Fort Worth's gay City Councilman put an 'everyman' face on the issue of bullying and teen suicide — and the world took notice

oel Burns had enjoyed his share of viral videos, from Susan Boyle to pets who appear to play piano. But he never suspected he'd become one. But last October, that's exactly what happened. The Fort Worth councilman, who is openly gay, was moved by a string of teen suicides across the nation, many as a result of anti-gay bullying.

But one in particular hit home: The death of Keith Harrington who, after attending a Norman, Okla., city council meeting, took his own life in despair.

"I wrote it all that day," Burns says of the speech he delivered on the evening of Oct. 12. "Tuesday at lunch I wrote it and read the first draft of it [live at the council meeting]. Had I had any inkling that this would go the way it did I would have tightened it up. But it has a rawness to it."

Indeed it does, as Burns recounts, for 12 fascinating minutes, a never-before-discussed incident in his youth where he was bullied.

It brought Burns to tears; it brought everyone watching at City Hall that night to their

And though it happened at the same time as the "It Gets Better" campaign was expanding, that was not Burns' intent at all.

"No, it was not one of those," Burns said last week from his council office. "I hadn't seen any of them but had read Dan Savage was doing something like that. My comments were first and foremost made at City Council; that they got uploaded to YouTube

"I knew that what I was saying was being recorded and it might be used in the future - maybe at a high school in the district I represent — but not what it became."

And what it became, simply, was a sensation: 2.5 million views on the main YouTube posting alone, with thousands upon thousands more in follow-up posts, comments and links by others ... not to mention excerpts broadcast nationally for weeks on MSNBC, The Today Show, Ellen DeGeneres, CNN and hosts of other media outlets.

#### **Everyman**

For a while this fall, you almost couldn't escape the name and face of Joel Burns even if you weren't gay or from North Texas.

## Making the holidays brighter for PWAs for nearly 20 years

Idea for organization began when Rodd Gray was helping install bubblegum pink carpeting in an apartment at Revlon House

When Home for the Holidays began in the early 1990s, the idea was simple: They raised money to send persons with AIDS home to be with their families for Christmas.

Most of the early tickets purchased were oneway tickets, used by many to go home to die.

The idea came to the group's founder and president, Rodd Gray, when he adopted an apartment in Revlon House, one of AIDS Services of Dallas' apartment complexes in Oak Cliff. While he was helping install bubblegum pink carpeting in the apartment, Gray became friendly with the apartment's resident. He said all that this friend wanted to do was go to see his family, whom he hadn't seen in 18 years.

The Revlon resident died before Gray was able

to raise the money to send him home, but he was determined to help others see their families.

## Razzle Dazzle a done deal for 2011

Pub crawls, a street festival, an AIDS fundraiser, party buses, more will be part of weeklong party

The return of Razzle Dazzle Dallas means North Texas will have a June Pride celebration. The fiveday event begins June 1.

Scott Whittall, president of the Cedar Springs Merchants Association, said the June 1-5 dates were chosen, in part, to not conflict with Pride weekends in Austin and Houston.

The event begins on a Wednesday with a special edition of the Cedar Springs Wine Walk.

Thursday, June 2, will feature a pub-crawl. Shuttles and party buses will leave from Cedar Springs Road to visit different bars off the strip. The Brick and BJ's have already committed to participate. Other bars are expected to join as planning continues through the spring.

Each stop will be about 45 minutes and feature specials and a VIP area for those who purchase special tickets for the week.

"The purpose is to introduce people to the bars off the Cedar Springs strip," Whittall said.

The fifth annual Metro Ball held at S4 will become part of Razzle Dazzle Dallas as the Friday event. The fundraiser is staged by and benefits the Greg Dollgener Memorial AIDS Fund, which works with nine area agencies as a funding source of last resort to help individuals with emergency situations.

Tickets are expected to be \$25 on line and \$35 at the door. Crystal Waters headlined last year's ball that raised \$37,000. In 2011, Scott Whittall the evening will in-



clude a silent auction and dance party.

Representatives of GDMAF, Inc., which stages Metro Ball, attended the first Razzle Dazzle organizational meeting to make sure there were no conflicts in dates.

"I expressed my concern to the committee," said GDMAF President John Cooper-Lara. "But it made more sense to focus Metro Ball as the primary fundraiser for the weekend."

By the end of the meeting, not only had Metro Ball become one of week's signature events, but also Cooper-Lara signed on as co-chair of Razzle Dazzle Dallas.

"We're excited to be part of a week-long celebration," he said, hoping the community-wide effort will raise even more money for GDMAF this year.

When Metro Ball ends at 10 p.m., an after-party will be held at a different venue.

Saturday begins with a street festival — from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. — that will highlight the Cedar

Springs merchants. Participating stores will have sale tents. Booths for artists and non-profits will be part of the day's activities.

The main event will be Saturday night from 7 p.m. to 2 a.m. Cedar Springs will close from Reagan to Knight streets. Whittall said they were exploring closing even more of the street.

A main stage near Reagan Street will feature a national headliner and a variety of bands and entertainment. A stage near ilume will present a national DJ. A third stage in the middle of the block will also have a DJ keeping the party lively.

A sponsored VIP tent near Hunky's will include a free cocktail of the evening and food provided by two area restaurants.

Sunday ends the five-day festival with a mini pub-crawl, afternoon t-dance and check presenta-

Whittall said the group plans to work with the Dallas Convention and Visitor's Bureau and promote Razzle Dazzle nationally.

When Razzle Dazzle Dallas last took place in 2003, it was billed as the 26th annual event. That dates the first one to 1978. Don Maison, who served on the board from about 1985-90, said he remembered it beginning as fundraiser for the Dallas Museum of Art. At the time, the museum was located in Fair Park and had just announced a new building downtown.

As AIDS took hold in Dallas in the early 1980s, Razzle Dazzle quickly changed its focus to raising

#### **Calling out Kay**

About 10 people gathered outside Republican Sen. Kay Bailey Hutchison's Dallas office on Tuesday afternoon, Dec. 21 to protest her vote against the repeal of "don't ask, don't tell."

The protest was organized by GetE-QUAL Texas, the state chapter of the national LGBT direct action group, and similar rallies were held outside Hutchison's offices in Austin, Houston and San Antonio.

Wielding signs, bullhorns and a rainbowcolored American flag, the Dallas protesters chanted "Shame on Kay!" and "Retire, Kay Bailey!" as they stood on a grassy median along the service road near her 11th floor office in the Hotels.com building at 10440 N. Central Expressway.

Despite Hutchison's vote against DADT repeal, the bill passed and would be signed by President Barack Obama on Wednesday. But the protesters weren't in a celebratory mood.

"This is just the beginning," said Marlin Bynum, a 47-year-old former preacher who came out as gay five years ago. "We still need ENDA. We've still got to repeal DOMA. This is just the beginning. In fact, I don't know if the fight will ever end."

At the end of the rally, a representative from Hutchison's office, Byron Campbell, came down to meet the protesters, who handed him two signs on which they'd written personal messages.

"Eighty percent of this country supported the bill," GetEQUAL board member Mark Reed-Walkup told Campbell as he handed him the signs

"We e-mailed, we called her," Reed-Walkup told Campbell. "She asked for a study, the study came back positive, and then she still voted no. We're extremely disappointed, and we'll be back.

"I appreciate this," Campbell responded. "Thank you very much, and thank you for your time," Campbell said before quickly going back inside.

Reed-Walkup said GetEQUAL, which formed earlier this year, is just beginning to organize chapters in all 50 states and likely will become more active in Texas in 2011.

"We'll continue to hold our elected leaders accountable," he said.





said ASD has residents taking advantage of Home for the Holidays again this year. Gray said in recent years they have been sending 70 to 100 people home annually.

Over the years, the program has expanded from its original goal of sending a couple of dozen people home at Christmastime. They still send people with a full AIDS diagnosis but with no money to travel home to see their families, but the program is now year-round.

The group has also covered cremation expenses for those with no family to take care of them and they have shipped bodies home.

"We also bring a family member here so they're not by themselves," he said.

In the beginning, a travel agency helped with the airline contacts and tickets by waiving commissions and negotiating discounts. When travel agencies disappeared, Gray said they had to make those contacts themselves.

"We belong to AA Rainbow," he said. "We have a code we use for a discount."

He said that Southwest Airlines has been help-

Some tickets are paid for with donated frequent flier miles.

"Greyhound gives us free tickets," he said. Those are useful especially for people traveling to rural areas within a few hundred miles.

"We've even done Amtrak," he said.

This year the organization got a big boost when it was accepted as a Black Tie Dinner recipient. The \$21,000 check they received from the dinner was the biggest infusion of cash in the group's his-

The original fundraiser, Miss Charity America, is still going strong.

Impersonator Frank Marino from the La Cage show in Las Vegas did fundraisers for the group at Village Station twice in the mid 1990s. The first show brought in \$8,000. An art auction at Jack's Backyard in 2009 contributed more than \$5,000 in three hours.

Last Saturday, the Hidden Door hosted what Gray called an evening of entertainment, cookies and sales of light bulbs for the tree that added \$1,200 to the coffers.

"That will send four people home," Gray said. But Gray said that Black Tie Dinner meant more to his group than just the money.

"We acquired two new board members from Black Tie," he said, "And two others are interested in the group. We didn't expect our relationship with Black Tie to grow so quickly."

He was astounded at the amount his group received and at the presentation event was in tears as they were handed the oversized check.

"We don't have to turn someone down now who needs to go to Africa," he said.

Recently, the group sent someone to Zimbabwe. Before leaving for the airport, she got a final dialysis treatment, plenty of pain medication and then boarded the plane for her long trip

Gray said that travel arranging involves more than just buying the ticket. The group makes sure the traveler has a way to get to and from the airport. Gray has shuttled a number of people to DFW and Love Field for their trips home.

One recipient was afraid to fly so they spent time explaining the experience to her.

He explains to them that they need to pack light, preferably in a carry-on bag if they are strong enough to manage that. But if bags have to be checked, they need money to pay to check

Gray said that board members often just put tickets on their own charge cards. They know they'll get paid back when they raise the money.

Sending people home for the holidays seemed like such an obvious idea that he looked for others doing the same thing in other cities so they could exchange ideas. But he never found a similar

"We're the only group like this in the world," he said. "We looked to find someone to share ad-

Gray's been raising money as Patti le Plae Safe for almost 25 years. He'll continue doing it, he said, even if they have to wheel him out on stage in a wheelchair and he's getting booed, because every dollar raised helps someone, he said.

"Nothing can replace the feeling of handing someone a ticket and saying, 'You're going home for the holidays," he said.

funds for the first North Texas AIDS organizations, such as Oak Lawn Community Services that closed in 2000, and the AIDS Resource Center, now known as Resource Center Dallas. One year in the 1980s Razzle Dazzle was held at the old Dallas auto pound on Inwood Road where a UT Southwestern building now stands. Searchlights directed people to the abandoned facility.

Maison recalled having to repair the roof of the shed and call Dallas Power & Light to run more electricity into the site.

Fair Park was a frequent site of the event. In different years it was held in the Hall of State, Tower Building and Centennial Building.

Maison said the year Razzle Dazzle was held

downtown in the Convention Center was costly. Market Center Hall and an abandoned building in the West End and the Bomb Factory in Deep Ellum were other venues before Razzle Dazzle moved to Cedar Springs Road in the 1990s.

In its last year, Razzle Dazzle featured the Village People who performed on an outdoor stage in Caven's paid parking lot. Although the street was blocked off, many people entered without paying. The event lost money and Razzle Dazzle Dallas disbanded.

This year's event should be well funded as it combines resources from a number of groups. Whittall said Ben E. Keith has already signed to be the presenting sponsor and other businesses including ilume and the Melrose Hotel have already agreed to be sponsors.

The new website will be live in January.



And his was a face that people could relate to, a fact that gave his message even more weight with many.

State Sen. Wendy Davis of Fort Worth — who represented District 9, which Burns now represents, before stepping down at the start of 2008 to run for the Senate — called Burns "a uniquely capable public servant" to whom people can relate easily.

"I would say that he left his ego at the door when he entered public office, but he never brought it with him at all, actually," Davis said of Burns. "He is down to earth, genuine and sincere about everything he does. It is rare that he enters a room, a restaurant, a neighborhood gathering, where he is not received by warm hugs."

She continued, "The people that he represents understand that he cares about them, and they care about him in return. He has an actual 'relationship' with the people that he represents, which is, unfortunately, rare in political leaders. Though his warmth and humor endear him to people, he is loved more because he is a leader who is not afraid to stand strong for the issues he cares about."

Burns' everyman appeal resonates beyond the boundaries of District 9, and that's what gave his speech such impact around the country, said Dennis Coleman, executive director of Equality Texas.

"The thing about [Burns' speech] is that he is a very likeable person," Coleman said. "The thing that made it resonate with people so strongly is that he is an everyday person doing a very public job.

"There are a lot of celebrities who have talked about bullying and suicide. But this was someone from a small town in Texas who was talking about his personal experiences, talking to his colleagues about what he had been through. There was gen-

uine feeling to it."

Burns' speech that night during the council meeting was not something planned in advance and worked on by speechwriters or aides. The councilman decided only hours before to speak out, and scribbled his remarks down during his lunch hour.

And it was that sense of immediacy and personal conviction that made it stand out, Coleman said

"His speech was very raw. It was very honest. That's an interesting thing to see from a public figure," Coleman said. "And the timing was perfect. He tied it to something that was very personal, and he tied it to something that was very 'right now;' he tied it to the death of the young man who committed suicide after hearing so much hate at a city council meeting [in Oklahoma]. All those elements made it very, very real for a lot of people."

The LGBT community could have hardly chosen a better spokesman if it had tried. Smart, handsome, articulate and sincere with a soft but authoritative Texas voice, Burns exudes gay Pride in its most prosaic incarnation.

Where mainstream media often portrays gay culture in stereotypes, Burns showed a face that Middle America may not have seen before. And that presence as a role model is what made him the effortless choice as Dallas Voice's local LGBT Person of the Year.

While Burns himself is local, the reach of his message proved to be national, even international. But as he did it, Burns had little idea what it would become.

"I got up the very next morning and went on with my life the way I normally would," Burns said. "I had two back-to-back appointments starting at 8 a.m., then I came home. J.D. [Angle, Burns' husband] was sitting in the bed when I came back from speaking to the gay-straight alliance at UT. He said, You know you've got 5,000 people who

have viewed this since it was posted at 5 a.m.'

"Before I left at noon, I got 1,000 Facebook 'friend' requests. I remember thinking, 'Oh my God — how did that happen?'"

The story of how the video made it to YouTube is a strange one. All of Fort Worth's council meetings are recorded and streamed live on the Internet. Chris Hawes, the WFAA reporter covering Fort Worth city hall, had already posted her story for the day but continued to watch the stream. When she saw Burns' confessional recollection of childhood bullying, she dropped the story she'd already filed and went live. But Burns was not available.

"We had another five hours worth of council meeting that night," Burns said. "I was busy with zoning cases."

Burns learned of the report and stepped out of the meeting long enough to warn his parents that a story about bullying and teenage suicide would be about him. "I said, 'There's some content that comes from a very personal standpoint.'

"I knew when it aired — right after, both my phones blew up. Todd Camp [ironically, Dallas Voice's first LGBT Person of the Year last year] was texting me saying 'What are you gonna do with this? Will you put on YouTube?' I said, 'Yes eventually.' He said, 'No, you need to do it now. I will come up to City Hall and do it for you if you'll just get a copy to your council aide.'"

Camp and Kyle Trentham finally got it uploaded at 5 a.m., Wed., Oct. 13. Before the day was over, Burns had spoken to CNN, CBS and scores of other outlets. He was soon on a flight to New York City for appearances on *The Today Show* and other programs.

Then Ellen called.

The whole experience ended up being "kinda strange," he said. "Walking down the street in Portland, Ore., someone said, 'Hey, are you the dude that cried?' On the street in New York City [a day after the story broke], people would stop me and ask if I was from Texas."

There have been other surreal moments. At the beginning, Burns was surviving on few hours' sleep, traveling constantly and doing interview after interview.

"Honestly, during the interviews on *Today* and *Ellen* there was such a crush of activity, I was probably not as present for that experience as I should have been," he said. While waiting in the wings of DeGeneres' show, "I thought, 'Holy crap! I am about to meet Ellen! I hope I'm able to speak English'"

But far beyond the celebrity it brought him was the gratification of affecting so many lives in concrete ways.

"The experience of talking to the kids and various people who have e-mailed me is the best part," Burns said. "A couple weeks ago, I got an envelope that said nothing but 'Joel Burns, Fort Worth, Texas' — no postmark or return address. Inside was a torn up piece of paper and a note that said, 'This is the remains of the letter I left for my roommate to find with my body. After seeing your video, I burned all but this piece. You saved my life.""

"All of the e-mails were uniformly positive. My dad was worried — he said, 'You need to get a security system and lock your doors,' but honestly, that hasn't happened. Walking on the set of Today is slightly unnerving, but no one's threatened me or scared me. It's kind of hard to be for bullying and teenaged suicide."

Hard, but not impossible, as KLIF shock jock Chris Krok proved. He assailed Burns for wasting councilmembers' time with his story and "lying" by referring to Angle as his "husband."

Krok also affected a lisp mocking Burns' tearful

monologue. Burns says, so far as he can tell, Krok was the only person to actively attack him for the speech.

"He was trying to capitalize on it, to get attention," Burns said dismissively. "He was doing what he could to draw attention. But he's the only one I'm aware of. There were supposed to be protests at City Hall but that never materialized."

Burns opened his speech that night by acknowledging that he could be torpedoing his future in politics. But he felt that bringing attention to the issue of bullying and teen suicide and sav-

ing maybe even one life was worth it.

And the risk he was taking didn't go unnoticed. Fort Worth Mayor Mike Moncrief, speaking after Burns at that Oct. 12 council meeting, said it plainly:

"I have witnessed a lot of things over my 30 years of public service ... but I have never seen anything as courageous as what I saw tonight," Moncrief said to Burns. "Obviously, you spoke from the heart and you touched every heart in this room. No matter how big and tough you are, that

touched you, in some shape, form or fashion."

While some critics, like Krok, said the council meeting wasn't an appropriate forum for Burns' remarks, Moncrief, in his response that night, insisted otherwise.

"It is something that needs to be addressed," the mayor said. "Young people, especially, are entitled to a chance — a chance to enjoy a childhood, a chance to enjoy looking forward to the next challenges in their life. It is only through people like yourself, who will speak out from experience not from reading a book, not from watching a movie — from experience, [that change will happen. Experience] is always the best teacher. It teaches those lessons way down deep.

"And it takes a special courage to reach down deep to pull those things out and express them. I thank you for what you said and I thank you for how you said it," Moncrief told Burns.

And people obviously have taken note of that courage and responded to help create the change Burn called for. In fact, earlier this month, Davis prefiled a bill in the Texas House of Representatives to create a comprehensive statewide approach to bullying in public schools. She credited Burns' speech with being the impetus.

"I am proud to have filed a bill in the Texas Legislature that attempts to have a positive impact on this issue, and I am particularly proud to do this in response to Joel's personal story and the awareness he raised in all of us regarding teen suicides that occur as a result of bullying," Davis said.

And Coleman said Equality Texas is proud to be able to work with Burns to get Davis' legislation passed. In fact, Equality Texas invited Burns to go to Austin on Dec. 13 to speak at the press conference during which the organization launched its efforts to pass the anti-bullying bill.

"As the statewide organization, having someone who can put a face on this very serious issue was important for us, and we feel it was very appropriate to have [Burns] at the press conference. But we didn't invite him to participate as a councilman from Fort Worth. We invited as Joel Burns to participate as a Texan who himself experienced bullying when he was growing up,"Coleman said.

While many people have focused on the changes Burns' speech has made in others' lives, Burns acknowledged that what happened that night and since has changed his life, as well.

"I am a little more mindful of some things that others would perceive as bigger picture stuff. Instead of getting hunkered down in resolving our pension crisis or fixing our budget for next year, it kind of pulls you up a little bit out of the [minutiae] of everyday life.

"You hear these stories and it fills me with, I don't know what to call it, contentment? It has instilled a sense of who I am at 41 that was not present to prior to the 12th of October. It makes me much less afraid. Whatever happens, happens. If I don't get re-elected [in May], I know now I've had an amazing life — a lot better than many others out there."

And his video has made life a lot better for countless others, too.

## **Obama signs DADT repeal**

Republicans' last-ditch effort to derail repeal fails; president praises efforts of those who worked to end ban on openly gay servicemembers

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Following a dramatic and eloquent speech, President Barack Obama on

Wednesday, Dec. 22, signed the legislation that will launch the repeal of a 17-year-old law prohibiting openly gay people from serving in the military.

"This is done," he said, looking up and slapping his hand on the table, and the crowded auditorium of an Interior Department building erupted with cheers and applause.

The historic ceremony took place less than 24 hours after Republican Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell's 11th hour action to try and

make implementation of repeal much more difficult and time-consuming failed.

According to a report on Politico.com, Mc-Connell tried to introduce an amendment to the annual defense authorization bill that would have required that implementation of "don't ask, don't tell") not take place until after the four service chiefs certify that it could be done without negative consequences for military readiness.

The DADT repeal legislation Obama signed requires certification by the president, the secretary of defense and the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff

According to Politico, McConnell attempted to add the amendment by unanimous consent, but Sen. Joe Lieberman, I-Conn., a champion of the repeal measure, objected. Lieberman's objection effectively blocked the amendment from being considered without first getting the consent of at least 60 senators.

The president was greeted with a roar of cheers and applause after he was introduced by Vice President Joe Biden at 9:13 Wednesday morning. As the president greeted many special guests on stage with him, the crowded began to chant, "Yes, we can," a prominent slogan of Obama's 2008 presidential campaign.

When the president reached the podium, he smiled and called back, "Yes, we did."

"I am just overwhelmed," said President Obama, beginning his prepared remarks. "This is a very good day, and I want to thank all of you, especially the people on this stage."

He then told a story about a soldier who fought in the Battle of the Bulge in the Belgian mountains against the Germans in World War II. The soldier, Andy Lee, put his own life in peril in order to scale a ravine and rescue a fellow soldier, Lloyd Corwin

Forty years later, Lee let Corwin know he was gay.

"He had no idea," said President Obama of Corwin, "and didn't much care. Lloyd knew what mattered. He knew what kept him alive."

Obama also told the story of a young female servicemember who gave him a hug on areceiving line in Afghanistan several weeks ago, when the president made a visit to the troops. The woman whispered in his ear, "'Get don't ask, don't tell done," said the president. "And I said to her, 'I promise you I will.""

With the signing of the bill Wednesday, President Obama has also fulfilled a long-standing promise to the LGBT community overall, a feat

that is prompting widespread praise, even from gay Republicans.

"He made this a priority," said R. Clarke Cooper, executive director of the Log Cabin Republicans group. "He was sincere and correct about making this a priority."

Cooper, a former servicemember, had a front row seat during Wednesday's ceremony.

Cooper said the ceremony was a "very emotional" one in the auditorium and that "there were definitely many tears of joy" in his eyes and in the eyes of other former servicemembers discharged under the DADT policy during the past 17 years.

The president acknowledged the tenacious work of numerous individuals during Wednesday's ceremony, including House Speaker Nancy Pelosi, House Majority Whip Steny Hoyer, Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid, Republican Sen. Susan Collins, and the bill's sponsor Rep. Patrick Murphy.

NBC News Washington Bureau Chief Mark Whitaker, speaking on MSNBC shortly before the ceremony, said it was House Majority Whip Hoyer whose idea it was to take DADT repeal language out of the annual defense authorization bill — which was being filibustered by McConnell, Sen. John McCain, R-Ariz., and most Republicans — and put it into a special standalone bill in the House last week.

The House passed that bill on Dec. 15 on a 250-to-175 vote and sent it immediately to the Senate, which approved it Dec. 18 on a 65-to-31 vote.





The president also singled out Rep. Barney Frank. D-Mass., in the front of the auditorium, for having "kept up the fight" in the House.

Speaking to MSNBC's Lawrence O'Donnell Tuesday night, Dec. 22, Frank characterized the Congressional vote to repeal DADT as being "comparable to the 1964 Civil Rights Act."

"It is an enormous move forward," said Frank. Also on stage for Wednesday's ceremony was Joint Chiefs of Staff Chairman Adm. Mike Mullen and Staff Sgt. Eric Alva, an openly gay Marine who was the first servicemember wounded in the Iraq War.


The airline has also recently received similar awards from three other groups committed to di-

## **DADT** is dead. But opposition lives on

Marshal vows legislation to keep gays out of Virginia's National Guard; Graham threatens to block START treaty ratification in revenge over repeal of DADT

was wrong. I was very skeptical of the chances of getting "don't ask, don't tell" repealed in the lame duck Congress, yet they did it. Yes, Hardy, there is a Santa Clause!

The vote for repeal, which was slightly bipartisan (eight Republicans voted for repeal), was a great holiday surprise. But what comes as no surprise is the vehemence with which opponents vow to fight on, even after they have lost on this one.

Already the voices of hard-core homophobes are chiming in. Virginia Delegate Bob Marshal says he will introduce legislation to prevent openly gay men and women from serving in the Virginia National Guard.

Hatred, especially hatred of LGBT people,

Further west, Sen. John McCain, one of the most vocal opponents of the repeal, still laments its passage.

"I hope that when we pass this legislation that we will understand that we are doing great damage. Today is a very sad day," Mc-Cain declared.

Meanwhile, Lindsey Graham is leading the charge for Republicans to block the new START treaty ratification in retaliation for the repeal of DADT. Apparently in Sen. Graham's eyes, keeping gays out of the military is more important than nuclear disarmament.

Like I said, old hatred dies especially hard. And then there is Marine Corps commandant, Gen. James Amos. Anyone who watched the debate in the Senate was most likely surprised at his strident opposition.

"I don't want to lose any Marines to distraction. I don't want to have any Marine that I'm visiting at Bethesda with no legs be the result of any distraction," he said before the vote.

I guess Gen. Amos figured that Marines are just too delicate to serve next to gay troops, or at least to know which Marines are gay and which are not. I have to wonder how much further his career will go now that the law of the land has changed?

Additionally, some evangelical chaplains have voiced their worries that they will no longer be able to preach. A Pentagon report stated, "Some of the most intense and sharpest divergence of views about 'don't ask, don't tell' exists among the chaplains."

Most of these concerns are that chaplains would no longer be able to preach that homosexuality is a sin. This little problem is particularly confusing to me since for centuries they have been able to reconcile killing the enemy in battle with the whole, "thou shalt not kill"

Luckily, some chaplains — like retired chaplain Col. Jerry Rhyne — feel differently.

Rhyne has counseled gay troops who struggled with their sexual orientation for years. In an interview with CNN he said, "For me, it was very disheartening. I tried to bring them hope and encouragement to live their life to the fullest and to help them deal with their issues."

Needless to say, Col. Rhyne supported repeal of the policy.

I hope the voices of dissent will soften after they realize that essentially, nothing in the military will change except that those in the military will be able to concentrate on doing their job. They will no longer be distracted by the witch hunts and investigations that saw more than 13,000 gay men and lesbians dis-

Gay and lesbian service members will no longer be distracted by trying to conceal their orientation. Military commands will no longer be distracted by spending valuable time and resources looking into every innuendo and allegation.

Contrary to Gen. Amos' assertion, having openly gay and lesbian troops serving will be less of a "distraction." Straight troops will not have to wonder who is gay and who isn't, though I suspect in reality it won't be an issue. All the service members I know, both straight and gay have told me they know gays and lesbians in their outfits and have never had a complaint against them.

The military will behave like the military, and continue to serve with honor and bravery.

Contrary to what they opponents of DADT repeal believe, gay troops are not going to start having orgies in the showers, and the behavior of troops will still be subject to military decorum. To believe otherwise is just not ra-

I have to wonder if folks like Lindsey Graham and Gen. Amos haven't been watching too much gay porn?

#### A Christmas memory

I had the privilege to be part of something again this year that is pretty special to me: The Dallas Tavern Guild Holiday Gift Basket project.

The cool thing about this event is that bartenders and bar staff from all of the LGBT bars in town come together for an afternoon and all work to help make someone's holiday a little nicer.

This project started back in the 1980s. We would put together about 100 baskets or so and distribute them to PWAs (persons with AIDS). The first time I participated in this event was 1988 and I continued with it until I moved out of Dallas

This year, as I stood at my post filling 1,000 bags with Juicy Juice, there with the other men and women on the assembly line, I had a chance to reflect back to that first time I put together baskets.

I was working at The Round-Up Saloon that year, and I called Alan Ross, who started the project, and asked him how many baskets we were going to be putting together. He told me about 125, so I said I would make cookies to go into the bags. So I went over to my best friends' house and

we all worked together to make 24 dozen cookies: 12 dozen oatmeal cookies and 12 dozen chocolate chip cookies.

We put two cookies in each of the 125 baggies we needed, and I took the rest on a platter to share with those helping put the gift bags together.

We put together what were then called PWA Christmas Bags. The bags contained toiletries, fruit, the cookies and a few other things. The final object we put into the basket was a stuffed brown bear with a little red ribbon bow around his neck.

While I did my part putting those baskets together I thought of all of my friends who were getting sick. I thought about the ones I knew who had already died from AIDS. I also thought back to two weeks previously when I had taken "The Test" for my first time.

Even with the sadness and the many tears we shared as we came together with a common bond to fill these gift bags, it was a fun time with the camaraderie amongst the bar employees. We knew we were on the front lines fighting a war that, at the time, seemed impossible to win.

A couple of days later, Dec. 23, 1988, I found myself in the clinic, nervously waiting to get the results of the HIV test I had taken two weeks earlier. My name was finally called and I went to the back with two counselors and they delivered the results to me. I had, indeed, tested positive for HIV.

It was actually a relief to finally know the results for sure so that I could start taking action to survive. After all, AZT had just been approved as the first medicine to treat the disease, so I knew I had a fighting chance.

I was told by one of the counselors that since it was the eve of Christmas Eve,the AIDS floor over at Parkland Hospital was not very busy and I should go over there and go ahead and get some bloodwork done and some paperwork filled out, so that I could get into the system and find out how advanced the disease was in my body.

So I went over to the hospital and sat down in the waiting room. It was, indeed, not busy at all. Counting myself, there were only three of us there. One of the guys, a white guy a little older than me (I was 28), was walking back and forth. He kept asking me and the other guy, an older black guy, if this was the AIDS floor and what we were doing up there.

"I'm not gay!" he kept telling us. "I can't have AIDS!"

He finally left, without being seen by the doctor.

Once he left, it quieted down a bit. I looked around the room at all the holiday decorations and the poinsettias and the holiday greeting cards taped around the nurses' station. I remember thinking that it was an interesting time and an interesting day to find myself there.

After I had been there about 30 minutes, I saw

that someone else was coming into the waiting room and I looked up. It was a woman, who appeared to be about the same age as my grandmother, pushing a cart. And on the cart were the PWA Christmas Bags that I had helped assemble a couple of days earlier!

The sweet woman pushed the cart over to me a little nervously. When she got close enough, she took one of the bags off the cart, and then she looked at me with the saddest eyes — eyes that knew the pain of losing someone to this disease —and then she smiled, handed the bag to me, and said "Merry Christmas, honey."

t's not that Jaston Williams dislikes Christmas — it's that growing up, it wasn't exactly *The Brady Bunch Holiday Special*.

"We always called Christmas 'blood and holly' around my house," Williams cracks with his signature Texas twang. "My mother could really make it rough. When there was company or a party you'd go from this loose experience to Franco's Spain in a second. I figured it out by the time I was a teenager that I wasn't wild about this holiday at all. This whole nostalgic, let's-go-home-for-Christmas thing? Nah. Give me a good hotel with an open restaurant and room service anytime."

Still, the holiday has been pretty good to Williams. With his writing, acting and now producing partner Joe Sears, Williams is enjoying more than 20 years of steady winter employment with A Tuna Christmas, which returns to the

Eisemann Center for a weeklong run Tuesday. The first sequel to their hit play *Greater Tuna* (nearing its 30th anniversary), it's the only one of the shows to have a run on Broadway (earning a Tony nomination) and has been a staple of the season.

If you haven't seen it (what's *wrong* with you?), it tracks life in a tiny Texas town on Christmas Eve as the quirky residents (all played by Williams and Sears) reinforce and undermine stereotypes about small-town attitudes. And even at its age, it still seems fresh.

"We wrote is as Reagan had just come into power — that's how old we are," Williams recalls of the original play. "It was in response to the Moral Majority and their idiotic notions" — and Tea Partiers aren't far removed from that. And contrary to popular opinion, they do *not* update the script.

"People constantly say, 'You've added so much!" Williams says. "I don't even deny it anymore. Especially with *Tuna Christmas* we're trying not to change things — though God help you if your cell phone goes off with Dede onstage. It'll be like being locked in a phone booth with Patti LuPone.

"The temptation to comment on what's going on today is so strong that if we started we'd never stop. So it's set in time. No one in Tuna has

a computer; they still have cords on the phones. And no one tweets — they'll fine you. Vera has banned the word. It sounds dirty enough to ban."

None of which is to say the show doesn't get a makeover every so often. The duo still rehearses regularly, tweaking bits and polishing moments, and the current production features all-new sets and costumes.

"Joe and I are producing it ourselves now," says Williams. "All these people who produce theater and want people to think it's really, really hard so they won't do it. But it was kinda like being in the Mafia. You think, 'I've been watching this jerk kill people for 15 years — why can't I do it?' We've scaled it down and made it better.

I'm very proud of it."

Williams himself is closer to living the Tuna experience than ever — though its different in many ways to the one imagined 30 years ago. He and his partner, Kevin, moved with their adopted teenaged son to the little burg of Lockhart, Texas, and are proud to see the culture developing.

"One thing I can say about small-town people is, they believe their lyin' eyes: They see two men raising a child and taking out the trash and they are changing their attitudes [about gay people]. It's pretty amazing."

(Williams is tickled as most gays are "don't ask, don't tell" was repealed, though, and thinks it was dumb to enact in the first place: "I was in

the gay bars in the '70s. You get the right lesbian pissed off with weapons and they're gonna take some territory. The ones who should really be afraid of gays in the military are our enemies.")

The guys are off from performing Dec. 24 and 25, but will be doing a New Year's Eve performance in Richardson, which Williams calls "one of the stranger nights of the year to perform, You really want to do a good show but it's such a bizarre holiday. People feel obligated to have some transformative experience and they know they aren't going to." Though if they go to *Tuna*, they just might.

Merry Christmas, Jaston.



In *Rabbit Hole*, a little boy's death tears his parents' lives apart. Actor-turned-filmmaker John Cameron Mitchell (*Shortbus*, *Hedwig and the Angry Inch*) connected deeply with the material — adapted by David Lindsay-Abaire from his own Pulitzer Prize-winning play — and won over star/producer Nicole Kidman, snagging his first high-profile, Hollywood feature-directing gig.

As close to a sure bet for an Oscar nomination as one can get, Kidman delivers a natural performance opposite an equally strong Aaron Eckhart. While somber in tone, *Rabbit Hole's* wit-bitten dialogue, smart editing, alternating flashes of humor and explosive emotion, and excellent supporting actors — including Sandra Oh, Dianne Wiest, and newcomer Miles Teller as the teenager who accidentally caused the child's death — combine to make a memorable, compelling and entertaining new classic.

Mitchell recently directed a stunning online short for Dior starring Marion Cotillard and Ian McKellen as a burlesque siren and a wheelchair-bound fan, respectively (he says that more spots will follow), is also producing graphic novelist Dash Shaw's debut animated feature, which he describes as "a mix between Philip K. Dick and *The Simpsons*." Mitchell sat down for a revealing one-on-one.

Dallas Voice: When you were a teenager, your fouryear-old brother died, and you witnessed firsthand how that can break up a family. That must have served as a significant personal connection to Rabbit Hole. Have you ever experienced a loss or tragedy that tested an adult relationship of yours? Mitchell: Well, my most serious relationship was with someone who had a drug problem. Over many years it was an off-and-on element because he was in rehab at times. It was too much for us. It wasn't just the drugs, it was other issues, but it was a very loving relationship and he passed away soon after we broke up. That was six years ago. I lost a brother when I was 14-a very different experience from losing a lover — but [there were] the same symptoms.

There's this horrible period right after and guilt, rational or not, usually not, and then this kind of exhilaration of that period is over — and then it comes back. So the last six years have been a bit of roller coaster where the dips get longer and shallower as you go. I haven't really talked about that much. But this was necessary to think about and release some stuff about both of them

Changes in body fat may occur in some patients taking antiretroviral therapy. These changes may include an increased amount of fat in the upper back and neck ("buffalo hump"), breast, and around the trunk. Loss of fat from the legs, arms, and face may also occur. The cause and long-term health effects of these conditions are not known at this time.

#### EPZICOM® (ep' zih com) Tablets

Generic name: abacavir (uH-BACK-ah-veer) sulfate and lamivudine (la-MIV-yoo-deen)

Read the Medication Guide that comes with EPZICOM before you start taking it and each time you get a refill because there may be new information. This information does not take the place of talking to your doctor about your medical condition or your treatment. Be sure to carry your EPZICOM Warning Card with you at all times.

#### What is the most important information I should know about EPZICOM?

Serious Allergic Reaction to Abacavir. EPZICOM contains abacavir (also contained in ZIAGEN® and TRIZIVIR®). Patients
taking EPZICOM may have a serious allergic reaction (hypersensitivity reaction) that can cause death. Your risk of this
allergic reaction is much higher if you have a gene variation called HLA-B\*5701 than if you do not. Your doctor can
determine with a blood test if you have this gene variation. If you get a symptom from 2 or more of the following
groups while taking EPZICOM, call your doctor right away to determine if you should stop taking this medicine.

Group 1	Fever				
Group 2	Rash				
Group 3	Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal (stomach area) pain				
Group 4	Generally ill feeling, extreme tiredness, or achiness

A list of these symptoms is on the Warning Card your pharmacist gives you. Carry this Warning Card with you.

If you stop EPZICOM because of an allergic reaction, NEVER take EPZICOM (abacavir sulfate and lamivudine) or any other abacavir-containing medicine (ZIAGEN and TRIZIVIR) again. If you take EPZICOM or any other abacavir-containing medicine again after you have had an allergic reaction, WITHIN HOURS you may get life-threatening symptoms that may include very low blood pressure or death.

If you stop EPZICOM for any other reason, even for a few days, and you are not allergic to EPZICOM, talk with your doctor before taking it again. Taking EPZICOM again can cause a serious allergic or life-threatening reaction, even if you never had an allergic reaction to it before. If your doctor tells you that you can take EPZICOM again, start taking it when you are around medical help or people who can call a doctor if you need one.

- Lactic Acidosis. Some human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) medicines, including EPZICOM, can cause a rare but
  serious condition called lactic acidosis with liver enlargement (hepatomegaly). Nausea and tiredness that don't get
  better may be symptoms of lactic acidosis. In some cases this condition can cause death. Women, overweight people, and
  people who have taken HIV medicines like EPZICOM for a long time have a higher chance of getting lactic acidosis and liver
  enlargement. Lactic acidosis is a medical emergency and must be treated in the hospital.
- Worsening of hepatitis B virus (HBV) infection. Patients with HBV infection, who take EPZICOM and then stop it, may get
  "flare-ups" of their hepatitis. "Flare-up" is when the disease suddenly returns in a worse way than before. If you have HBV
  infection, your doctor should closely monitor your liver function for several months after stopping EPZICOM. You may need
  to take anti-HBV medicines.
- Use with interferon- and ribavirin-based regimens. Worsening of liver disease (sometimes resulting in death) has
  occurred in patients infected with both HIV and hepatitis C virus who are taking anti-HIV medicines and are also being treated
  for hepatitis C with interferon with or without ribavirin. If you are taking EPZICOM as well as interferon with or without ribavirin
  and you experience side effects, be sure to tell your doctor.

EPZICOM can have other serious side effects. Be sure to read the section below entitled "What are the possible side effects of EPZICOM?"

#### What is EPZICOM?

EPZICOM is a prescription medicine used to treat HIV infection. EPZICOM includes 2 medicines: abacavir (ZIAGEN) and lamivudine or 3TC (EPIVIR®). See the end of this Medication Guide for a complete list of ingredients in EPZICOM. Both of these medicines are called nucleoside analogue reverse transcriptase inhibitors (NRTis). When used together, they help lower the amount of HIV in your blood. This helps to keep your immune system as healthy as possible so that it can help fight infection.

Different combinations of medicines are used to treat HIV infection. You and your doctor should discuss which combination of medicines is best for you.

- EPZICOM does not cure HIV infection or AIDS. We do not know if EPZICOM will help you live longer or have fewer of the medical
  problems that people get with HIV or AIDS. It is very important that you see your doctor regularly while you are taking EPZICOM.
- EPZICOM does not lower the risk of passing HIV to other people through sexual contact, sharing needles, or being
  exposed to your blood. For your health and the health of others, it is important to always practice safe sex by using a latex
  or polyurethane condom or other barrier method to lower the chance of sexual contact with semen, vaginal secretions, or
  blood. Never use or share dirty needles.

#### Who should not take EPZICOM?

#### Do not take EPZICOM if you:

- have ever had a serious allergic reaction (a hypersensitivity reaction) to EPZICOM or any other medicine that has abacavir as one of its ingredients (TRIZIVIR and ZIAGEN). See the end of this Medication Guide for a complete list of ingredients in EPZICOM.
- · have a liver that does not function properly.
- · are less than 18 years of age

Before starting EPZICOM tell your doctor about all of your medical conditions, including if you:

- have been tested and know whether or not you have a particular gene variation called HLA-B\*5701.
- are pregnant or planning to become pregnant. We do not know if EPZICOM will harm your unborn child.
   You and your doctor will need to decide if EPZICOM is right for you. If you use EPZICOM while you are pregnant, talk to your doctor about how you can be on the Antiviral Pregnancy Registry for EPZICOM.
- are breastfeeding. Some of the ingredients in EPZICOM can be passed to your baby in your breast milk. It is not known if
  they could harm your baby. Also, mothers with HIV should not breastfeed because HIV can be passed to the baby in the
  breast milk
- have liver problems including hepatitis B virus infection.
- · have kidney problems.
- have heart problems, smoke, or suffer from diseases that increase your risk of heart disease such as high blood pressure, high cholesterol, or diabetes.

Tell your doctor about all the medicines you take, including prescription and nonprescription medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements. Especially tell your doctor if you take any of the following medicines\*:

- methadone
- HIVID® (zalcitabine, ddC)
- EPIVIR or EPIVIR-HBV® (lamivudine, 3TC), ZIAGEN (abacavir sulfate), COMBIVIR® (lamivudine and zidovudine), or TRIZIVIR (abacavir sulfate, lamivudine, and zidovudine).

#### How should I take EPZICOM?

- Take EPZICOM by mouth exactly as your doctor prescribes it. The usual dose is 1 tablet once a day. Do not skip
  doses
- . You can take EPZICOM with or without food.
- . If you miss a dose of EPZICOM, take the missed dose right away. Then, take the next dose at the usual time.
- . Do not let your EPZICOM run out.
- Starting EPZICOM again can cause a serious allergic or life-threatening reaction, even if you never had an allergic
  reaction to it before. If you run out of EPZICOM even for a few days, you must ask your doctor if you can start EPZICOM
  again. If your doctor tells you that you can take EPZICOM again, start taking it when you are around medical help or people
  who can call a doctor if you need one.
- If you stop your anti-HIV drugs, even for a short time, the amount of virus in your blood may increase and the virus may become harder to treat.
- . If you take too much EPZICOM, call your doctor or poison control center right away.

#### What should I avoid while taking EPZICOM?

- Do not take EPIVIR (lamivudine, 3TC), COMBIVIR (lamivudine and zidovudine), ZIAGEN (abacavir sulfate), or TRIZIVIR (abacavir sulfate, lamivudine, and zidovudine) while taking EPZICOM. Some of these medicines are already in EPZICOM.
- . Do not take zalcitabine (HIVID, ddC) while taking EPZICOM.

Avoid doing things that can spread HIV infection, as EPZICOM does not stop you from passing the HIV infection to others.

- Do not share needles or other injection equipment.
- Do not share personal items that can have blood or body fluids on them, like toothbrushes and razor blades.
- Do not have any kind of sex without protection. Always practice safe sex by using a latex or polyurethane condom or
  other barrier method to lower the chance of sexual contact with semen, vaginal secretions, or blood.
- Do not breastfeed. EPZICOM can be passed to babies in breast milk and could harm the baby. Also, mothers with HIV should not breastfeed because HIV can be passed to the baby in the breast milk.

#### What are the possible side effects of EPZICOM?

#### EPZICOM can cause the following serious side effects:

- Serious allergic reaction that can cause death. (See "What is the most important information I should know about EPZICOM?" at the beginning of this Medication Guide.)
- Lactic acidosis with liver enlargement (hepatomegaly) that can cause death. (See "What is the most important information I should know about EPZICOM?" at the beginning of this Medication Guide.)
- Worsening of HBV infection. (See "What is the most important information I should know about EPZICOM?" at the beginning
  of this Medication Guide.)
- Changes in immune system. When you start taking HIV medicines, your immune system may get stronger and could begin
  to fight infections that have been hidden in your body, such as pneumonia, herpes virus, or tuberculosis. If you have new
  symptoms after starting your HIV medicines, be sure to tell your doctor.
- Changes in body fat. These changes have happened in patients taking antiretroviral medicines like EPZICOM. The changes
  may include an increased amount of fat in the upper back and neck ("buffalo hump"), breast, and around the back, chest,
  and stomach area. Loss of fat from the legs, arms, and face may also happen. The cause and long-term health effects of
  these conditions are not known.

Some HIV medicines including EPZICOM may increase your risk of heart attack. If you have heart problems, smoke, or suffer from diseases that increase your risk of heart disease such as high blood pressure, high cholesterol, or diabetes, tell your doctor.

The most common side effects with EPZICOM are trouble sleeping, depression, headache, tiredness, dizziness, nausea, diarrhea, rash, fever, stomach pain, abnormal dreams, and anxiety. Most of these side effects did not cause people to stop taking EPZICOM.

This list of side effects is not complete. Call your doctor for medical advice about side effects. You may report side effects to FDA at 1-800-FDA-1088.

#### How should I store EPZICOM?

- Store EPZICOM at room temperature between 59° to 86°F (15° to 30°C).
- . Keep EPZICOM and all medicines out of the reach of children.

#### General information for safe and effective use of EPZICOM

Medicines are sometimes prescribed for conditions that are not mentioned in Medication Guides. Do not use EPZICOM for a condition for which it was not prescribed. Do not give EPZICOM to other people, even if they have the same symptoms that you have. It may harm them.

## QUEER CLIPS: 'True Grit,' 'Rabbit Hole'

The Coen Brothers have always had a peculiar relationship with Texas, maybe because the sense of Wild West recklessness is still cultivated by urbanites. It's a complex feeling, though: A lone Ranger (sans mask) named LaBoeuf (Matt Damon) endures a share of mockery in **True Grit**, but it's forgiveable — the movie is just so damn entertaining.

I barely noticed a contraction in the dialogue until the waning minutes of the film, which imbues the tale with a poetic majesty without being stilted. Yet the Coens keep everything in the realm of the real; this isn't some commonplace revenge fantasy but a devil-in-the-details character study of a girl (Hailee Steinfeld, who's remarkable) and a wizened marshal-for-hire (Jeff Bridges, better even than his Oscar performance in last year's *Crazy Heart*). It avoids predictable, touchy-feely sentimentality while still being emotionally stirring.

Less stirring is **Rabbit Hole** — perhaps because



It tries too hard. A couple (Nicole Kidman, Aaron Eckhart) work through their grief over the death of their child in wildly different ways. It's a prickly story about yuppies in denial where so many of the characters seem to want to be hated — or at least misunderstood. Grief is hard to portray in small doses (everyone deals with loss uniquely), and to try to make a movie of nothing but is too great a task for director John Cameron Mitchell. Kidman's OK, but the standout is Miles Teller as a regretful teen. He and Steinfeld should make a movie together.

You went from working with unknown indie actors and bohemian gender-benders to Nicole Kidman. Strange? Well, Nicole's about to play a tranny in a film [The Danish Girl], and of all the A-list female stars, I think of her as the most adventurous. It was surprising that I found myself on this job, but she really heard how passionate I was when I spoke about it with her. And it was this instinctive thing. She's like, "I have a feeling -I want to work with Lars Von Trier." Kate Winslet doesn't do that. Even Meryl Streep. These are brilliant actors but when was the last time they threw themselves a little bit in the gutter the way Tilda Swinton or Nicole does? "I'm going to work with Apichatpong Weerasethaku from Thailand [who just won the Palme D'Or at Cannes] because I like his work." Not as a career move, what do I do next. I was surprised but it felt comfortable.

What difference was there between directing Rabbit Hole, which was a work for hire, and your previous films, which were auteur projects you curated and controlled from beginning to end? It was the first time I didn't have final say, but it was great because it was three people [myself and two producers] making the decisions. If there are only two people, there's no tie-breaker and sometimes it's trouble. And we all had different taste. Somewhere in between we knew this was an audience-friendly film. We're not necessarily

going for ... the same treatment of the material, death of a child, the same set-up, could be [Lars Von Trier's] *Antichrist*. And it's not *In the Bedroom* where there's more schematic of going to get revenge.

Miles Teller as the teenager who accidentally ran over the child is so sullen and restrained, yet I read that he plays the goofy, outgoing Chris Penn character in the upcoming remake of *Footloose*. He's actually quite different from that [*Rabbit Hole*] character. He's quite happy-go-lucky. At the wrap party he was dancing like Michael Jackson. He's like a really brilliant dancer.

Are those scars on his face real? I was wondering if they were there to suggest he had been hurt in the accident that killed the child. Yeah, those scars are from a real accident that he almost died in. I let the question [remain]... we all have these scars.

After tons of false starts a la Milk, a film of Larry
Kramer's seminal play about the AIDS crisis, The
Normal Heart, is finally getting made with Ryan
Murphy (Glee) at the helm. In the early 1990s, you
appeared in Kramer's stage sequel, The Destiny of
Me. Would you seek any involvement with The
Normal Heart? I am semi-retired [from acting], and
periodically a part makes me want to step out, but it
has to be something I have to do emotionally and there
are very few of those. Oddly, one of them was playing
Laura Bush in a reading of Tony Kushner's play about
her in 2004, a brilliant one-act. Tony makes me want to
act. I'm gonna act again. It's just timing.


