'AIDS at 30' forum set for Tuesday

Panel discussion to explore the current status of HIV treatment and the future of treatment and prevention efforts in next decade

Thirty years after the first cases of what would eventually come to be known as AIDS were discovered in gay men in Los Angeles, San Francisco and New York, the struggle to contain the worldwide epidemic continues.

But where do we stand today in that fight, 28 years after HIV was determined to be the cause of AIDS, and 24 years after the FDA approved AZT as the first real treatment to fight HIV?

On Tuesday, June 28, Dallas Voice — in partnership with Cathedral of Hope and a slate of business sponsors and community organization partners — presents "AIDS at 30: A Community Forum," to explore the questions of where we are now in the fight, and where we are headed.

The forum will be held at Cathedral of Hope's

Interfaith Peace Chapel, 5910 Cedar Springs Road. Doors open at 6 p.m., and the forum runs from 6:30 p.m to 8 p.m.

The forum is free and open to the public.

"We decided to produce this forum, 'AIDS at 30,' from a 'today and tomorrow' perspective," said Robert Moore, Dallas Voice publisher.

"We all know the story of AIDS over the last 30 years. What people are really hungry for now is a real-world look at where HIV prevention and treatment are headed over the next decade," Moore added. "People want to know that there is

hope for a cure, and that the issue of HIV and AIDS is not yesterday's story, but that it is, indeed, tomorrow's story."

The forum will be divided into three sections, with AIDS Arms Associate Executive Director Manisha H. Maskay, Ph.D., leading off on the topic of

"HIV Prevention Strategies and Challenges for the Next Decade."

Maskey has more than 30 years of experience in the field of public health, medical nutrition therapy and health education and behavior change. In addition to her work at AIDS Arms as both associate executive director and director of community and client services, she has worked for the Columbus Health Department in Columbus, Ohio, and as an assistant professor of medicine and director of clinical nutrition and health education services

Southwest pilot's rant



Houston's KPRC Channel 2 reported on a recent incident involving a pilot for Dallas-based Southwest Airlines whose cockpit microphone became stuck on, allowing air traffic controllers and crews from other flights to hear an anti-gay, misogynistic, ageist rant about what the pilot considers a lack of flight attendants suitable for him to have sex with.

An air traffic controller repeatedly tried to interrupt the pilot and alert him that his microphone was on, but the pilot didn't notice. Much of the anti-gay language has been bleeped out in the audio posted on Channel 2's website, but it's not hard to fill in the blanks:

"Well, I had Tucson to Indy all four weeks and, uh, Chicago crews ... 11 out of 12 ... there's 12 flight attendants, individual, never the same flight attendant twice," the pilot said. "Eleven (expletive) over the top (expletive), (expletive) homosexuals and a granny. Eleven. I mean, think of the odds of that. I thought I was in Chicago, which was partyland. ... After that, it was just a continuous stream of gays and grannies and grandes."

After an inaudible comment by his co-pilot, presumably about gays, the pilot continues: "Well I don't give a (expletive). I hate 100 percent of their (expletive). So, six months, I went to the bar three times. In six months, three times. ... Once with the granny and the fag, and I wish I hadn't gone."

According to Southwest Airlines, the pilot was suspended without pay for the incident, but the company declined to say for how long and added that Southwest considers it "a family matter."

The FAA also issued a statement saying it "expects a higher level of professionalism from flight crews, regardless of the circumstances."

Cece Cox, executive director of Resource Center Dallas, is quoted extensively in the story. "I hope it's an isolated incident. I hope they look and see what's happening in their culture because clearly this incident shows that there's something happening in this culture that allowed this person to make those kind of remarks and exhibit this kind of hostility, discrimination and hate."

UPDATE: The flight attendants union, in its statement, said it is "dismayed by the response from Southwest Airlines' management" and that the company has "added 'insult to injury.'" The union also says its attorneys will investigate the possibility of filing an EEOC complaint with the federal government based on the incident.

Equality March returns to downtown

Governor's new alliance with a hate group is expected to draw attention to 3rd annual Dallas rally

Gov. Rick Perry's planned event in Houston with the hate group American Family Association in August has gotten many LGBT allies energized, according to Daniel Cates. And he and other organizers for the third annual Equality March said they hope that new energy helps turn out more participants for the march happening Saturday, June 25, in downtown Dallas.

Cates, who recently became North Texas regional director of GetEqual, said that the march is a demand for full legal equality for LGBT people and an end to religious-based persecution.

But he made it clear that organizers are not bashing religion: "We're calling on lawmakers to make good on the promises in the Constitution," he said. "And we've had an amazing response from our allies — especially in the Christian community."

He said many people see the discrimination against the LGBT community as a violation of the separation of church and state.

March co-organizer Nonnie Ouch said the Perry event is partially state-funded.

"Fellow activists from around the state are very angry about what Perry's doing right now," she said. "Using state funds to produce such an exclusive event is wrong."

Ouch will also be one of the speakers at the rally following the march. Ouch is a senior at Texas Tech in Lubbock and is spending her summer as an intern at Resource Center Dallas.

March for Equality begins at the John F. Kennedy Memorial Plaza at 6 p.m. Cates urged those attending to "bring signs, flags, banners, bull horns, drums or any means of expression."

C.D. Kirven will emcee the rally. Among other speakers and march sponsors are Jesse Garcia

with LULAC Rainbow Chapter and Brittany Rayson-Stubblefeild, a member of Students for a Democratic Society. Resource Center Dallas, Stonewall Democrats of Dallas and International Socialist Organization Denton and Dallas Branches are also endorsing the march.

The Rev. Stephen Sprinkle with TCU's Brite Divinity School, student and recent Mount Pleasant mayoral candidate Kooper Caraway and I Am Equal Project founder Jason Beckett are also among the speakers. Beckett will be at the Aloft Hotel in Downtown Dallas throughout the day with fashion photographer Matt Spencer to collect pictures for his I Am Equal project. ■

The cycling bard

Valerie Skinner has, for 8 years, put the poetic coda on the end of the annual Lone Star Ride Fighting AIDS

Valerie Skinner loves to tell stories. And for eight of the last 10 years, she has harnessed her talents to write the narrative poems that have become a staple of the Lone Star Ride Fighting AIDS closing ceremonies.

Indeed, her efforts have become so much a part of the ride experience that for many, to imagine the event concluding without Skinner reciting her poetic coda has become unthinkable.

The LSR's "cycling bard" is also the administrator and vice president of the Holloway Family Foundation, which helps individuals who — through illness, age or disability — cannot help themselves. For the first six years of LSR, the HFF was the presenting sponsor; since then, it has become a stalwart contributor.

"[In 1999], Mike McKay, then executive director of the AIDS Outreach Center, talked with me about whether our family foundation would be interested in sponsoring this new event," Skinner recalls. "We were already [donating to] the three targeted beneficiary agencies [AIDS Outreach Center, AIDS Services of Dallas and the Resource Center of Dallas]. So of course I thought it was a fantastic idea."

Skinner had no intention of doing more than offer financial assistance through the organization that her parents, Graham and Carolyn Holloway, had established in 1994. However, her attitude changed drastically after she attended the first LSR closing ceremony in 2001.

"The energy and excitement of the crew and the riders and everybody that was participating — it was overwhelming," says Skinner. "I don't

really even have the right adjectives to describe what a powerful experience it was. And I just thought, 'Wow! I don't just want to be an outsider, I want to be involved in this.'"

Her enthusiasm piqued, Skinner promptly bought a bicycle and began to train to do the full ride, which typically averages 175 miles over two days. But between her duties at the Holloway Foundation and the demands of her four-child, three-dog household, she was unable to cycle more than a minimal amount for an LSR "marathoner" — just 20 to 30 miles a week.

Despite always finishing dead last (or very close to it), Skinner prides herself on having peddled almost every mile. She does admit, though, to having used the LSR sweep truck one year to cover five miles she simply could not manage.

"I was so far behind," she explains, "that I knew it would detrimentally affect other people in the ride."

Being consistently among the "LSR laggards" never bothered Skinner. If anything, her dogged slowness and ability to evade LSR sweep trucks when she's just a few miles shy of ride's end — but also late to the finish line — have gained her notoriety.

"I don't try to do it on purpose. I just call it playing my diva card," says the rogue cyclist. Or her poet's card. Jotting down the lines of verse she will read at the LSR closing ceremonies, after all, takes time.

For Skinner, being part of the LSR isn't only about participating in a worthy cause. It's also about spending time with what she calls her "ride family" and having fun, even under what can sometimes be very trying circumstances.

She remembers a time when she and an old college chum were cycling along an open stretch of road during the 2005 LSR. The weather was hot and unbearably humid; it was a day that had chased everyone else indoors.

"We [were passing by] this farm and there was this methane gas from these cows," she says.

"And it was just the nastiest thing. We [wanted] to throw up. We were so sick [and] hated each other for being out there."

Then rain from a sudden storm soaked both women to the bone.

"We started bobbling and then she fell under me and I fell into a ditch," Skinner laughs. "It sounds silly, but it was one of the most crazy fun experiences ever. I don't know how, but we finished. And [what with] the pictures we have and everything else, it was a great memory."

Skinner is definitely not your average rider. But listening to her talk about her experiences, you get the impression she wouldn't have it any other way.

Lone Star Ride Fighting AIDS takes place Sept. 24-25. For details or to donate to a specific rider or team or to the ride in general, go online to LoneStarRide.org.

at the University of Chicago.

Dr. Brady Allen, M.D., with Uptown Physicians Group will lead the discussion on the evening's second topic, "HIV/AIDS Treatment Today."

Dr. Allen, who graduated from Southwestern Medical School in Dallas and completed his internship and residency at New Haven Hospital in Connecticut, has been one of the pre-eminent doctors in treating HIV/AIDS since the early days of the epidemic in Dallas. After a brief retirement in 2008, he returned to Dallas and to Uptown Physicians in January 2009 to continue his practice.

Dr. Chris Evans, M.D., M.P.H., with AIDS Arms' Peabody Health Center in Oak Cliff, winds up the presentation with a discussion on "What is the Future of HIV Treatment? The Facts. The Hope. The Fiction."

A Yale University graduate, Dr. Evans completed medical school at Drexel University in Philadelphia before completing his residency in Internal Medicine and a fellowship in Infectious Diseases at Montefiore Hospital in The Bronx. He has been involved in clinical research on HIV/AIDS since 2001 and has participated as a sub-investigator in more than 15 studies on HIV/AIDS treatments.

The forum concludes with an opportunity for audience members to ask questions of the panelists.



What's ahead for LGBTs in Dallas, Fort Worth under cities' new mayors

With municipal election runoffs finally complete in North Texas, LGBT advocates in Dallas and Fort Worth said they are looking forward to working with new mayors and councilmembers in both cities.

Mayoral runoff candidates in both cities openly and diligently courted LGBT voters, and all four candidates participated in forums specifically addressing LGBT issues. Advocates said those efforts indicate that Dallas Mayor-elect Mike Rawlings and Fort Worth Mayor-elect Betsy Price will likely be willing to work with the LGBT community in the years to come.

"I was very pleased that both candidates, Betsy Price and Jim Lane, had an open dialog with our community during the runoff campaign," Fairness Fort Worth President Thomas Anable said. "And I believe we can continue making the kind of progress we have made over the last two years as we go forward with Betsy Price as our mayor."

Price, former Tarrant County tax assessor/collector, defeated lawyer and former City Council member Jim Lane, 56 percent to 44 percent.

Anable noted that Price and her husband, in another outreach to the LGBT community, attended Celebration Community Church on the Sunday before the June 18 runoff vote. Celebration, pastored by the Rev. Carol West, has a primarily LGBT congregation.

"We have already completed diversity training for 20 percent of the city's employees, and with Mayor-elect Price having said she is on board with continuing that training, and with set-asides for GLBT-owned businesses, we are looking forward to working with her on these and other issues," Anable said. "I have to say I am very pleased with the way the [electoral] process worked in Fort Worth."

In Dallas, Stonewall Democrats of Dallas President Omar Narvaez and Dallas Gay and Lesbian Alliance President Patti Fink said they are looking

forward to a productive relationship with Mayor-elect Mike Rawlings, even though both organizations endorsed his opponent, David Kunkle, in the runoff. Rawlings defeated Kunkle, 56 percent to 44 percent.

"We had some differences in policy approaches during the election cycle itself, but I fully expect that Mayor-elect Rawlings and DGLA will have a good working relationship going forward," Fink said. "I know that DGLA will work to have a good relationship, and I don't expect that Mayor-elect Rawlings would want any less."

"Elections are a time when we have some heated discussions about who we want to lead our city, but when it's done, we all come together and work for what's best for the city," Fink added.

DGLA endorsed another candidate, Ron Natinsky, in the general election, at the same time issuing a rare warning against Rawlings, saying that Rawlings seemed likely to put business considerations ahead of human rights considerations.

However, when Natinsky failed to make the runoff, DGLA gave its endorsement to Kunkle without re-issuing the warning against Rawlings.

Narvaez said that while Stonewall's endorsed candidate did not win, "we are looking forward to working with Mike Rawlings.... I think we will see some really good things coming out of the City Council in the next few years."

Narvaez said that although Stonewall Democrats endorsed Kunkle as an organization, "we had several members who supported Rawlings and worked on his campaign and with him. Mike Rawlings is a great idea man who will work well with all the communities in our city. I don't think he is the kind of person to hold a grudge. He is a bigger man than that."

"I think he will be there to support our community, and we will support him as well, because our main mission is to move Dallas forward and make it a better, more inclusive city for everyone."

Denied

Dallasite and his Canadian partner, like other bi-national couples, have to get creative to live together, thanks to anti-gay U.S. immigration laws

EDITOR'S NOTE: The men profiled in this report asked, on the advice of their attorney, that their full names not be used because their case is pending before immigration officials.

After the 2001 death of his partner, Dallasite Mark J. found a second chance at love. But with

the U.S. government standing between them, Mark and his new partner knew their "happily ever after" wouldn't come easily.

Mark and his first partner met Greg K., a Canadian, on line in the 1990s and began a long-distance friendship. After Mark's partner died suddenly in 2001, Mark and Greg began visiting each other.

By 2005, their friendship developed into a relationship — but one that is not without its difficulties. Mark said he and Greg speak on the phone three times a day, and once every two months they spend 10 days together.

It's not an ideal arrangement, but they chose to work it out that way because neither was ready to move because of their jobs, and both have family obligations that tie them to their homes. Mark,

for example, cares for his deceased partner's mother, who is in her 90s.

But the situation could change soon. Mark and Greg are both in their 50s, and both plan to retire in five years. Still, even then, federal immigration law poses a major roadblock.

To explore their options, Mark and Greg visited attorney Stacy Webb, who specializes in immigration cases and estate planning services and was recently qualified as a pro bono attorney for Human Rights Initiative. HRI is a Dallas-based organization that offers service to local refugees and immigrants who have suffered human rights abuses.

Webb told them their options are limited.

Mark can move to Greg's home in Ontario if the couple marries. But Greg only qualifies for a 90-day U.S. tourist visa and cannot move to Dallas to live with Mark.

The problem is U.S. immigration inequality.

The foreign partner in a married, opposite-sex couple can apply for residency in the U.S. and will automatically be granted a green card, unless there is a specific reason for exclusion. The green card gives the spouse permanent residency and the right to begin the process of applying for citizenship.

But because the federal Defense of Marriage Act specifically prohibits legal recognition of same-sex marriage, couples like Mark and Greg don't have that option.

"As an attorney, it can be frustrating when same-sex couples come to me for help with their immigration issues," Webb said.

"Here is a couple that has taken every possible step to formalize their relationship. They've prepared mutual wills and powers of attorney, held themselves out to the world as a committed couple, and shared their lives for several years. But because the federal government chooses not to recognize that relationship, there is no way for Greg come to this country legally," Webb said.

Canada issues visas on a point system. On his own, Mark scored too low to obtain permanent resident status. According to Canada's Lesbian and Gay Immigration Taskforce — known as LEGIT — age and any health conditions that require long-term health and social service support

would count against an immigrant.

But Mark did score points for his education and work experience.

However, under the Canadian marriage equality law, Mark can apply for permanent residency as Greg's spouse if they marry in Canada or in one of the U.S. states that offer marriage, civil unions or domestic partnerships.

Because they are planning ahead, if Mark decides to move to Canada, he should not encounter any problems, according to Webb. LEGIT says the application process takes anywhere from three months to three years.

Although DOMA prevents the U.S. government from recognizing same-sex marriages, the proposed Uniting American Families Act would allow an American partner to sponsor a spouse. That bill is stalled in Congress.

"One of the stated goals of U.S. immigration policy is to 'keep families together,'" Webb said. "However, they obviously don't mean our families because same-sex citizens cannot petition for their partners or spouses."

UFAA would remedy the injustice that tears same-sex families apart.

According to the New York-based Immigration Equality, 19 countries allow bi-national couples to sponsor their same-sex partners for immigration. Canada is among them. The U.S. is not.

Steve Ralls, spokesman for Immigration Equality, said, "Canada is a very welcoming country for lesbian and gay couples."

Many of Immigration Equality's clients move to Canada for a number of reasons. Proximity, Ralls said, is an advantage. But even more important is that same-sex couples receive all the benefits of heterosexual couples once they become Canadian residents.


"Everything from an enormously progressive health care system to tax benefits, including filing tax returns jointly," Ralls said.

Mark can be listed as a beneficiary of Greg's Canadian Social Security benefits. Greg cannot receive benefits from Mark's American Social Security.

Ralls said that a number of bi-national couples have immigrated to Canada, even in cases where neither is Canadian.

One applies to become a Canadian resident based on the point system. Once a resident, that

Oak Cliff does gayborhood differently

In the city's second largest collection of gay-owned businesses, gay and straight mix nicely

None of the gay business owners in Bishop Arts could say exactly how many of the other business owners in the Oak Cliff neighborhood were gay.

That's because "no one cares about your color or if you're gay or straight," said Hunkey's owner Rick Barton at his Bishop Arts restaurant. Barton recently served as president of the Bishop Arts Merchant's Association.

In the early 1980s, the Bishop Arts District began when a gay couple opened a restaurant in a corner space of an old warehouse in an area that was once the busiest trolley stop in Dallas.

That space later became Vitto, a gay-owned Italian restaurant and today is the coffee shop, Odd-fellows.

Bishop Arts differs from Cedar Springs in a number of ways. The Oak Lawn street is a busy,

four-lane thoroughfare that leads to Love Field, while the Oak Cliff neighborhood has a small-town feel that winds along several side streets off two-lane Davis Street.

Oak Lawn has plenty of bars. But while alcohol sales in restaurants were approved for Oak Cliff in November, bars, taverns and dance halls were not. So Bishop Arts remains a collection of restaurants, art galleries, stores, a gym and professional offices.

Barton said that the stores in Bishop Arts are all "mom-and-pop" affairs.

"That's what's cool about Bishop Arts now," he said.

Barton called Oak Lawn lively, hopping and contemporary, while Oak Cliff, he said, is a little bit retro.

"People come and stroll and window shop," he said. "It's a small-town feeling."

Paul Kirkpatrick and Mike Harrity opened Bishop Street Market 15 years ago. Harrity said each of the last three years he has seen record sales.

Before opening, the couple looked at Lakewood and thought about Oak Lawn, but rents scared them away. At the time, he said, rent in Bishop Arts was "dirt cheap."

"I had my business here eight years before my parents [who live in North Dallas] would come down to see it," he said.

"If you want to be killed ...," he said his mother warned.

Now, Harrity said, the area has become a major destination for people from around the city.

"People don't stumble on us," he said.

Michael Amonett owns Alchemy Salon. He is also president of the Old Oak Cliff Conservation League.

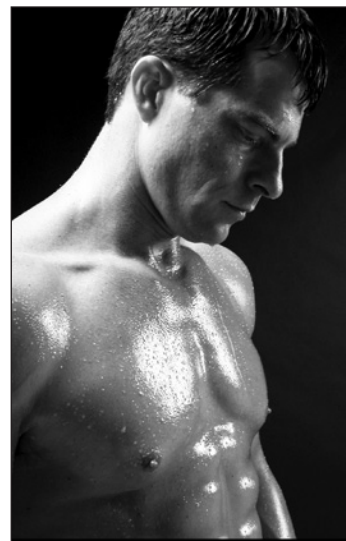
He said those in Bishop Arts need to be vigilant to keep the area from looking like Uptown and filling with chain stores.

The largest chains in the area now are Café Brazil and Gloria's — both local, homegrown businesses.

The new Gloria's is actually the relocated original that opened 25 years ago, several blocks away. Earlier this year, the restaurant moved into Bishop Arts in the renovated Firehouse No. 15, the same vintage as the fire station on Cedar Springs Road.

And attorney Chad West opened his law firm in a restored house on Bishop Avenue next to Gloria's. He recently expanded his business with a

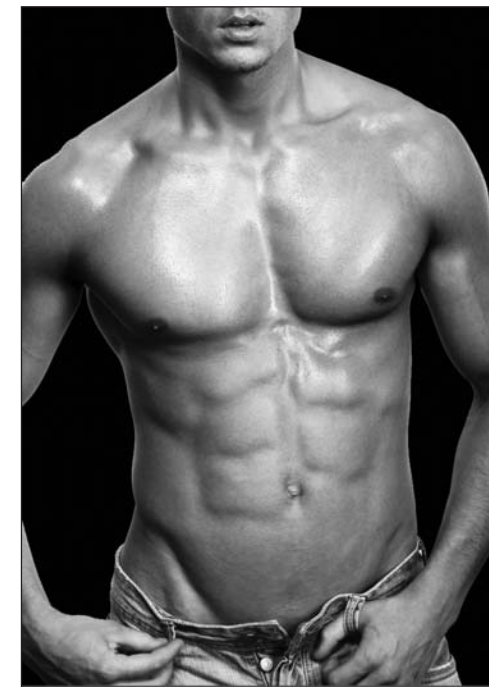

new office in Fort Worth near Keller.

West is a big Bishop Arts booster.

"To me, you have the benefit of a large city but the feel of a small town," he said. "Go to lunch, see your neighbors and wave to them."

person can sponsor his or her partner for residency.

Ralls said that if UAFA passed in the U.S., bi-national couples would have to undergo the same strict criteria as opposite-sex couples. That includes intrusive interviews that confirm the validity of a relationship.

He said that UAFA was recently reintroduced in the U.S. House of Representatives and Senate with its largest number of cosponsors. But that's still not enough votes for the measure to pass.

Two Texas representatives — Sheila Jackson Lee of Houston and Eddie Bernice Johnson of Dallas — are among the sponsors.

"The current House makes it difficult to pass," Ralls said. "But if they tackle immigration reform, it will be GLBT-inclusive."

He said he thinks that immigration reform legislation will be introduced in Congress before the end of the summer.

Ralls said that if Republicans and Democrats can agree on major issues — such as a path to citizenship — relationship equality will pass as part of the package.

Cannon Flowers is CEO of Human Rights Initiative. He advises bi-national couples planning to live in the U.S. to stay legal and work with an attorney.

"You can make a lot of mistakes before you realize what you've done," he said, adding that any misrepresentation of immigration status — on a credit card application, a loan or other legal document — could be considered fraud and used years later as a permanent bar to immigration.

"Get legal advice before you start the process," he said.

Flowers, who is himself in a bi-national relationship, said he began doing research before he and his partner entered the U.S.

Future plans will bring more people to the area while adding to the retro, small town atmosphere. A new trolley line from Downtown to Methodist Hospital that runs over the Houston Street Viaduct should be running by 2014. Then, the next link would extend near — or possibly through — Bishop Arts. ■

"There are more options than people realize," he said.

He mentioned a friend in Houston who has four degrees and noted that educational visas are relatively easy to obtain. Another of Flowers' friends lives in California on an artist's visa. Flowers said that those visas are also obtainable if you can prove a certain level of achievement.

Another of Flowers' friends qualified for a green card because, as a doctor, he provides a level of skill needed in the country.

"Get creative," Flowers advised those looking for ways to get a visa.

Bi-national couples pay a heavy price for maintaining a relationship. Some couples give up jobs and move away from extended family to be together. Mark and Greg have made the decision to work another five years until they are ready to retire. But in the meantime, they have to maintain two separate residences and incur high travel expenses to be together.

Flowers counted his partner's education, an investment in a business they may never have started and attorney's fees as his biggest expenses.

"His tax filing is more complicated because of his entrepreneurial visa status," Flowers said. "And he spends thousands more per year in accounting."

Visas to reside in the U.S. must be picked up in the home country. So each time a visa is renewed or changed from one category to another, a trip that may involve travel halfway around the world will be required.

Webb said that as an attorney, he's sworn to abide by the laws of the United States. But as an advocate for his clients, he believes it's time to change the laws to honor all families.

"The founders of this country recognized that we all have the right to 'life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness,'" Webb said. "What can be more basic to the pursuit of happiness than being able to choose with whom you share your life?" ■

Tin Moses' 10 Commandments of Target Field

Security guard at Twins' ballpark reprimands kissing lesbians with biblical law, prompting complaint to Department of Human Rights

Among the security guards at Target Field in Minneapolis, one stands out for his overriding moral concerns. The fellow is a little tin Moses, and the stadium is his Mount Sinai — with mustard and relish.

Taylor Campione and Kelsi Culpepper encountered him when they decided to take in a Minnesota Twins game on May 27.

According to City Pages, the young women arrived a little late to the game, and Culpepper headed for the restroom, first giving her girlfriend a quick peck. A middle-aged security guard immediately walked toward Campione, shaking his head.

"I saw you kissing that girl; you can't do that," he said.

"I can kiss whoever I want to," Campione retorted, showing quicker reflexes than most infielders.

"Well, we don't play grab-ass here," said the guard.

If the women shared only a quick kiss, as they claim, this man's sense of anatomy leaves something to be desired. He must think catchers squat on their ears.

Campione told Culpepper what had transpired, and Culpepper confronted the guard, saying, "I don't understand what's wrong with kissing my girlfriend."

After some arguing, the security guard declared, "Well, here in the stadium, we adhere to the Ten Commandments."

That one would've left me speechless. I wouldn't have known whether to laugh, shriek or look around for Charlton Heston.

What I do know is there is no commandment about kissing, same-sex or otherwise. So which commandments was the man talking about? Which ones do they adhere to at Target Field?

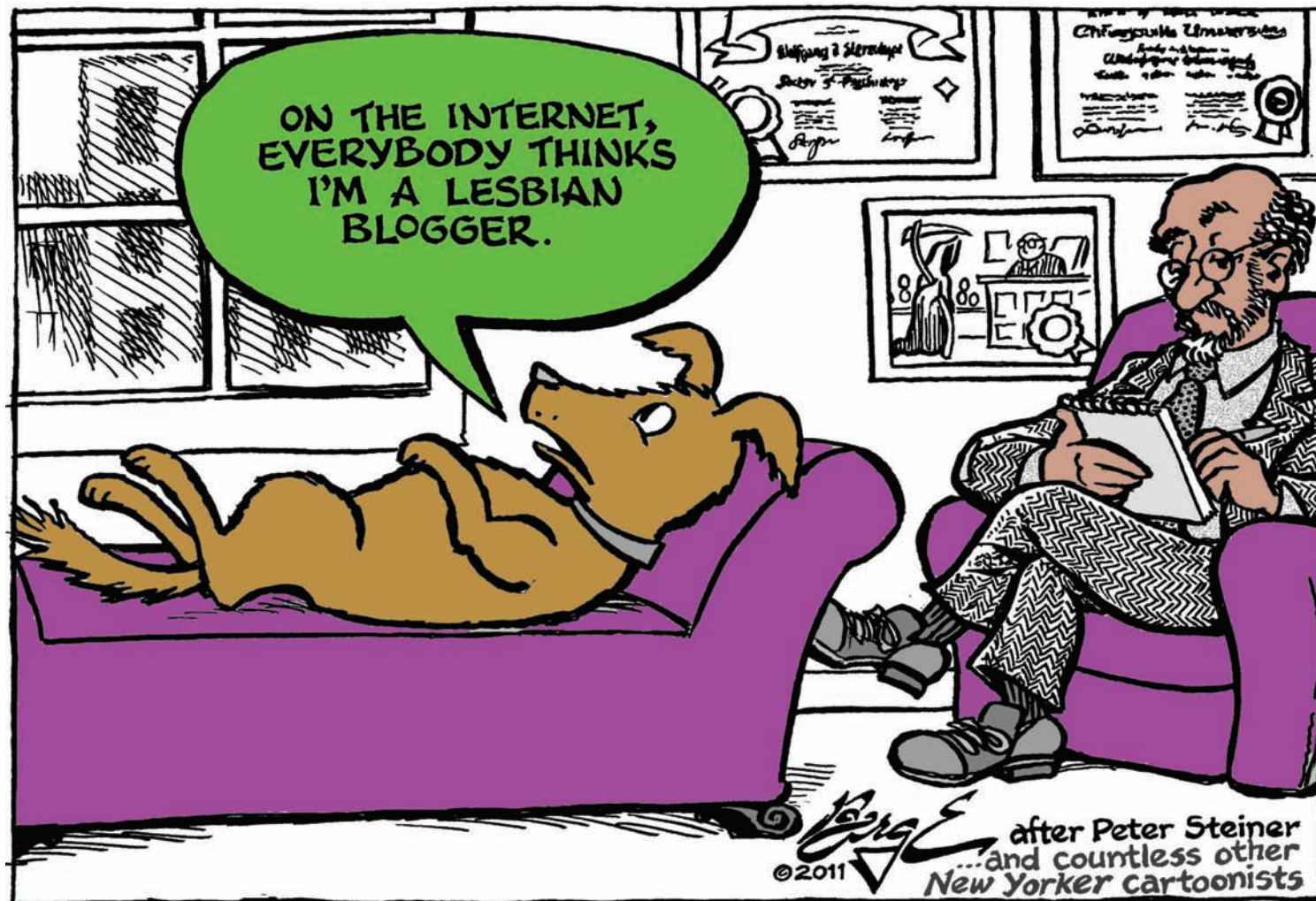

Something WICKED this way comes

Alt-gay gorefest *Fears for Queers* is back for seconds as vampire director Mark Bessenger presses the flesh

BLOOD-SUCKING HUNKS | It could be hard to run from these beefy vampires in 'Bite Marks,' a horror comedy starring Dallas native Benjamin Lutz.

Mark Bessenger may be the first person to coin the term "horror drag." The film director, who comes to town Saturday for Dallas' second annual Fears for Queers Film Festival, ponders over what queer audiences find in horror films. As he sees it, the gays *love* screams.

"Whether [it's because] we identify with the monster as an out-cast, or because people dress up in all that horror drag, I'm kinda surprised [LGBT-themed horror festivals] are not happening more often," he says.

Bessenger's first produced feature, *Bite Marks*, closes out the one-day fest, following a successful premiere at the San Francisco International Gay and Lesbian Film Festival last week. And even though Fears for Queers isn't as big, Bessenger is glad organizers Shawn Ewert and Andrew Rose approached him for it.

"It's like we were made for each other," he says. "How often do you run into a gay film festival of horror movies? I can't wait to see how Texans react. And to have it shown at the theater where Lee Harvey Oswald was apprehended? That's such a bonus."

In *Bite Marks*, Brewster, a truck driver (played by Dallas native Benjamin Lutz), is dealing with his sexuality. While on the road, he picks up a hitchhiking gay couple working out some issues of their own. If you think the premise sounds suspiciously like the plot of a gay porn film, you are not alone.

"Even during casting, we were asked if this was a porno," he laughs. "Without giving too much away, Brewster is hauling a shipment of coffins to a funeral home, but when the GPS misleads them, they find themselves in an abandoned junkyard — and the coffins may not be empty."

Written to be dark and brutal, Bessenger made changes during talks with his executive producer. Initially, the hitchhikers were straight, but changed to same-sex to broaden the demographic. (How often has *that* decision been made?) He also changed the tone to more of a horror comedy.

The decisions have paid off. Bessenger's reaction from the San Fran crowd was enthusiastic.

"The feedback I've gotten has mostly been about the comedy," he says. "I think they responded because of its gay edge and snappy lines. One funny thing was the more conventional horror scares I use, the audience wasn't familiar with."

Bessenger was thrilled hearing gasps in the audience and seeing people jump in their seats. Although he says his next film will be straightforward horror, the gay element isn't lost on him. His approach has been to create the film and then figure in an LGBT aspect. He has no problem being the "gay filmmaker," as that sensibility will creep into his movies regardless.

"Of course it depends on who I'm making the movie for, but be-

cause I am gay, there will likely be that aesthetic," Bessenger says. "If I had done *Avatar* or *Super 8*, there would be something gay in there. Artistically, something of yourself has to seep in even if it's just a line of dialogue or a reference."

But making *Bite Marks* so gay was easier because all the lead actors were out, including Lutz, an SMU grad making his feature film debut. Lutz performed in Dallas with the likes of Kitchen Dog Theater and the Dallas Theater Center, but left for L.A. six years ago. But he's downplaying his homecoming.

"I am really excited to see it on my home turf," he says. "I can't be nervous about reactions. I've done my work, it's up there and there's nothing I can do."

But he had some nerves going into the part. Unlike the blue-collar Midwesterner Brewster, Lutz is a Texas boy; he worried if that would hinder his performance.

"I've never driven a truck or done certain things Brewster has," he says. "I was nervous I wouldn't have a believable accent, but everything really fell in place. I felt like I was in really good hands with Mark."

Both Bessenger and Lutz are at work on their next films, and Bessenger for one is excited about the continued growth of LGBT voices in film into something broader. He just wants them to scream as well.



Fears for Queers' lineup

Cupcake, left, is likely the first zombie lesbian musical. The short fits in a chorus line of zombies amid a love story in the suburbs. A lesbian couple moves into

Hobart, but the crabby pair of old ladies next door aren't having it, but beware of that pale-looking mailman.

strangers led by a mysterious girl into the deep woods where no one can hear them scream.

Lola Rocknrolla is back with cinematic screwballery in the short, *I Was a Tranny Werewolf*.

Love gone wrong

Relationships are screwed up in 'Dying City,' '5 Women,' 'Cyrano'

All of the female characters in Alan Ball's comedy **Five Women Wearing the Same Dress** fit cozily into "types:" Cynical young rebel Meredith (Catherine DuBord); perky, Bible-quoting Frances (Heather Sims); saucy beauty queen Trisha (Emily Scott Banks); emotionally volatile Georgeanne (Barrett Nash); blowsy lesbian Mindy (Catherine Wall). You can practically hear a pitch meeting where he tried to get a network to option it as a sitcom.

But there's nothing *wrong* with situational comedy, especially when it's presented with such frothy fun. The danger is when the jokes and set-ups never move beyond what's expected. Familiarity truly can breed contempt.

That doesn't happen here, though it could. When Meredith enters — cig drooping from her lips, her sunglasses and leather biker jacket barely hiding a bridesmaid dress that looks like a hideous explosion of Pepto-Bismol, taffeta and bows — it seems like a shorthand to establish her character as "the bad girl." But DuBord goes further, as Ball's script allows her, finding depth between all the one-liners.

She and the other four ladies are all attendants at her sister's wedding, though none of them seem to like the bride very much. They reconnect with each other, bonding over their hatred for the sickening frosting-colored gowns, the sleazy guests ... and sometimes each others' prejudices. (Frances is appalled that the groom has a lesbian sister "and everyone knows it!? They look just like real women!")

The cast is superb, with the standouts a sassy, beautiful Banks (whose authoritative entrance pegs her instantly as the character to watch) and Wall (who delivers the punchy lines with brio). Ball is clearly out-magnoling *Steel Magnolias*, with dishy dialogue as well as zingers about the Christian right and thoughtful observations about AIDS and child abuse, but he never lets those aspects weigh down its confectionary tone. If there's only one June wed-

ding you attend this year, make it this one.

Dying City isn't the most upbeat title for a play that itself is sometimes swallowed by sadness, but Second Thought's regional premiere of this play about a gay man (Rhett Henckel) who visits the widow (Grace Heid) of his twin brother (also Henckel) a year after his apparent suicide in Iraq has much to recommend it, notably its two actors.

As the gay brother, Henckel is marvelously superficial playing an actor who's a bit too full of himself and whose attempts to connect with his sister-in-law fall infuriatingly short. Heid is less accessible emotionally (she spends too much time with her arms crossed across her slender frame), but she modulates the scene between past and present beautifully.

The play itself is a reverie on Truth and Perception and War and Human Understanding — big

themes that are difficult to resolve, or even give sufficient cursory treatment, but if writer Christopher Shinn bites off more than he can chew, he gets props for trying to do something meaningful and contemporary without banging his (or our) head into a wall.

For 40 years, Dallas' Shakespeare in the Park has been just that: The Bard, and just the Bard, outdoors.

But Bill only wrote 38 plays (and far fewer good ones), so to mix it up this season, Shakespeare Dallas has thrown in Edmond Rostand's **Cyrano de Bergerac**. It is a somewhat puzzling addition. Rostand wrote it about 300 years after Shakespeare; although written in verse (in French), the translation of this production removes most of the poetry.

And then there's this little problem: It's not actually that good of a play. Cyrano's poetry is purple; the death scene is needlessly prolonged; the characters largely unlikable.

This production clocks in at more than three hours — a long time to sit in the punishing winds and Texas heat of Samuell-Grand Amphitheater. Its famous central conceit — that the big-nosed poet and warrior Cyrano (Chris Hury) writes all the love notes to his beloved Roxane (Lydia Mackay) on behalf of the doltish young hottie Christian (Austin Tindle) — isn't even introduced into more than an hour in. Until then we spend a lot of time with peripheral characters; after then, we begin to realize what a high-maintenance and superficial bitch Roxane really is. (When Christian *doesn't* woo her with good poems, she turns on him like a snake.)

I cannot imagine that the director,

Raphael Perry, has ever instructed any actor to "tone it down:" There's a stentorian, *commedia dell'arte* flamboyance to the performances he leads, and it's rarely needed, even in the gustiness of outdoors that often carried the miked voices of the actor into the trees. (At times, the winds blew so hard on the extensively caped cast I thought it might morph into a stage version of *Batman*; I started looking to see if Julie Taymor was around.) Even the costumes are freakishly overdone, some shoes bedecked with such garish pompoms that it appears the actors are continually kicking Teletubbies.

Nonetheless, the balcony scene (perhaps that's the Shakespeare connection) is superbly wrought by the central actors, and despite its length (and the overall "eh" reaction I had when it was over) there is a calming, civilized wave that befalls as you sit amid nature, eating cheese and pinot grigio out of a picnic basket while a play rages on before you. It ain't the Winspear. But neither is it a walk in the park.
