Man faces DWI charge after police say he passed out at wheel, drug firefighter who woke him

Dallas police arrested a man early Tuesday morning, March 13, after he allegedly dragged a firefighter with his vehicle after a scuffle near the Cedar Springs strip in Oak Lawn.

Aaron Scott Jenkins, 27, was arrested shortly after wrestling with 35year-old Jesse Munoz, who was returning from a call with Dallas Fire-Rescue when he stopped behind a 2006 silver Mazda four-door car in the 3000 block of Douglas Avenue around 2:15 a.m., accord-



ing to a Dallas police report. Aaron Jenkins When the light turned

green, Munoz noticed the man driving the car in front of him was unconscious.

He tried to wake up the man before opening the driver's side door, placing the vehicle in neutral and putting the parking brake on.

The man then woke up and told Munoz not to call police for help, but Munoz stated that he was going to call police, the report states. The man closed the door and began to wrestle with Munoz before putting his car in drive — and starting to drive off while still wresting with Munoz.

Munoz told police he was dragged for a few seconds before the man released him, scraping his arm on the man's car. He declined medical treatment.

Police were dispatched at 2:30 a.m. and arrested Jenkins shortly after, a spokeswoman with the Dallas Police Department said. While the police report lists the offense as an aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, Jenkins was arrested for driving while intoxicated because Munoz's injuries were only minor, she said.

Jenkins has since been released from the Dallas County Jail, according to jail records.

For 1st time ever, gay immigrant allowed to stay in Texas based on same-sex marriage A Houston immigration judge has allowed a gay

Costa Rican immigration judge has allowed a gay Costa Rican immigrant to stay in the U.S. based on his same-sex marriage to an American — which LGBT advocates say is a first in Texas.

The Houston Chronicle reports that Judge Richard Walton on Thursday, March 8, closed a deportation case against David Gonzalez, an accountant who's been fighting to stay in Texas with his husband, U.S. citizen Mario Ramirez, since last year.

Gonzalez and Ramirez, who've been together for more than six years and live near the Houston suburb of Humble, were married in California in 2008 — during the brief window when same-sex marriage was legal there. But Gonzalez has overstayed his tourist

visa, and because of the federal Defense of Marriage Act, he cannot apply for a Green Card based on the couple's marriage.

Steve Ralls, a spokesman for Immigration Equality, notes that the outcome is consistent with other recent cases involving same-sex couples across the country — including high-profile ones in California and New Jersey.

Last August, the Obama administration announced it would focus on high-priority immigration cases involving public safety concerns — a move which benefited same-sex couples where one partner is facing deportation. From the Chronicle:

Gonzalez said he left Costa Rica in Spring 2000 on a tourist visa to escape an abusive ex-lover. More than six years ago, he met Mario Ramirez, a U.S. citizen, whom he calls his "soulmate."

The couple married in Los Angeles in 2008, during the brief period that same-sex marriage was legal in California. They moved to Texas, bought a home near Humble and started talking about adopting children.

The closure of Gonzalez's case means that the government is no longer seeking to deport him, but he still has no legal right to work in the United States.

"It is definitely good news that the administration is beginning to drop deportation proceedings, but now the individuals who are spared from deportation need to be able to receive that legal recognition that is so important as they continue to build a life here with their U.S. citizen partners," Ralls said.

2 gay men beaten with baseball bats in hate crime

Police seek suspects in NE Dallas attack that left victims unconscious

Two black gay men are recovering from a hate crime after they were attacked with baseball bats in an area of northeast Dallas where a hate crime has never been reported.

The two men, 20 and 27, were walking near the corner of Audelia Road and Forest Lane around 2 a.m. on Tuesday, March 13, when a dark four-door vehicle with 24-inch rims, which Dallas police believe could be a Buick, approached them. An estimated five black men in their 20s yelled "fags and sissy" at the two men before three exited, two with baseball bats, and began to beat them, according to police reports.

The 27-year-old was hit at least four times in the head with a baseball bat before losing consciousness, the report states.

The 20-year-old tried to fight back and was caught in the passenger's side of the vehicle. He was dragged an unknown distance before he could escape. He was in and out of consciousness, the report states.

When the two regained consciousness they transported themselves to Medical City Hospital, which is about 4 miles from the location they were attacked.


The 27-year-old had bruising and swelling on his head, bruising on his stomach, a black eye and scrapes on a knee, according to reports. The younger man sustained a 2-inch cut on the side of his head, a 1-inch cut on his nose, bruising and swelling to both eyes and cheekbones, chipped upper teeth, scrapes on a toe and finger, and 2-inch scrapes on his shoulder and stomach.

Medical City Hospital spokeswoman Chris Hawes said the two men had been released as of Thursday morning.

Sr. Cpl. Laura Martin, LGBT liaison officer for the Dallas Police Department, said the victims didn't know the attackers and gave officers vague descriptions, only noticing the dark fourdoor vehicle and that they appeared to be in their 20s.

The lack of a better description makes police reliant on witnesses who saw the attack or know the attackers.

White House anti-bullying conference comes to UTA

ARLINGTON — Hundreds of LGBT youth, advocates, educators and politicians from Texas and national organizations will join Obama administration officials for panel discussions and workshops at the White House LGBT Conference on Safe Schools and Communities at the University of Texas at Arlington on Tuesday, March 20.

The conference is the third in a series of eight LGBT conferences hosted by the White House and the U.S. Department of Justice. The conferences were announced in February and are expected to run through June.

4 openly gay candidates seek Texas House seats

Lone Star State now one of only 18 that lacks an openly LGBT legislator, which history suggests is needed to pass relationship recognition

Since 2003, when Austin Democrat Glen Maxey left the Texas House, no out LGBT person has served in the Texas Legislature.

The Lone Star State is now one of only 18 states that lacks an openly LGBT state legislator, according to the Gay and Lesbian Victory Fund, the Washington, D.C.-based PAC that backs out candidates nationwide.

But at least four LGBT candidates for Texas House will be seeking to change that this year.

Victory Fund spokesman Dennis Dison said the group has not yet endorsed any of the candidates, and the filing period for May 29 primaries just ended last week. But Dison said he believes electing openly LGBT candidates to public office is a crucial part of passing pro-equailty legislation. "No state legislature has instituted [same-sex] partnership rights without having out LGBT officials in the legislature," Dison said. "We have seen in cases where there is just a sole legislator, that it can have a huge impact in terms of our community and changing people's minds about who we are."

Ray Hill

At 71, Ray Hill is the patriarch of Houston LGBT activism. After coming out in high school (while playing quarterback on the football team) Hill went on to be involved in nearly every major event in Houston's queer history, from serving as president of the Houston GLBT Political Caucus to organizing the community after the hate-crime murder of Paul Broussard in 1991. Hill boasts that Mayor Annise Parker, then a Rice University student, used to keep his number with her whenever she'd go out to the lesbian bars in Houston, which were periodically raided by police.

"If you got picked up [by the police] in a bar, I was the only one who showed up in courts when

people got arrested, and I knew what to do and how to keep you out of trouble," Hill said.

Hill faces incumbent Rep. Garnet Coleman in the Democratic Primary. Coleman, who's served as state representative for nearly 20 years, has received the endorsement of the Houston GLBT Political Caucus every time he's run.

Last legislative session, he introduced a bill to repeal the Texas constitutional amendment that prohibits the state from recognizing samesex marriage. Coleman was one of only 25 members who unequivocally opposed the amendment when it passed the House in 2005.

Hill said it was the Broussard case that drew him into the race. Last year one of Broussard's killers, John Buice, was recommended for parole by the Texas Board of Pardons and Paroles.

Hill advocated for parole, while Coleman wrote a letter to the board asking them to overturn their decision and keep Buice behind bars.

After the board rejected parole for Buice, Hill announced his entrance into the race.

"One of the things that Garnet Coleman and I disagree on is the benefits of revenge in criminal justice," said Hill, who feels Coleman overstepped his role as state representative by interfering in the case. "Revenge doesn't accomplish anything.'

Mary Gonzalez

If Hill represents the grand old tradition of Texas LGBT activists, Mary Gonzalez is the symbol of its newest generation. Born and raised in Clint, outside of El Paso, the graduate student is a veteran of the Capitol, having worked for state Reps. Paul Moreno and Richard Raymond.

Gonzalez is co-chair of the Board of Directors for allgo, a statewide organization for queer people of color. At 28, she is the youngest of the out candidates running for the Texas House, but has quickly established herself as the frontrunner in the Democratic Primary in El Paso's District 75, a contest to replace Demoratic Rep. Chente Quintillia, who isn't seeking re-election.

Gonzalez has out fundraised her two primary opponents, Hector Enriquez and Tony Roman, four to one, and has a nearly \$20,000 war chest to support her campaign.

"I have strong backing and people who are excited about this race," Gonzalez said.

Gonzalez said she is proud to be an out queer woman, but that in her race the need for basic necessities takes precedence. "When people don't have running water, street lights, roads, or basic infrastructure, the last thing that people are going to talk about is domestic partnerships," said Gonzalez. "In a part of my district, San Elizario, 49 percent of the people are living below the federal poverty level."

At the same time, she said it's important that people know she is running as an out candidate.

"I always liked the idea of people knowing there's someone out here in El Paso who is out and fighting for these issues," she said.

Ann Johnson

Johnson, 37, is the only Democratic candidate running in Houston's House District 134.

She will face Republican incumbent Sarah Davis, who is also running unopposed in her primary, in November. As a freshman in the current Legislature, Davis has a spotty record on LGBT issues. She voted for some anti-bullying legislation but also supported efforts to defund campus LGBT resource centers at Texas universities.

Johnson doesn't believe that running as an out candidate will influence the voters of District 134 one way or the other.

"That's who I am," Johnson said. "I don't think it will affect the race. This district is a thoughtful district. I know that when they look at the issues and when they look at my history they know that when it comes time to stand up in Austin and fight for issues that are important to them, issues like public education and health, I will stand up for them."

Johnson is the daughter of former State Rep. Jake Johnson. She is a former prosecutor who, as a lawyer in private practice, specializes in child advocacy cases, including representing victims of bullying and harassment in public schools. Johnson proudly includes her partner, Sonya, in her public bio.

Carlos Vasquez

Vasquez, 44, currently serves as a school board member for the Fort Worth ISD. He faces incumbent Lon Burnam in the Democratic Primary in Cowtown's District 90.

Burnam hasn't had a primary opponent since he was first elected in 1996. Like Rep. Coleman, Burnam is one of only 25 Texas House members who unequivocally opposed the 2005 Texas constitutional amendment prohibiting marriage equality. Burnam has also co-authored anti-bullying legislation for the past two legislative sessions.

Vasquez said he feels Burnam has not done enough in Austin, particularly on education.

"My opponent is a good man and means well," Vasquez said. "However, the record shows that under both a Texas Democratic House of Representatives and now under a Republican-controlled House, he has been equally ineffective. His good intentions are not getting it done in Austin; we need progress, not posturing."

A fifth openly gay candidate who'd announced plans to run for Texas House, George Clayton of Richardson, instead filed for re-election to his seat on the State Board of Education.



Stonewall sets forums, screenings for primary

LGBT Democratic group to host debates featuring candidates for new congressional district, County Commissioners Court at Sue Ellen's

With Texas' primaries finally set for May 29, Stonewall Democrats of Dallas has scheduled endorsement screenings and announced it will host candidate forums in two races.

Stonewall's endorsement screenings will be April 13 and 14 at Resource Center Dallas.

On March 27, candidates for the new 33rd U.S. Congressional District, which covers parts of Tarrant and Dallas counties, will be in the Vixen Lounge at Sue Ellen's.

On April 3, candidates for Dallas County Commissioners Court District 1 will be at Sue Ellen's for Stonewall's second forum.

"We want a very fair format with a moderator unaffiliated with Stonewall," Stonewall President Omar Narvaez said.

He said both the LGBT group's general membership and attendees will be allowed to submit questions. The half hour before and after the forums will be for meet-and-greets.

Stonewall's political affairs chair Tracy Clinton said the forums will allow the group's members to "dig a little deeper into the candidates."

The newly drawn District 33 winds across a long, narrow swath of two counties, and 11 candidates have filed for the race. The organization is waiting to hear back from candidates to see how many will attend.

"We're looking for some partnerships for the District 33 forum," Clinton said.

The district begins in the southeast Fort Worth neighborhood that includes the Rainbow Lounge, cuts through parts of Arlington and Irving and ends in Dallas in North Oak Cliff.

Narvaez said two Irving precincts that have among the most female same-sex couples in Texas are in the district.



for that seat from Dallas include State Rep. Domingo Garcia and City former Councilman Steve Salazar. Fort Worth is well represented with City Councilwoman Kathleen Hicks and State Rep. Marc Veasey.

other candidates are a doctor, an attorney and several community activists and organizers from both counties, Narvaez said.

Omar Narvaez

Garcia will speak at the monthly Stonewall meeting on March 20 and is the only one of the candidates confirmed for the forum at press time. Three candidates are vying for the Democratic

nomination for Commissioners Court. "The new district is about one-third African-

American, one-third Anglo and one-third Latino," Narvaez said.

He said the three candidates are well-known within their communities.

"We don't have a poor choice," he said.

Narvaez said other races are also competitive and include well-known challengers. For example, in the District 30 congressional race, Barbara Mallory Caraway is one of two candidates challenging U.S. Rep. Eddie Bernie Johnson, D-Texas. But Narvaez said, "We're probably not doing other forums because of time and endorsements."

Once the organization decides on its candidates, members will work for the group's slate.

Clinton called the delayed date for the primary frustrating and a disruption of the election cycle. With 11 candidates, he said, District 33 is among races likely to have runoffs, which will be held July 31.

As Cedar Springs traffic plan moves ahead, parking looms

Merchants say long-term plan includes parking structure; street unlikely to be narrowed as part of ongoing safety improvements

Working with the Cedar Springs Merchants Association, the city of Dallas has begun traffic and pedestrian safety upgrades on Cedar Springs Road between Oak Lawn and Douglas avenues.

While these improvements are welcome, both city officials and business owners agree that solving the area's parking woes will also be critical to maintaining the strip's vitality.

"Parking needs to be looked at, with more than just parking on the street," said Peer Chacko, assistant director of development services for the city.

Chacko said in most parts of the city, property owners are required to provide enough parking for their tenants. In some places, like Knox Street and Downtown, property owners collaborate to solve parking problems.

"That's the direction they [Cedar Springs Road property owners] need to go," he said.

Merchants Association Executive Director Scott Whittall agreed.

"We're developing long-term plans to develop

a parking structure," Whittall said.

Whittall said a parking garage is needed to attract businesses, as well as patrons who want a safe place to park. Several options and locations are being considered, but Whittall said he wasn't prepared to discuss them in more detail this week.

Last year, Whittall sold his Cedar Springs coffee shop, Buli, because he was unable to expand into the vacant space next door due to parking requirements

And much of the crime in the area involves Cedar Springs patrons who are victimized late at night as they walk to and from cars parked blocks away.

The traffic safety improvements, which began in January, come in response to four collisions involving pedestrians within a few months late last year.

Since then, the city has installed flashing, eyelevel warning signs at multiple crosswalks.

The crosswalk lights were supposed to flash nonstop for only the first 30 days — but Whittall said they continue to do so because the city is working on obtaining parts.

Although the signs and lights have been installed, the devices to regulate the lights haven't. Whittall said either sensors or buttons will be installed. The sensors would make the lights flash as soon as someone steps into a crosswalk. The buttons would activate the lights when pushed. Whittall said he believes the latter system will be used. Meanwhile, studies have been conducted to de-

termine whether traffic signals are needed at Knight Street and Reagan Street.

"The traffic light at Reagan is not going to happen," Whittall said.

However, Reagan Street will become right-turnonly onto Cedar Springs Road from either direction.

The traffic signal at Knight Street is already funded and will be added by July. The city is looking at the configuration. Because Knight Street jogs at Cedar Springs, it will probably be a three-way light with only right turns allowed onto Cedar Springs.

Traffic buttons in front of Kroger have not been effective in preventing left turns. The city considered a small median, but that could be a problem during events such as the gay Pride parade.

Whittall said at the last meeting between merchants and the city, they discussed removable plastic traffic stakes.

Pedestrian traffic on that end of the strip is only expected to increase. Three of the pedestrian collisions — including a fatal one — occurred there.

Eric Pederson of the Crosland Group said his company plans to break ground on ilume 2 in late spring.

That property is northeast of Cedar Springs and Knight, diagonally across from the first ilume. Once the new development opens, residents will be crossing Douglas Avenue to Kroger. Traffic travels on that street faster than on Cedar Springs, making it potentially more dangerous to pedestrians.

A final consideration of the traffic plan — narrowing Cedar Springs to one lane of traffic in each direction — is not likely to happen.

Chacko said there were mixed feelings among merchants about narrowing the street.

"There are ways to improve the pedestrian environment," he said, without removing lanes of traffic.

"Our sense is to slow traffic rather than reduce capacity," he said.

Whittall noted that when the Cedar Springs bridge over the Dallas North Tollway was closed for a year, traffic diverted to Lemmon Avenue and has not rebounded, resulting in a loss of business.

And a traffic study showed that motorists are already slowing in the area, traveling an average of 33 mph on Cedar Springs from Knight Street to Oak Lawn Avenue.

New GLSEN chapter aims to make N. Texas schools safer

Gay, Lesbian and Straight Education Network of Greater Dallas to help implement anti-bullying policies, bring GSAs to more campuses

James Tate has been working for 14 months to re-establish a North Texas chapter of the Gay, Lesbian and Straight Education Network. Last month GLSEN Greater Dallas was chartered by the national office in New York.

While all GLSEN chapters work within the national organization's mission, each chapter has a different list of projects that support, educate or train youth, teachers or administrators within local schools.

"We built a steering committee," he said, "and assessed the needs in this city."

Tate said he hopes to work with school districts throughout North Texas to implement anti-bullying policies, as well as help students create GSAs in schools that still don't have those student organizations.


Tate returned to Dallas to finish his master's degree in social domestic policy at UT Dallas after spending a semester in Washington, D.C. where he worked as an intern at the GLSEN public policy office.

When he got back to Dallas, he found that the former GLSEN chapter had folded so he began recruiting to build a board and reapply for certification with the national office.

"Katie Patrick is treasurer and the only person affiliated with the previous chapter," he said. "She brings all the history and is a wealth of knowledge."

Another board member is Pam Hancock, who is working on a doctorate at UT Arlington. As a youth, she was involved with a California chapter.

Tate said GLSEN isn't in competition with area Gay Straight Alliances or groups like Youth First Texas. Rather he sees his group as supplementing

and supporting those groups.

"We do training in schools with intervention specialists," he said. "And we're a local chapter of a national organization that has amazing resources."

Tate said he wants to see GSAs flourish in North Texas schools.

Only 11 of Dallas Independent School District's 39 high schools have GSAs, he said, and he would like to see that number increase. Outside the city, the need is even greater.

Local college students, he said, could be very helpful in mentoring students in area high schools starting new GSAs.

The revitalized chapter took a new name.

"It was very important to me to rename the chapter GLSEN Greater Dallas because we're serving the Metroplex," he said.

Fairness Fort Worth President Tom Anable said his city's anti-bullying campaign will roll out in October with the help of the new GLSEN chapter.

"They're going to implement a train-the-trainer program," he said. "The city has made a commitment to have James come in and implement procedures."

Anable said GLSEN provides safe schools kits for the district's 38 middle and high schools.

"Fort Worth ISD was very receptive," he said. "It's nice to have GLSEN represented here."

Andy Marra, GLSEN's national public relations

manager, said, "We're really excited to have a presence in Dallas again."

Marra said Houston's chapter is recently revitalized as well.

She said it was important in a state where nine out of 10 students reported hearing homophobic slurs in school and a third of students in that study said they heard faculty and staff making those slurs as well.

"Our train-the-trainer program is extremely popular," Marra said.

She said GLSEN's national staff is excited to have Tate and his board helping to make sure all North Texas LGBT students have a safe learning environment.

House Senior Advisor Valerie Jarrett will give the keynote addresses at next week's conference in Arlington. Their remarks will be followed by panel discussions and workshops in the afternoon on topics including bullying prevention and intervention, violence against LGBT youth of color and transgender people, family acceptance, and federal legal protection for LGBT students.

Robert Pittman, an openly gay man who was appointed U.S. attorney for the Western District of Texas by President Barack Obama, is among the panel participants. And Fort Worth City Councilman Joel Burns, who's become a celebrity thanks to his 2010 "It Gets Better" speech, will speak before introducing Jarrett. Judy Shepard, mother of the late Matthew Shepard and co-founder of the Matthew Shepard Foundation, will give closing remarks.

Attendance is expected to be about 400 and will include representatives from high school and college Gay-Straight Alliances, superintendents and deans of colleges of education from Dallas and Tarrant counties, and elected officials, Thomas Anable said.



of more conversations by topic on LGBT issues. The idea was then mulled over by the administration, and Anable received a call saying the White House wanted to break down the topics by city.

Being an integral part of the local planning, Anable said he was able to pick the topic for the Texas conference, so he chose school safety based on the progress the state has made recently in protecting students from bullying. And with LGBT students making up 5 percent of school populations but four times more likely to commit suicide, he said he "wanted to continue that focus" on school safety.

The Texas Legislature passed an anti-bullying bill last May, outlining the definition of bullying as anything verbal, written or electronically communicated that threatens a students' safety or interferes with their education. Each school district must create a plan to prevent, report, investigate and stop bullying, and students found to be harassing other students may be transferred to different classrooms or campuses.

Anable said Fairness Fort Worth, Resource Center Dallas and Councilman Burns have been working with Fort Worth and Dallas school districts to create bullying prevention and reaction plans.

The recent Anoka-Hennepin school district settlement in Minnesota — under which federal authorities will monitor the district for five years as it implements measures to protect LGBT students — is seen as a national model, and is expected to be a focus of the UTA conference.

"This is the most comprehensive, detailed program that has ever been in a consent decree regarding LGBT students," Anable said about the agreement. "My suspicion is that the attorney general is going to talk about that consent decree and probably lay that down as the standard they're going to hold all districts to. ... And if he does, that'll be truly groundbreaking."

Although the definition of bullying in the Texas

Education Code doesn't explicitly protect LGBT students with the language, it still protects every student, said Dennis Coleman, executive director of Equality Texas.

Coleman said Texas legislators "put children first" when they passed the legislation last year. He said he's grateful that Texas was able to pass anti-bullying legislation without federal intervention. He also said the selection of Texas as one of the eight states for a conference showed the national support for the Lone Star State.

"I think it just sends a signal to everyone that Texas does matter to the White House, especially on LGBT issues," Coleman said. "I think the White House doing these summits around the country, and Texas being one of those, says a lot about where they are and who they're listening to."

With state and federal officials and educators in one place discussing LGBT issues, Coleman said he hopes students voice their concerns, calling it "the best way to have your voice heard."

One of those voices will be Alohi Valdez, president of UTA's GSA. An openly gay junior, Valdez said she often faced bullying in middle school for being overweight. In college, she came out and began to dress more masculine with neckties. She said people drive by her as she walks on campus and shout gay slurs and ask if she is a man or a woman.

Last year, her apartment was targeted. She and her three roommates came home to find that someone had spray-painted gay slurs on the side of her apartment near campus. While the event worried her roommates enough to move out, she did not.

"I didn't want to bullied out of my apartment out of fear," she said. "I just hope it [the conference] brings awareness. It's a really serious issue."

The conference is also hosted by UTA's department of criminology and criminal justice and College of Education and Health Professions.

Alex del Carmen, chair of the department, said he was pleased UTA was selected after a civil rights conference at UTA last November focused

on hate crimes.

"I think UTA is a prime place to host the conference because academic universities and academic settings are ideal places for an equal exchange of ideas and of thoughts," he said. "When academics, along with the practitioners and the elected officials, get together and coordinate their efforts to work for the betterment of society, it's a good day for us all."

Zak Murphy, a junior at UTA, served as the vice president of the campus GSA last year.

While he said he's been "minorly bullied in the past," he's never been targeted at UTA because of the effort of the students, faculty and staff to respect equality, he said.


Murphy said he values the conferences and appreciates the fact UTA was selected as a location. But he added that he wants the issue of bullying to stay with those who attend and those in other states who cannot, so that the pain some students face is never forgotten.

"I hope people don't let this issue diminish," Murphy said. "I hope that by doing things like this, the issue is brought back into the prime spotlight, and hopefully legislation and other initiatives can be done to help further the cause."

Anable, a UTA alumnus, said although he was closeted as a teenager, he found out after he left high school that his three older brothers would go around and make sure no one picked on him — a luxury many LGBT youth don't have.

Now, Anable wants to give students an opportunity to talk about the issues he couldn't growing up in conservative Texas.

"I'm just so excited that we can have these conversations, we can educate each other, and that's what I hope and expect this event will do, is just open the dialogue, continue it at a higher level," Anable said. "There will be a lot of influential decision makers and politicians and schools that will come to this high-profile event, and they're going to hear the LGBT word, they're going to hear the issues. And once you hear it, you can't ignore it."

"We're really depending on the public to come forward. Maybe someone saw something, and we're hopeful that we'll have a good witness, but right now really all we have is the victims and the vague description," Martin said.

Venton Jones, a spokesman for the National Black Gay Men's Advocacy Coalition, wrote in an email to Dallas Voice that a report from the National Coalition of Anti-Violence Programs found violent crimes against LGBT people rose 13 percent in 2010 and that people of color and transgender women were more likely to be targeted. The report also found that people in those groups were least likely to report violence.

"In times of economic uncertainty, disenfranchised and marginalized populations like gay and bisexual men of color are frequently targeted for hate speech and violence," Jones wrote.

Derrick Spillman, executive director of DFW Pride Movement, said he doesn't think black gay men are targeted any more than other members of the LGBT community.

"Being a black gay man in the African-American community I don't think is any less challenging than in any other community," he said. "Just being different is something that makes people a target."

Spillman said the incident struck a fearful cord throughout the gay community. He said safety

and prevention efforts by police and the community need to be taken.

"This is something that is very unfortunate," Spillman said. "It not only placed the young men that this happened to in a fear for their life, but a lot of gay men or African-American gay men in general, who tend to stand out a little bit more, it makes us all begin to think about, 'When will it be our day? Will this ever happen to us?""

The Forest-Audelia area has been identified by Dallas police as one of 27 crime hotspots citywide, and it ranked third for violent crimes in 2011 with 176 offenses.

However, Martin said this is the first hate crime reported in the area.

"We haven't had anything in that area before, not a hate crime," she said.

In light of a hate crime occurring in an area that many in the gay community might not see as a targeted area, Martin said for people to stay aware of their surroundings using general safety precautions such as walking in groups late at night.

"Basically, be extra vigilant," she said. "Be aware that it happened. All we can do is ask people to beware that there was someone over there that targeted two people for their perceived sexual orientation."

The police reports classify the crimes as aggravated assaults, a second-degree felony punishable by up to 20 years in prison.

However, the crimes could be prosecuted as

first-degree felonies because under Texas' hate crime statute, an offense is enhanced to the next highest category if found to be a hate crime. A firstdegree felony is punishable by up to life in prison.

In May 2011, two men, both 28, were robbed after four Hispanic men jumped them on Throckmorton Street near Congress Avenue on their way to the Cedar Springs strip. One was struck with a

baseball bat while a gay slur was yelled at him, breaking his jaw. Dallas police didn't initially classify it as a hate crime, doing so three days later.

Hate crimes are classified by the FBI as being motivated "in whole or in part" by sexual-orientation bias, a primary indicator of which is "oral comments" made by attackers during an offense.

Police immediately identified Tuesday's incident as a hate crime, though Martin declined to "discuss the sexual orientation of the victims to respect their privacy." She noted that hate crimes can be based on actual or perceived sexual orientation. The Crimes Against Persons Unit is investigating the incident, and the FBI's civil rights division will follow up in case more help is needed, she said.

According to the FBI's 2010 hate crime statistics for Texas, there were 34 incidents based on sexual orientation, 75 against race, 19 for religion, 28 for ethnicity and one for disability. Dallas and Fort Worth were tied for second-most crimes based on sexual orientation, which accounted for five of Dallas's 11 hate crimes and five of Fort Worth's 14.

Houston ranked first in hate crimes based on sexual orientation, according to FBI data, with six out its 13 total complaints relating to sexual orientation. Other cities that had a complaint for sexual orientation had one or two, with the only number higher coming from Austin with three.

'We are here for you'

One-time nun trainee Kathy Bowser preaches message of inclusion as she aims to attract more young people, weekenders and continue to grow predominantly LGBT church at Cedar Creek Lake

CEDAR CREEK LAKE — Celebration on the Lake Church Pastor Kathy Bowser might seem demure and unimposing, but it quickly becomes clear from her conversation that she thinks big.

"If I could stand on top of the church and shout it out I would say, 'We are here for you,'" said Bowser during an interview in the pastor's office on a recent Saturday afternoon. "This is a flagship building for the community, and it's so much more than just a building. We're here, and when you need us, we're going to be here for you whether you come across the threshold or not."

Maybe that's part of the reason why four decades ago, Bowser realized she wasn't cut out for the life of a nun and left the Philadelphia convent of the Sisters and Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary order, where she'd spent about eight years preparing for her final vows. After all, except for in the 1960s television sitcom *The Flying Nun* starring Sally Field, who ever heard of a nun standing on a church?

Bowser left the service of the Catholic Church following the Vatican II Council when Pope John XXIII called a meeting to implement change. Her order's decision to follow only required changes and not others being recommended by the church council gravely disappointed Bowser.

"I was terribly disappointed in that because I thought the changes were necessary and wonderful," Bowser said of the changes, which included the abandonment of habits in exchange for modern wear. "There was a lot of upheaval in religious orders. I and many others left as a result of that."

Much more change was in store for Bowser, but at the time she only knew that she was abandoning her planned life as a nun. Having been trained as an educator, Bowser returned to her native Miami and went to work as a teacher in an innercity school.

After about six years of teaching, Bowser decided she was "dazzled by the real world" and wanted to explore other avenues of employment. She tried to sell life insurance for a while, but after exhausting contacts with family and friends realized she "wasn't that great of a sales person."

From there she went to the March of Dimes and later on to the American Heart Association, where she excelled in management.

"I had some terrific, wonderful jobs," said Bowser, who also made some big changes in her personal life along the way.

When Bowser first left the convent, she dated men. In fact, she was engaged to marry a man when, at 30, she met a gay woman who interested her. "I went out with her to a couple of gay bars," Bowser said. "I asked questions of the women I met, and then I fell in love with her and came out."

She remained with her first partner for seven years. Later, she met her current partner, Fluffy, with whom she's enjoyed a 26-year relationship.

About 20 years ago Bowser and her partner bought a lake house and began spending every weekend at Cedar Creek Lake. Later, they wanted to begin attending church on Sundays, but didn't find one on the lake at that time where they felt comfortable.

In 2003 they and a couple of other founding members of the church convinced Carole West, pastor of Celebration Community Church in Fort Worth, to start a satellite church on Cedar Creek Lake. They began meeting in a strip shopping center, and West, who also owned property on the lake, served as pastor until 2005.

At that point both the Fort Worth and the Cedar Creek Lake churches were growing, and the obligation became too much for West, who had on occasion called on Bowser to substitute preach. The lake church called Bowser to be its pastor in 2005.

By 2009, the lake church had grown enough and raised enough money to construct its own impressive building that includes a large, colorful stained glass window depicting a boat on a lake. The church that started out with just 10 members now has about 90.

Glen Robinson, chairman of the church's Board of Directors, attributes much of the success in growing the church membership and financing the construction of the building to Bowser.

"Kathy has been a wonderful leader of the congregation in every sense of the word," Robinson said. "She has guided us through every step of the way."

A church member, Gail DeCuire, volunteered as the contractor for the job, helping make the project possible. The church's community room, where potluck dinners are held every month, is named after DeCuire. Many other church members also helped make the construction possible in a variety of ways, including helping finish out the interior.

"The community came together to make this possible, and we're still not finished," Bowser said.

Bowser noted the church's work continues and its board has established strategic goals that include attracting more young gay and lesbian people to the church and attracting more weekenders to services. Most of the members now are fulltime residents of the many little cities around the lake.

Another goal is finishing the outside of the

church with landscaping and the construction of a parking lot.

Finally, the church board wants to get congregational members involved more in ministry, Bowser said. The church already contributes financially to the Henderson County Food Bank, the AIDS Pantry, the Humane Society, Friends of the Animals, the Women's Shelter, the Cedar Creek Library, students in the Kemp Independent School District, Community Food Pantry, Family Resource Center, East Texas Meals on Wheels, Gun Barrel City Meals on Wheels, Toys for Tots and Habitat for Humanity, but service work is also needed by those organizations, Bowser said.

Bowser is now retired from her career as an administrator for the March of Dimes and American Heart Association. She's studying at Brite Divinity School in Fort Worth.

Bowser said the most important message she wants to send out is that all people, regardless of whom they are and what their religious backgrounds are, will be welcomed at Celebration on the Lake Church. It is an interfaith church, and the congregation has in the past included people from all faiths including, Protestant, Catholic, Jewish, Buddhist, Mormon, Christian Scientist and Unitarian faiths.

"You don't have to have a particular set of beliefs to belong here," Bowser said. "We embrace all folks."



Joe's Run eyes records in 15th year

Fundraiser for Samaritan House – agency serving homeless people with HIV in Fort Worth – aims for highs in participation, proceeds

FORT WORTH — Rick Isaminger has been running for 30 years, completing four marathons and 20 half marathons. But for the last five years, Isaminger has been running to help his clients with HIV.

Isaminger, who serves as the support services manager at Samaritan House, also served on the planning committee for the nonprofit's 15th annual Joe's Run, which takes place March 24.

The run helps raise awareness of Samaritan House's services for homeless, HIV-positive clients. It also raises money for the programs Samaritan House offers those who stay at its two locations, in downtown Fort Worth and at the Villages at Samaritan House.

"I've been running on and off for 30 years, and

it's really a nice run for Fort Worth," Isaminger said. "Fort Worth can be pretty hilly, and this is relatively flat — and it's for a really good cause."

Samaritan House President and CEO Steve Dutton was the mastermind behind the event. After leaving the Board of Directors in 1996 to serve as CEO, he thought of the race as a way for people to learn about Samaritan House that would be affordable for the community and also serve as a small fundraiser.

"AIDS has always had a lot of baggage with it, and inviting people to come to Samaritan House to learn about what we do might not be that attractive to people," he said. "[Joe's Run] kind of provided a less confrontational way, just an opportunity, for people to come learn about us."

Partnering with Joe T. Garcia's as a sponsor, the race, then named the Race to Joe's, began and ended at the restaurant in north Fort Worth.

But after 10 years, Samaritan House moved to the south side of downtown Fort Worth. The race now begins and ends near Samaritan House at the Magnolia Green Park at 1100 Lipscomb St.

Attendance has spiked over the last few years at 2,500, and Dutton said the nonprofit has set a goal of breaking the record for participation this year.

"We're moving the bar out," he said. "We expect a record turnout. It all depends on the weather."

The run is also expected to bring in a record amount, he said, with proceeds nearing \$80,000, though the original idea of the race was never to bring in much money.

"It was never conceived as a big fundraiser. It was just really a friend-raiser," Dutton said. "It's a friend-raiser to a great extent, and it's continued to succeed."

Isaminger has witnessed the continued growth of the run with the addition of the 10K as an option to the 5K to attract more serious runners, as well as a new 1-mile walk this year to interest more families and parents with young kids.

Despite all the change and growth of the event, one thing has stayed the same: the parrot mascot. Chosen because it was associated with Joe T. Garcia's, the mascot remained despite the event moving and partnering with various restaurants near the Magnolia Green Park.

"We kept the name because it happened that we chose the logo, our pet, a parrot, and we named him Joe," he said. "For all these years the parrot has always been there in some form or fashion."

On your mark ... Registration for Joe's Run is \$25 for adults

through March 22 and \$30 the day of the run, March 24, or \$15 per person for the family walk. Registration is available online at JoesRunFW.com until midnight March 22 and in person the morning of the race.

While living in New York, Isaminger worked at Gay Men's Health Crisis, one of the first AIDS organizations, until he was laid off. He then decided to relocate to the area and began work at Samaritan House where he was able to do the same kind of work, he said.

But he enjoys his work more now because of the fewer clients he serves that he can give more attention to.

"The care and the level of care is much better because you really get to know your client," he said.

Isaminger managed about 4,000 clients in New York. He said about 60 homeless, HIV-positive people live at Samaritan House. Others who are HIV-positive or have disabilities live with their families in the 66 apartments at the Villages at Samaritan House, so now he helps manage the progress of about 400 people.

"It's so big and being at Samaritan House it's so much better because I think everybody gets so invested in the residents because we see them all day and I think the care here is tons better and the whole environment because you really know everybody," he said. "It really works as a team."


Originally from North Dallas, Isaminger lived in New York City for 25 years before returning to North Texas to work at Samaritan House five years ago. As an avid runner, he enjoyed participating in races in the Big Apple and has enjoyed watching Joe's Run blossom from a small gathering to "one of the largest races in Fort Worth."

"When I first moved down here, for me the races were, they're not small, but compared to what New York is they're small," he said.

But with Joe's Run reaching the 2,500 attendance mark, Isaminger said the atmosphere matches the crowded races in New York.

"I like all the people and it reminds me of the races that would be in Central Park because that's about the number of people that always popped over for a race," he said, adding that the real draw for him is the opportunity to show the community how Samaritan House helps people. "I like it because it is for a good cause."



Don't frack with the LGBT community!

Openly gay Oak Cliff resident was among 1st to warn Dallas residents about risks of hydraulic fracturing; now it's time for *you* to get involved

et's say all you know about a member of the LGBT community is that he (a) is an artist who creates needlepoint designs, (b) lives in an Oak Cliff gayborhood, and (c) calls his partner his spouse. What would you imagine he does in his "spare" time? Paint landscapes, perhaps. Breed schnauzers, maybe. Run marathons, possibly.

You'd be wrong — at least when it comes to Raymond Crawford. What he does is work tirelessly to preserve Dallas' air and water. He was one of the first Dallasites to call attention to gas drilling's dangers, creating the site Dallas-Drilling.Wordpress.com.

Let me back up. The elemental danger Crawford and others perceive is posed by

hydraulic fracturing, commonly referred to as "hydro-fracking" or simply "fracking."

Fracking is a process by which deep holes are drilled in the rock beneath our soil and are opened by high-pressure injections of chemically enhanced water plus sand. The pressure pushes this fracking fluid through the rock's fissures so it can reach and release natural gas. The gas is pushed into pipelines and on to companies that sell energy for in-

dustrial and household use here and abroad. And this is controversial because? Well, for several reasons.

First, ordinary residents were unaware that in 2008 the city signed leases with two companies, XTO Energy and Trinity East, both of which want to frack in Dallas. XTO paid \$14.7 million and Trinity East \$19 million, for a total of \$33.7 million. Apparently city officials spent the money, but on what? The city budget presented a few months later slashed funding for libraries and other "public goods" and eliminated all funding for HIV/AIDS outreach, education and prevention.

Second, fracking is controversial because while much of the fluid injected into the holes is water — fracking fluid may also contain any number of chemicals ... almost 1,000, according to FracDallas.org. Among them are benzene, ethylbenzene formaldehyde, hydrochloric acid and diesel fuel. That's why Schlumberger, a major provider of equipment and services in the industry, recommends treating the fracking fluid as hazardous waste. That's also why Crawford and so many others are concerned that the industry claims the composition of fracking fluid is a "trade secret."

Third, according to FracDallas.org, "Each frac-

ture requires 1.5 million to 9 million gallons of fresh water ... only about 20-60 percent of the contaminated water injected to fracture a well is recovered." Water deemed "flowback" or "produced" is never again safe to drink. It is so contaminated it is taken to injection well sites for permanent storage deep in the earth.

As in Cleburne, about which more later.

Fourth, opponents of gas drilling believe it can contaminate drinking water over a large area. In the documentary *Gasland*, a Dimrock, Penn. family's kitchen faucet spouts fire. In Rock Spring, Colo., a rancher is hospitalized after drinking water from his own tap. In Pavillion, Wyo., residents complain that the water tastes terrible and smells of fuel. Perhaps the chemicals can migrate upward through rock; certainly pipelines can crack; definitely videos show unreported spills in North Texas and nationwide.

Fifth, opponents worry about earthquakes caused by gas drilling. Industry representatives

admitted to the Dallas Gas Drilling Task Force that recent Cleburne earthquakes likely resulted from its injection wells. The earth also shook in nearby Waxahachie, Grand Prairie, Fort Worth and at DFW International Airport.

All this is before most North Texas drilling sites have been exploited. In states with many drilling sites, including Ohio and Pennsylvania, recent quakes have made national headlines.


tes Back now to our city's aforementioned task force. It comprised three "citizen representatives," three "subject-matter experts," three "industry representatives," Chair Lois Finkelman, and Parks Board President Joan Walne. You can check out its proceedings at DallasGasDrillingTaskForce.com.

After several months, the task force has issued recommendations that will — with City Council approval — govern the operations of XTO, Trinity East, and other private and/or corporate leaseholders.

The task force may have been surprised when, at its final meeting on Feb. 28, a group organized as Dallas Residents at Risk arrived at the City Hall meeting room with a full-color map dotted with scores of lease sites. Again, you can refer to Crawford's site, DallasDrilling.Wordpress.com for more.

Even before the new map appeared, Dallas Area Residents for Responsible Drilling, Mountain Creek Neighborhood Alliance, Texas Oil & Gas Accountability Project, Texas Campaign for the Environment, Downwinders at Risk, the Sierra Club — Raymond and his fellow environmentalists — were unhappy with the recommendations to which the task force seemed ready to agree.

At a minimum, they want the following five

requirements added to the task force's recommended standards: 1) 3,000-foot setback from homes, businesses, churches and the like; 2) full disclosure of all chemicals, so first responders are never endangered; 3) no exporting of Dallas water to operations outside the city; 4) company offsets for emissions from gas drilling operations; and 5) an industry-funded oversight office to respond to problems as they arise.

I would add five further requirements: 6) No drilling in floodplains; 7) no drilling on cityowned parklands; 8) translation of all leases into standard, straightforward English; 9) free copies of all leases made available to the public on request; and 10) evening meetings in each City Council district before drilling is approved.

Again, decisions on gas fracking operations in Dallas are now in the hands of the City Council and Mayor Mike Rawlings. Crawford and his colleagues are working hard to assure our safety.

The least you and I can do is fax, email, snail mail and visit every councilmember with our concerns. Let's call on the mayor, too.

Because LGBTs deserve clean air and water as much as everyone else. And when our community unites in action, we get results.

One last thing: Check your homeowner's insurance policy for earthquake damage coverage. You won't find it. It costs extra.

Opponents of same-sex marriage are hung up on the 'sex' part

Just as with contraception, foes fear any sex beyond procreation, and even gays base relationships on rigid, heteronormative model

s battles in several states heat up over same-sex marriage this year, opponents are stepping up their rhetoric. It's not surprising.

The idea of marriage for most people involves the idea of consummating that marriage and that means S-E-X.

The idea of sex between two people of the same sex gives some people hives, and thus the fear of same-sex marriage. But here's the deal: The problem is much deeper.

I think a lot of our opponents are afraid of us. They are scared not of our homosexuality, but our sexuality in general.

Just like fundamentalist religions, their strict interpretation of scripture inevitably leads to a crisis of faith or a complete dumbing down of the eloquence of the ancient writings in the Bible and other holy books.

These sexual fundamentalists see sex as strictly a means of procreation. Anything beyond that is

"dirty" and "perverted."

This is the attitude that makes the message against contraception resonate in some arenas. When politicians like Rick Santorum can actually

find support for limiting availability of contraception, what they are really doing is giving voice to the fear that sex can be something other than breeding. For sexual fundamentalists, if sex

beyond conception is pleasurable, then it is wrong. They are locked in the same mentality that people like me rebelled against in the 1960s and 1970s.

Although there was a lot wrongheaded about the Age of Aquarius mentality, there was some of it that was spot on. The fact that human sexuality is not

a binary system and that there is a whole spectrum of sexual attraction and sexuality beyond the heteronormative model is a fact.

For sexual fundamentalists, that is a threat. Their world is ruled by simplistic order and bumper sticker wisdom. Critical thinking is not allowed. In their world the fact that LGBT people can find happiness and sexual fulfillment outside their rigid model threatens their belief system.

Accepting same-sex marriage sends them into a panic because it triggers a crisis of faith. If there are more kinds of sexuality than just the hetero-

sexual procreation version, they might have to examine their own sexuality more closely. Heaven forbid!

Just listen to people like Maggie Gallagher of the National Organization for Marriage and you can hear the fear. She consistently lies about LGBT people and what we do to support her cause and more deeply her belief system.

It is little wonder that the right wing has attached religious freedom to the issue. For sexual fundamen-

talists it is a tenant of their faith. It might as well be the 11th commandment, "Thou shalt not have sex except to foster children. And under no circumstances shoulds't thou enjoy sex, least ye suffer crushing guilt."

On the flip side, so many LGBT people want to pattern their relationships and personal sexuality on the rigid heteronormative model. They want to assimilate into the whole binary system

and look just the same as everyone else. Relationships that fall outside the straight analog model are as much anathema to these people as gays are to sexual fundamentalists.

For us to actually achieve real freedom, it's going to take a concerted effort to combat the belief that there is only one model for relationships. It's going to take people becoming comfortable with their own sexuality, gay or straight. It's going to take moving the conversation from allowing same-sex people to marry to providing legal rights for all people and their relationships. It's going to be messy and difficult and it won't be easy.

Finding a path to freedom rarely is.

We must begin to talk as adults, honestly and openly about sex in all its aspects if we expect to see any real change. We need to acknowledge that the spectrum of sexuality is indeed a rainbow, not just black and white.

Click-click-*boom!*

How photographer Shannon Kern won the My Gay Texas photo contest with a casual snapshot of her best friend

n more than one way, Shannon Kern feels like an interloper.

She did not get involved in gay rights as an ally (though she now identifies as "pansexual") until June 28, 2009 — the night of the raid on the Rainbow Lounge. And she's not a professional photographer, though she has "dabbled" in photography for 15 years.

Yet there she found herself: The winner of the Dallas Voice's My Gay Texas photo contest. Here, then, the story behind the photo.

- Arnold Wayne Jones

Dallas Voice: Tell us about the photo – where was it taken, who is it of...? Kern: It was taken at the

Stonewall Rebellion 41st anniversary march and rally at Founders Plaza on June 27, 2010. The [men in it] are my best friend, Freddie Fieder, who designed the shirt, his younger brother Eddie, who is wearing it. Freddie's the reason why I became a hardcore [gay rights] activist and an ally — well, him and the Rainbow Lounge raid.

What kind of camera did you use? Just an [inexpensive] Nikon. I'm saving up for a better camera.

How long have you and Freddie been friends?

- About 11 or 12 years. We met right after high school, working at a Red Lobster in Lewisville, and became soul mates.
- How did you hear about the contest? From Elizabeth Pax, one of my fellow activists. I'm a community organizer for GetEQUAL Texas and the founder of Soldiers Always Fighting for Equality [SAFE]. I take photos and videos of all of our marches and rallies.
- Did she know you were a photographer is that why she suggested you enter? I don't even consider myself a photographer, though I have been taking pictures a good 15 years. But my sister Stephanie, who also entered quite a few pictures, is a photojournalist, so I learned a lot of tricks from her.
- Was she jealous you won? No, she was excited for me! We're very supportive of each other.

- Your charity is GetEQUAL Texas, which you also work with. How long have you been affiliated with them? Since early last year.
- What do you do when you're not shooting or marching? I'm a graduate student at the University of Texas at Arlington. I'm graduating in December with a master of arts in political sociology. It's so fun! I'm working on my thesis right now.
- How do your photography, activism and studies complement each other? I think it's *extremely* important to our movement that we document *everything* we do — to provide proof of our progress to future generations and the efforts we have made for trying to obtain full federal equality, which is the goal.
- I'm taking [a class called] campaigns and elections it's my last class. I've waited three years to take it and am learning so much about the different facets of voting and the strategies and methodologies of campaigning.
- I feel there's such extreme polarization between the right and the left and this phenomenon were observing. What we're participating in is *our* fight, and we are at the forefront of a socio-political war. It's not just gay rights, but women's rights, minority rights, immigrant rights. We really need to participate in democracy. Our voices really do matter and we've got to use them. Don't take your right to vote for granted.

Yes, well voting certainly helped you win the contest! True.

ABOUT THE VOTING

For this year's awards, we looked to the community to define My Gay Texas in photography. The nominees included a diverse spectrum, from artsy to poignant to political - all representing life in Texas from an LGBT perspective.

This year, 929 voters selected Shannon Kern's photo as the top image, but we consider all of our submissions as winners. Thanks to all the photographers who took the time to submit their work and open it up to public vote!

With the photo contest and the nine categories of favorites, we received more than 10,000 electronic votes. Dallas peeps like to eat out, as the Dine category received the most votes in a particular section. The Round-Up Saloon took the most votes of any one place, for top Dallas club.

With some new winners and familiar names, we now present your choices for the 2012 Readers Voice Awards.







New Yorkers may have stumbled across the banh mi taco only last month, but Dallas has been enjoying them for coming up on a year, thanks to the Nammi food truck. Officially called Nammi Cruisin' Vietnamese Fusion, mobile grub peddler, owners Teena Nguyen and Gary Torres serve an alternative to the Korean taco craze that swept the nation a couple years back and is only now subsiding. The classic bahn mi, 12 hulking inches of delight, is itself a product of fusion, available with a choice of meat or tofu — go for the lemongrass beef or the grilled pork — paté, fresh cilantro, pickled cucumber, carrots and daikon as well as slices of cucumber and jalapeño between a baguette slathered with a mayonnaise. But it's the Vietnamese taco that distinguishes Nammi from the rest of the pack. The corn tortillas, packed with sautéed red cabbage and the traditional banh mi elements, add a sweetness that stands up against the fire of the chilies and salsa, not to mention allowing for a greater manageability on the go.



APPRECIATION: READERS VOICE BEST ATHLETE GREG SMITH (1971-2011)

To have known Greg Smith is to have experienced joy in its purest form. No matter where he went or what he did, Smith always had a smile on his face and an infectious generosity of spirit. As an athlete, Smith — who was voted best local gay athlete in this year's vote — was extremely competitive (he always played to win), but knew that in the end it was only a game. He exemplified good sportsmanship by never resorting to negativity in his pursuit of the goal. As his drag alterego, SheGotta Mustache, Smith became known for a razor wit and the ability to ad-lib as well as, if not better than, professional comedians.

Whether he was in a softball uniform or a dress and high heels, Smith's goal was to always motivate people through humor and positivity. His athletic endeavors in the gay community began in 1993 when he joined the Pegasus Slowpitch Softball Association; he was inducted into the PSSA Hall of Fame in 2004. In 2007, he was honored with three separate awards, receiving Player of the Year–B Division for the Woody's team; Coach of the Year–C Division for the Evolution team; and the PEGI award for Outstanding Service to PSSA. Over 18 years, he participated in 16 Softball World Series.

In addition to softball, Smith's imagination was captured by sports as diverse as baseball, bowling and volleyball, which he played for 10 years with the Dallas Independent Volleyball Association; last year, he received one of his final awards, the Rauhman Browning Award for Outstanding Service to DIVA.

As SheGotta, Smith helped raise hundreds of thousands of dollars for various charities and organizations, including his beloved PSSA and DIVA. Little could stop him from getting onstage to entertain for a good cause. One month after his second leg surgery — just seven weeks before he passed away — SheGotta was back in full makeup and wig performing, at a benefit for breast cancer.

His husband of nearly five years, Russ Rhoades, shared many epigrams that Smith lived his life by, including one that applied to his entire life: "We shall never know all the good that a simple smile can do" (Mother Teresa); and one that seemed to guide his sportsmanship: "The difference between the impossible and the possible lies in a person's determination" (Tommy Lasorda).

"Even at the end, his body gave out before his spirit did," Rhoades says. "He was and will continue to be an inspiration to many of his beloved friends and family."

Somewhere he is surely thrilled to receive this final tribute, quite possibly doing the splits in celebration.



ric Pratt was an accounting major in college, but after receiving a bottle of wine for taking care of a friend's hamster and two cats, he realized he could turn pet-sitting into a business. Eleven years later, Taddy's the one of the largest pet-sitting companies in Dallas, with six full-time and seven part-time employees. Their clients include about 70 dogs and 20 cats, not to mention birds, turtles, hermit crabs and poison dart frogs (which aren't really poisonous). Of the reason he counts for his success is that fact that it is him, the owner, who visits with each new clients and gets to know the animal, and then introduces them to their sitter. "I have great empathy for all animals, especially dogs and cats," says Pratt. "I've always had a dog growing up[, and] my whole life. They have a calming effect. The reaction that pets have with humans, they become part of your family. Most of my clients call them their baby." —*Mark Lowry*

To 'The Lighthouse'

DTC's Kevin Moriarty ventures out of his comfort zone by directing an opera

Anyone who wants to direct for the theater has control issues. After all, that's what the job is, right? Deciding how all the pieces fit together. Telling the actors, designers, crew what to do. Running the ship.

That *is* true of theater. But in opera, the job of the stage director is an entirely different thing. That's the lesson Kevin Moriarty learned

once he agreed to direct a one-act chamber

piece, *The Lighthouse*, at the behest of the Dallas Opera. (It plays for only three performances this weekend at the Wyly Theatre.)

"They asked me if I would be interested and I said sure," he says. He studied music in school and welcomed the opportunity to explore a new layer of his craft. Only he didn't know what he was getting himself into.

As artistic director of the Dallas Theater Center, Moriarty is already one of the busiest men in the North Texas arts community, from planning out his season to directing shows at DTC to nurturing students at Booker T. Washington High School. But tackling opera involved an entirely new learning curve.

For one thing, Moriarty is usually involved in casting, but "the number of people who can sing these roles is very limited. But Jonathan [Pell of the Dallas Opera] worked really hard to put together opera singers who can act."

The director's job is usually to establish the pace of a show; at the initial read-through with a cast, Moriarty usually maps out his vision. But at an opera read-through, it's the conductor who's in charge. He's at the hands of the composer and the music director.

That's a big change for someone who, in recent seasons, has done a mash-up version of two Shakespeare plays for his *Henry IV*, retooled *The Who's Tommy* as a furious feverdream and put the audience on moving seats for *The Wiz*. And that's not *The Lighthouse*.

"It is a psychological, actor-y piece," Moriarty explains. "I've never directed an opera but I like opera and I'm familiar with the genre. But they are not like musicals. *The Lighthouse* is more like doing a Pinter play — there are long pauses with orchestral music that slow the action. And Pinter is not something I would usually direct. Vagueness and stillness are not attributes people would ascribe to me."

Indeed, as a modernist opera, *The Lighthouse* has less in common with classic opera like *The Marriage of Figaro* and is more like Pinter's *Betrayal* with music.

But those limitations have also challenged Moriarty to stretch himself — and given him

the opportunity to work with conductor Nicole Paiement (only the second woman ever to conduct for the Dallas Opera).

Still, there's a lot of work for Moriarty to do. *The Lighthouse*, by the gay modernist British

composer Sir Peter Maxwell Davies, is a psychological opera (inspired by a true story) about what may have happened to three crewmen of a lighthouse on a remote crag of the Outer Hebrides. Moriarty himself eschews answering the mystery of what actually happened (madness? ghosts?) — the opera itself remains opaque.



"It keeps reminding me of literature," Moriarty says. "It's forcing me to go really deep into the piece. It's almost like writing

Wyly Theatre, 2400 Flora St. March 16 and 17 at 7:30 p.m., March 18 at 2 p.m. DallasOpera.org a paper." A few years ago, when he directed *A Midsummer Night's Dream* at the opening of the Wyly Theatre, Moriarty added a hip-hop attitude and rock music

to convey the spirit of the work, but the changes did not go to its nature. Here, he's taken a more respectful approach. "It's humbling to me," he says.

So given the demands of directing his first opera, is it something Moriarty would like to keep doing? He pauses.

"Ask me again in a few weeks," he says.

Sarah Vowell's march through history

Although she probably hates hearing it, and would probably disagree anyway, we can't help but think of Sarah Vowell, pictured, as the straight, female version of David Sedaris. Both are essayists who gained fame on NPR's *This American Life* and are as recognized for their distinctive voices as for their prose style. But while Sedaris is an out-and-out humorist, drawing from his own life, Vowell has a historian's curiosity, turning out non-fiction stories tied to themes that strike her fancy. And while she often finds humor, the subject matter often isn't funny.

"I just write about what I'm interested in and that story dictates the tone," she says over the phone in that nasal rasp that's so endearing. "My book about the Massachusetts Bay Colony is probably one of your breezier books about Puritans. The assassination book was pretty jovial — not because murder is funny, but because it was about the historic sites [of these assassinations]. You can't be too dignified when you are talking about tourism. But even *Take the Cannoli*


had an 8,000-word essay on the Cherokee removal and genocide. I never shy away from information." She's packed a lot of information into her latest, *Unfamiliar Fishes*, where she delves into the strangely foreign culture of our most remote state.

"Hawaii really had a lot to offer as a story," Vowell explains. "It was such an appealing look at cause and effect — how this small boatload of New England missionaries arrive in 1820 and overthrow monarchy" 80 years later. Indeed, the point during the Spanish-American War where Hawaii becomes officially a U.S. territory "was the moment we became a world power, an empire." She'll talk about the book Monday at the First Presbyterian Church, as part of the Dallas Museum of Art/KERA speakers series.

Still, when she meets peoples with great connections to the past, Vowell has a real awakening about her interests. "Someone once asked me, 'Why are you so obsessed with American history? It has only lasted 400 years," she says.
