, anything helps. The first, well, that should be easy enough.

For obvious reasons, Roger Hazard has attracted a big gay following over the eight seasons the show has been on. A handsome, bearded musclebear is hard to resist. But get past the exterior (as difficult as that may be) and discover an artist at heart.

After finishing an episode, Hazard spoke about his time in Texas and how it led to him being an unexpected pioneer in both television and even the real estate and design industries.

Sell This House airs Saturdays at 8:30 a.m on A&E.

Dallas Voice: You actually grew up in Texas. Hazard: Yeah, I grew up in Houston mostly, but went to school for a year at Highland Park.

I studied landscape architecture at Texas A&M. I worked for a landscape company in Houston and then began flipping houses there. We did shoot a show in Dallas about, I think, three or four years ago.

Then you moved to Atlanta. How was it there? I started flipping homes in Atlanta and did very well. I was flipping about four homes a year. I started staging them to sell quicker and I sold with the furniture I bought for it. That brought in a lot of people. I developed quite a following then but I needed more of a challenge. So I moved to New York.

Is that where you switched to more interior work? I took a position with a top interior design firm. In three months, they said I was overqualified. But now I'm doing some more commercial work in New York.

How was it to go from exteriors to interiors? It depends on the project but there is more of a demand for interior work. You know, a lot of it's the same as when I was studying architecture: light, form, color. All the same principles are applied.

Your career just seems to ascend. How did the TV show come







about? One of my clients that worked in TV was bragging about me at a pitch meeting. Someone said, "I see a TV show." About a month had passed before they called, then they sent a film crew came out and that's how the show started.

Were you ready for TV? Oh no. I was not ready. I pushed cameramen out of the way. TV is very structured in going about achieving a goal. You have to think backwards almost and also get the camera to catch what you're doing.

I was excited to see how it took off like wildfire. I was the first person to introduce home staging on TV and this was the only show of its kind to be

nominated for Emmys. I was very

OK, so what are some things people need to know on their own about the design of their home? People get an emotional reaction to it. People react to furniture style and how it's arranged. If it's arranged around the TV in the living room, it makes it feel like Mom and Dad's house somehow. Know what I mean? Simple accessories and lighting are good to work with, too.

What do you say to the person reluctant to color? Ha! Is beige selling your house? Do you only buy beige clothes? People do have a reaction to color and it doesn't make a room smaller, it makes it more interesting.

Are there common mistakes you

find? Yeah, buying furniture too big for a space. Be careful of covering up wallspace with furniture. So many people use walls as an outline to place furniture. Rooms feel more open or larger when you have to walk around furniture. And you need a free wall for the eye to rest.

Are you working on anything else right now? I'm putting my Web site together, which should be about a couple more weeks. I've been asked several times to write a book, but I wouldn't do one about staging. I'm more about mistakes in designing. I'd call it Design Hazards.

Damn, that was gonna be my headline.

Eclectic galleries prove everyone can own an original piece of art

Gone are the days when only those in a higher tax bracket could afford that snazzy piece of original art adorning the top of the fireplace. Two local galleries — one new, one a bit more seasoned — have moved beyond the idea of unreachable art by focusing on local artists. And people from tiny studio apartments to McMansions are collecting art more and more.

"We opened to create an environment to essentially remove the notion of art as luxury," Brandon Lynch of Artisan Style gallery says.

"Yes, the art is affordable but it's about environments as well. The average customer may have a new home or apartment and wants to add something," Lynch says.

Five years ago, Kettle Art opened in Deep Ellum with the same philosophy under the direction of artistic director Frank Campagna. And they don't get much hipper than this. Campagna and company work to expand the scope of Dallas art and sell it for cheap.

"We prefer showing local talent to nurture and encourage our regional culture. Simply put, if you're serious about your art, drop by and show us what you're up to," Campagna says.

In February, Kettle hosted For the Love of Kettle featuring more than 100 artists' work, all priced at \$50. Before



The whole nine yards

Shahid Malik's evocative landscape designs will bring a timeless oasis to the home. home and it's easy to see he has style. The white palate of his Oak Lawn home is clean and sophisticated with a beautiful aesthetic. That continues to his outdoor fountain, which he designed himself. The stonework, greenery and water have a cohesion that turns his otherwise everyday patio into something else altogether. And this is just in his own home. Malik is originally from Pakistan but

One look at Shahid Malik's own

found his calling in Dallas. After a slew of jobs, he discovered his hobby of working with nature could also be his job. This led him to start a simple yard business of mowing and trimming lawns. But as his clients wanted

more in the appearance of their yard, Malik's eyes began to instinctively see something new.

"When I lived in Pakistan, I always liked working with my plants. And here, I used to have an apartment with a small balcony, but we had the most beautiful flowers and plants. People would ask about it," he says.

Now, he's the owner of Malik Landscape & Design and his company will still mow your yard, but it will also bring an element of beauty that's beyond any bed of perennials. Malik brings architectural elements to his design that not only add to the value of a home, but provide something every homeowner wants - a neigh-

bor's envy.

Working with the customer, Malik comes up with a design based on the client's vision. Sometimes the vision is entirely the client's, but Malik's perspective is not lost. The collaborative effort

translates into works of landscape oases that are part garden, part artistic and all complementing the design of the homes. The company's flyer boasts "out of the box" thinking as the "cornerstone of the company's philoso-

"The work is hard and labor intensive, but all my designs are timeless. They don't use flowers so much. It's more about the green and stone colors and also the upkeep. The less upkeep it can be for the client, the more they will probably appreciate it," he says.

Some of his work includes heavy boulders and rocks laid precisely on top of each other with no filler. Like a puzzle, they fit together and gravity keeps the stone walls and borders in place. He'll create gardening beds out of metal welded into modern angles. Or he will line driveways with magnolia trees of just the right size that neither dominate nor disappear into the overall look.

But he knows with the current economy, not everyone is willing to jump into the high-end cost of adding his landscape design and architecture to

their home. His company even took such a hit that he almost shut down. Having that empathy, he works hard to keep his current clients happy and allows his reputation speak for itself.

"Fancy lawns were probably the last things on people's minds," he says. "But sometimes it can be just as costly if people try to do it themselves."

Not that landscaping is impossible, but Malik sees too many times when people buy all the wrong items for their brand new designs — if they can be called

"People will go to Home Depot and buy everything that is pretty. But that won't work. There are things to think about."

Malik says first to come up with a plan and draw it out. This at least gets the outline going of the space you want to allot to a design and what functions you may want it to have. Designs can accentuate but can also work for the house with walkways or shade.

Next, figure what it is you want in the design. Flowers, grass, stones and plants are all the usual components, but it is important to determine what kind of attention you plan on giving to the design.

Green thumbs may revel in tending to the greens, but minimalists may just want the style of it without devoting much attention to it. Sprinkler systems may figure in at this point.

Mostly, Malik mentions the biggest mistake is getting overzealous and buying a bunch of flowers and plants that simply won't work in your space. The Dallas heat and its unpredictable nature isn't always good for, well, nature. Although these mistakes can be costly, they aren't irreparable. In fact, Malik could sweep in to save the day.

"People shouldn't think I just do high-end designs. The company also does maintenance, pruning and fertilization. If people run into these problems, they can call me. I can help get them

out of their problems and get them on the way to a very nice landscape."

Designing with a (re)purpose

If you want to redecorate, call Anthony Chisom first — he can turn any blah room into a great space all from items within the home

A bad economy is no excuse for being unfashionable. And that's why hiring Anthony Chisom, creative director and CEO of Anthony Chisom Interiors, has become a hot Dallas trend in home décor. Rather than completely starting over with a room, he surveys other rooms in a home to see what could breathe new life into another space.

"Anything within the house can be used. Know that everything is moveable and interchangeable and can work differently in a new room. Make the items do what you want them to do," Chisom says.

Chisom worked in retail for years, but decided to repurpose his own life to do what he's always loved.

"I started in 1999. I found out about my HIV status and didn't want to put my dream on hold any longer," he says. "Interior design is something I was always drawn to. I had all these books and magazines about it and I'd always help friends with their rooms and things of that

He then found his own niche of designing that wouldn't break the budget for clients and could keep the entire process in the home.

"I would take art, furniture, desks from other rooms, just about anything you can imagine because interiors evolve. How a room is set up today may not work best for you tomorrow," he says, referring to the latest addition to his interior—an almost-two-year-old nephew, whom he plans to adopt with his partner, Derrick Smith Gentry.

For a general room repurposing, which includes rearranging furniture and art, as well as accessorizing with items within the home or recommending affordable options from home stores, his fee starts around \$500. He also brings an objective eye to helping people purge items that may be way out of style that they're holding onto for sentimental reasons. Clients may not want to get rid of these items, but they don't have to be center stage, either.

During a recent visit, he showed



Purple spring

One woman keeps her penthouse far from blue with her African violets and green thumb

A wise horticulturist once said, "There are flowers that grow in nature, and then there are flowers that grow in grocery stores." African violets, as with fiery Christmas poinsettias and snowy Easter lilies, are hard to imagine existing in a world void of fluorescent lighting, polystyrene pots and organicallybalanced soil medium sold in 28-liter plastic bags.

Mina Cunningham, a local Dallas devotee of these beautiful, bluish flowers, is testament to why they've achieved such a speedy, and ubiquitous, global popularity far removed from their natural, East-African jungle habitat. When asked her secret for growing perfectly happy, and healthy, velvety-leafed African violets in the merciless southwestern exposure of floor-toceiling penthouse windows in Texas, Cunningham chuckles, "Just plain old ultraviolet window film and utter neglect, my dear."

This ain't your grandmother's win-

play. "I made most all these from a single, original violet. You just need one to start with. To make more, pinch off a leaf, let it sit in a glass of water about, oh, a month, stick it in a small pot of dirt with a saucer that has a big rim—the rim's got to come up big and high, now, because you're not supposed to water the leaves from the top, or get them wet-you pour the water into the saucer underneath the pot and the dirt absorbs it: That's my secret."

African violet plant food helps, of course, she winks — "just seven drops per quart of water every time you water." The brand Cunningham swears by is Shultz African Violet Plus, Liquid Plant Food with Micronutrients 8-

"The spring season ought to bring out the farmer in all of us, but I just don't have any farmer in me, and there's nothing more disheartening in the springtime than planting flowers in a pot and watching them die, no matter what you try," Cunningham chirps.

The history of the wild African violet, however, is unique among humanity's windowsill plants in that, even

though it would logically seem a flower that has been "housebroken" now surely for millennia, it was, in fact, first discovered in 1892 - growing on a shaded rock ledge high up in the lush, cool jungles of the Usambara Mountains in northeast Tanzania. (What a wonder it took so long?) Unique of most eponymous-named plants, the African violet really does hail from Africa.

African violets did not even make it to the United States until 1926, and all highly varied modern varieties since are the result of hybridization. The main (if not sole) reason for their subsequent popularity as the ideal houseplant is that it likes exactly the same temperature people do. Oh, and that it's near impossible to kill doesn't hurt,

"Well," Cunningham, exults, "you can't kill an African violet, not even me; and best of all, their beautiful purple flowers bloom off and on the whole year long. They stay dormant a while, then they show again. All you have to do is go to the grocery store, or, like I said, pinch off a leaf from a friend's and save yourself the money, shove it in dirt and stand back. The purple springs eternal!"

GADGET CORNER

Leave it to the Dyson folks to take a perfectly ordinary devise — this time, the room fan and make it high-tech.

The engineers would probably balk at calling their fancy air multiplier a "fan:" There are, in fact, no fan blades, and that means no buffeting (the choppy air created by spinning blades). Instead, it funnels small amount of air thought a ring that gathers ambient air and shoots it out at 15 times the intake.

Who cares about the complicated mechanics, though? The point is, it's a funky looking piece of equipment that, like many other Dyson products, is as artful to look at as to use.

There are practical advantages, like a low center of gravity, an easy-to-adjust speed setting (not just the "hi-med-lo" routine) and simple cleaning. And it tilts. Trust me, as Texas weather heats up, a fanciful fan like this is a welcome addition.



Pests keep out

Ants, aphids and snails, oh my there are a variety of ways to get rid of garden pests but some are more fun than others.

Fire ants, aphids, slugs and snails are some of the most common garden pests we encounter in North Texas. And there are different ways to get rid of each. There's the right way and then there's my way.

Probably the most insidious pests in a Dallas garden are fire ants. The imported variety, found in this area, is more aggressive than native strains and can cause more damage. They attack other types of ants, other insects and small animals and can damage gardens and even homes and electrical lines.

When their mounds are disturbed, they become aggressive. Their bites are painful.

Armadillos feed on fire ants, but attracting these creatures



into the yard is probably not a good option. A better natural way of controlling fire ants is to sprinkle cayenne pepper around their mounds and along their trails. Also, mix citrus peelings and water and pour on the mound. Orange Guard is the natural, organic fire ant killer available at some private garden centers.

When those approaches fail, Amdro is the chemical, environmentally questionable alternative available at supermarkets and home centers. Sprinkling just a little on the mound usually destroys it within hours when ants take the bait and share it with their queen.

Then there's the old fashioned Texas remedy that I prefer. It's fast, efficient and I get to play with matches. Pour some gasoline on the mound, let it soak in just enough and then set it on fire.



Warning: this may violate some locate city ordinances. But it works.

Garden snails, or escargot as I like to call them, leave a slimy film everywhere they creep. Slugs are even slimier. Both like moisture and need water. If slugs and snails are a problem, water the garden in the morning so the ground will be dry before evening.

Before resorting to nasty

chemicals, try sprinkling some salt directly on any slugs you see and they will disintegrate before your eyes. What fun!

Rosemary is a natural repellent as well. Try sprinkling some of that in the garden. It's also easy to grow and does well in our climate and traditionally bad soil.

Set traps for snails by sinking a small bowl into the soil and fill halfway with beer. The smell will attract them and as they're trying to feed, they'll drown. For those opposed to the use of alcohol for moral or religious reasons — or if you live in Oak Cliff or some other "dry" area of town — grape iuice also works.

Aphids are small, destructive insects that come in a variety of colors. More than 4,400 species of these pests are known. The best organic defense against these plant-killers is ladybugs. While most garden centers will try to sell chemicals and oils to wipe on the leaves of affected plants, the cute little orange insect with black dots on their backs are actually more effective. Home Depot sells a half pint of ladybugs for \$14.95.

Or try spraying affected leaves with soapy water. That will usually get rid of an aphid infestation. Filthy little aphids just don't like nice, clean soapy water.

But there's something about going to Home Depot to purchase bugs that just appeals to me.

the doors opened, a crowd had formed outside waiting to get in and purchase.
