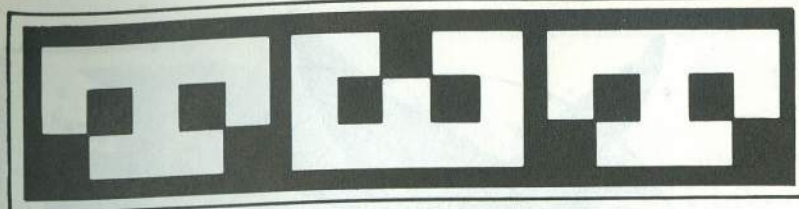

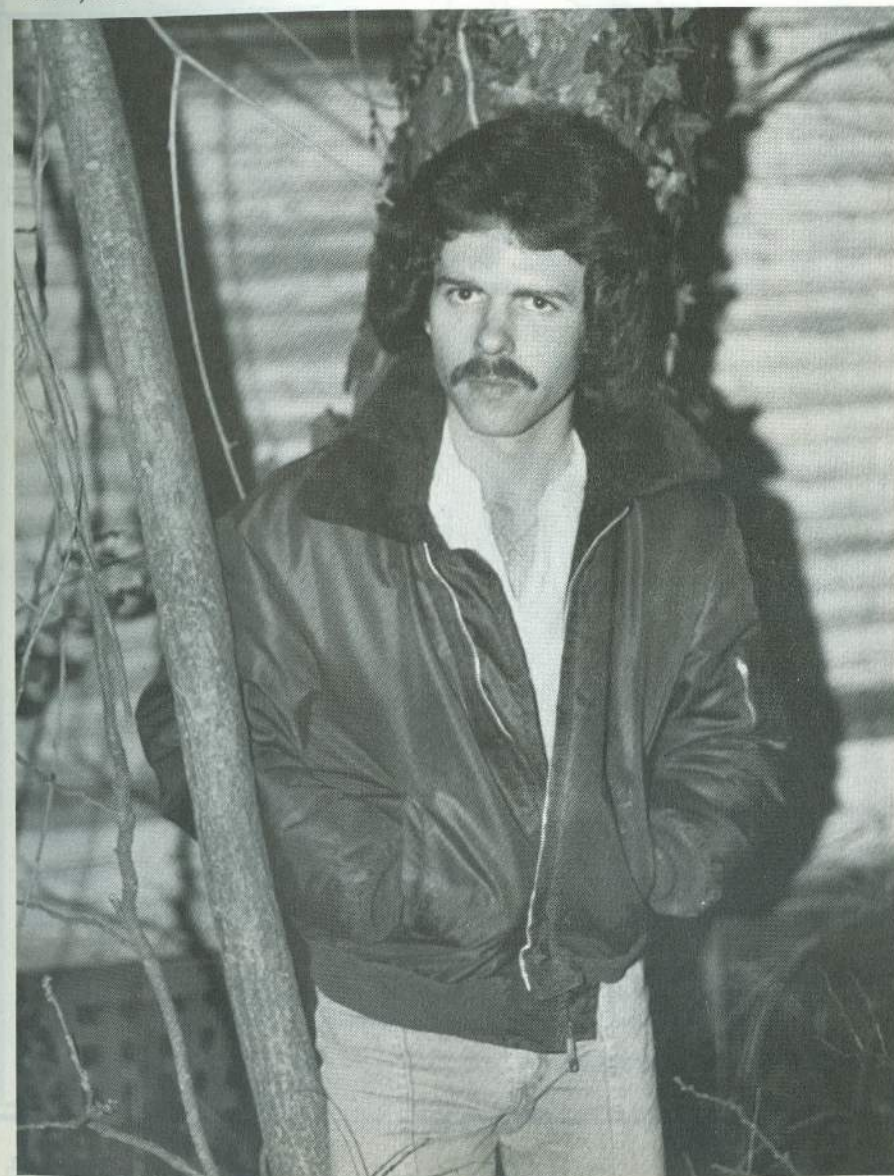

POPULAR RADIO HOST COMES OUT

Neil Rogers, host of a popular Miami radio talk show, made a dramatic coming out statement on station WKAT.

"While it's not really anybody's business, I am making it official today that I am, myself, a member of the gay community," Rogers told his surprised listeners.

With that as an opener, Rogers

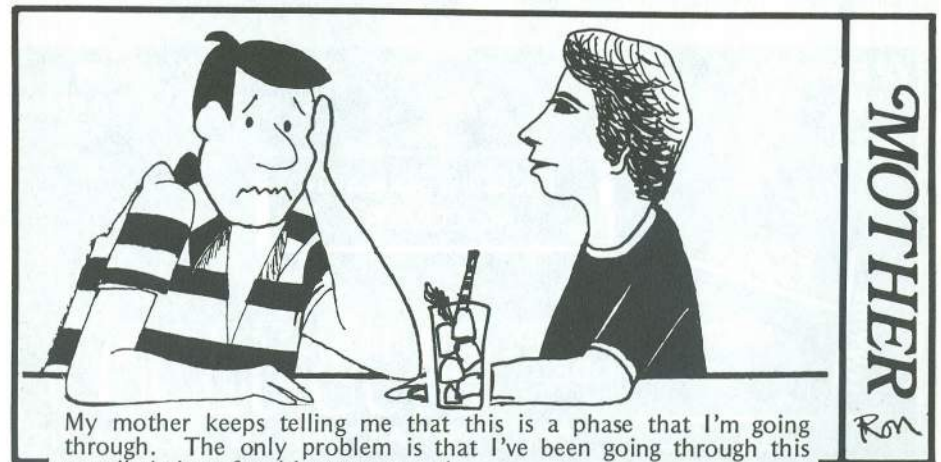
then explained that he thought it appropriate to come out on the show since his guests that day were the two co-executive directors of the NGTF.

"The real reason I have chosen to make this public is that I feel perhaps it will do two things," Rogers said. "First, to encourage other people in the media and in prominent positions to do the same in order to help gain recognition and understanding for all gay people that would allow them to be treated as human beings. And second, for the purpose of helping to make all gay people understand that they do have people who are willing to be open and speak in their behalf."

Rogers' boss told Associated Press that he did not expect the statement to hurt Rogers' standing at WKAT.

"P" OR "H"

On December 8, 1976, the Dallas Motion Picture Review Board took action to provide a new classification for PG rated movies. Their new classification is "P" for perversion, and will include masochism, homosexuality, necrophilia, and other so-called "perverse" sexual activities. The rating becomes effective February 11, 1977.

The Dallas Gay Political Caucus immediately objected to the unfair labelling of homosexuality as a perversion. In a statement present before the Dallas Motion Picture Review Board, DGPC member Steve Wilkins said, "There are as many so-called 'perverse' sexual activities among heterosexual men and women as there are among homosexual men and women. The word homosexual cannot be classified as a perversion any more than heterosexual can be. There is good and bad in all societies and to label the good with the bad has always and will always be an injustice."

Wilkins went on to recommend to the Review Board that if they must label homosexuality in films, they should use the letter "H". "That is honest and describes it for what it

is. Even on television during 'Family Hour', which is viewed by millions of adults and children, homosexuality is labeled as that, not as a perversion.

"As you know, in other cities, such as Memphis, boards similar to this have been declared unconstitutional. If this type of classification continues and homosexuality is not dropped from inclusion in your 'P' rating, we are prepared to take the legal action necessary to gain such a judgement against the Dallas Motion Picture Review Board," Wilkins declared.

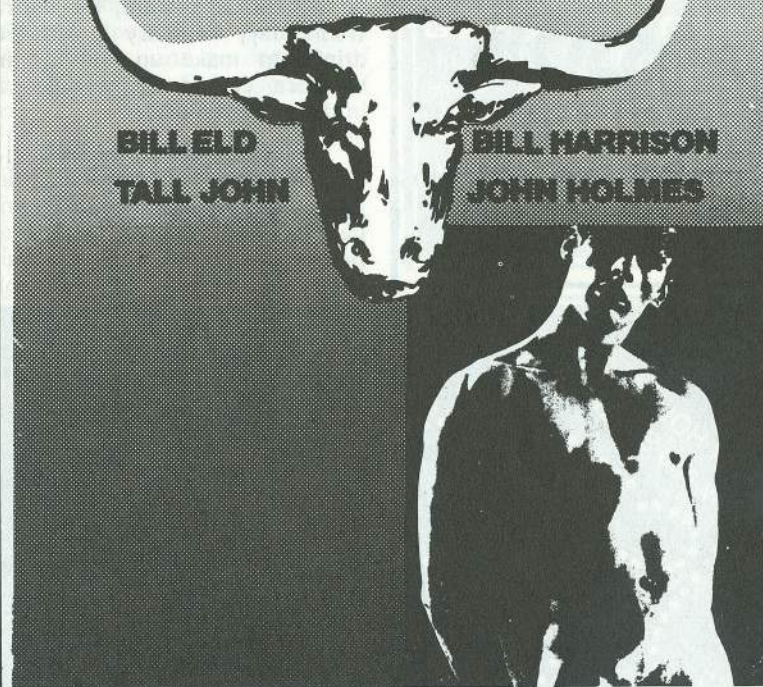

There was no sabotage as has been rumored.

As an OP gesture, the bar rallied Wednesday, February 2 with 5c bar drinks to make up for the inconvenience caused the people caught in the power failure.

MYTHS DISPELLED

Wholesale seductions of little children, pandemic outbreaks of homosexual rape, and an overall increase of gay people in assorted criminal activities—these are the fears that homophobic

legislators voice in opposition to reforming statutory bans on gay sex now the law in most states. But a recent study by a California sociologist indicates that in states where such laws have been repealed, these dreaded consequences never materialized.

Dr. Gilbert Geins, University of California/Irvine sociologist, surveyed police departments, prosecuting attorneys, and gay groups in seven states where gay sex between consenting adults has been legal for several years. In results published in the *Journal of Homosexuality*, Dr. Geis found that the reforms brought no increase in homosexual rape, no increase of gay sex with minors, and no increase of gay people involved in non-sexual crimes.

Half the police surveyed said the decriminalization allowed them to spend more time on serious crimes. Other police and prosecutors added that blackmail of gay people decreased after the reforms took effect.



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

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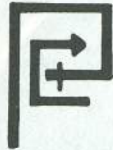

BOYCOTT FLORIDA OJ

Anita Bryant, commercial representative for the Florida citrus industry, lead a protest group of 400 in opposition to a progressive Dade County resolution passed January 18 prohibiting discrimination in housing or employment based on sexual preference. When the commissioners refused Ms. Bryant's demands, she began a pepttion drive to obtain the 10,000 signatures necessary to put the question as a referendum on the Dade County ballot. The GPC's support of this boycott is based on the conviction that Ms. Bryant should be responsible for her discriminatory stand as well as the large industry she represents.

The Houston GPC is currently preparing to present a similar anti-discrimination proposal for the Houston area.

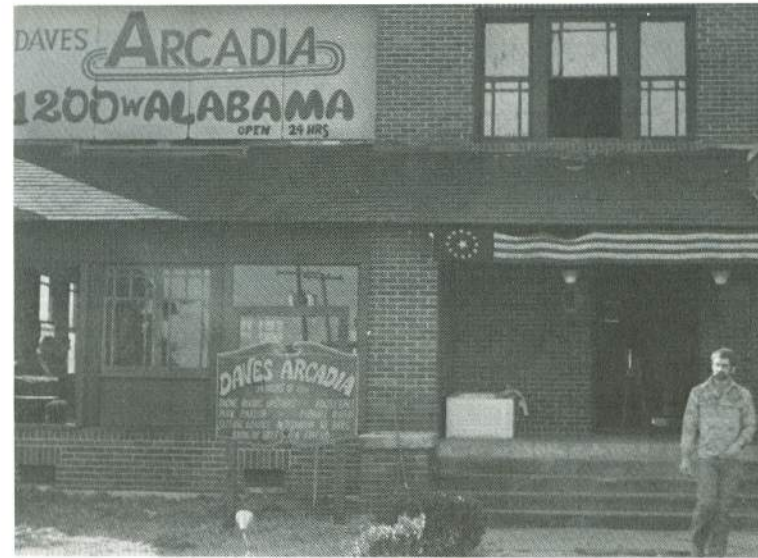

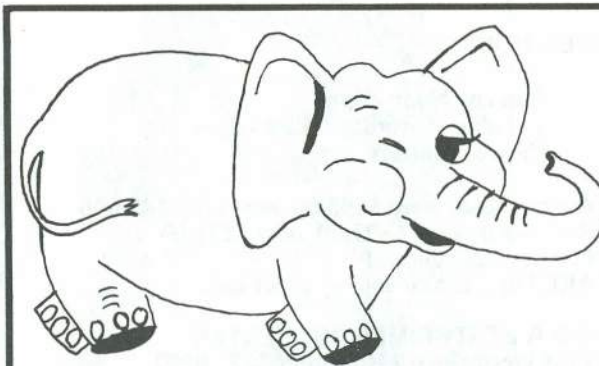
"You're right. Why discuss it? I won't pry," Zachary faked nonchalance.

AUSTIN BOOKSTORE ARRESTS

According to a story in the Austin American Statesman for Thursday, January 27, vice officers and four detectives raided Mr. Peepers Bookstore in Austin. The story has been blown up on TV and radio and grossly exaggerated in several newspapers. It was not a raid! According to the management of Mr. Peepers, it was an isolated private arrest conducted quietly without other patrons' knowledge. The original arrest was a political ploy to unseat a district attorney from a small city near Austin. In fact, the original charges filed against the first individuals arrested have now been changed.

The first two arrested were initially charged with homosexual conduct, a Class C misdemeanor. After entering a plea of not guilty in municipal court, they were released on \$102.50 bond. After detectives reviewed the reports, they decided the wrong charge had been filed and dropped the lesser charge. The men were then charged with public lewdness, a Class A misdemeanor.

In checking with Austin vice officers, TWT learned that no city wide purge is intended for Austin

bars, bookstores or baths. It is safe to go out. No future arrests are planned.

In an effort to protect customers of Mr. Peepers Bookstore, the management has turned the adult section and arcade into a private membership club. On the first day of selling 25¢ 6-month memberships last Friday, over 400 members were enrolled! Additionally, the popular bookstore has installed an expensive lighting alarm system to key patrons when any trouble is suspected.

TWT reminds all customers of bookstores to always spend a quarter when in a movie booth because when you do, you are renting space making the booth "private property". Any police intrusion without a warrant would then be an invasion of your privacy. Lawyers have repeatedly advised TWT that this holds up in court. So, drop a quarter and save yourself a hell of a lot of hassle!

At 2:55am, December 20th, 1976, two gun shots broke the usual early morning silence of the South Main circuit area. The shots were fired from a large caliber police pistol. The bullets struck and instantly killed Gary Wayne Stock, a 31-year-old bartender at the Inside-Outside/Countryside bar.

The report filed by the police officer firing the pistol indicated that he, officer C.V. Hudson, and his partner had seen Gary run a red light at the corner of Elgin and San Jacinto several minutes earlier. When they tried to stop Gary's Cadillac, he sped off causing a high-speed chase up and down San Jacinto, Fannin, Main, and across Drew, Dennis, and Tuam streets. According to the police report Gary's car spun around on Dennis Street in the middle of the block between Main and Fannin and tried to run down the squad car first,

then officer Hudson who by then was out of the car standing in the street hoping to stop the escaping Cadillac. To avoid being run over, officer Hudson jumped on the hood of Gary's car, drew his pistol and fired through the windshield in self-defense.

Like most of Houston, I heard that strange sounding story while driving in the morning traffic. Within 24 hours, I knew that story was false on all counts: I knew that Gary had left the bar at 2:47am and that there would not have been enough time for any high-speed chase before his death; I knew that a witness standing on the corner of Tuam and Fannin Streets saw no chase in the area; I knew that the wet dirt on the hood of the car Gary was driving proved no one had been on the hood; I knew that the wind-



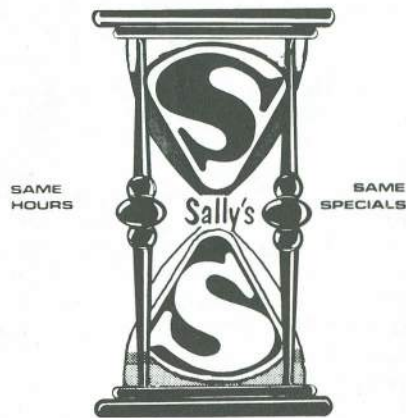

shield was intact, but the driver's side window had been broken or shot out; I knew that Gary had been shot high under the left arm, indicating that his arm was raised when the bullets hit him; I knew that the first witness on the scene had not been allowed to state some of the facts in his report to police.

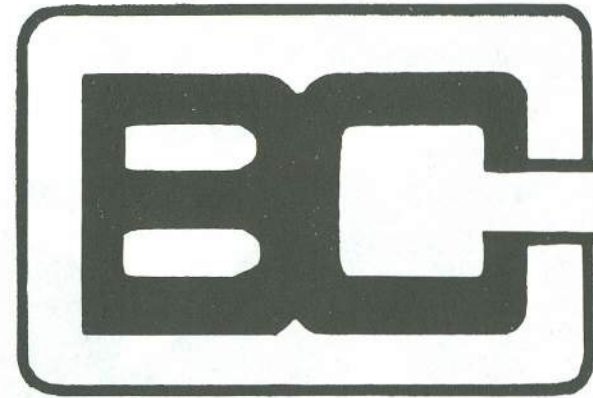
I knew all of the above, because a group of people close to Gary had collected all of the information and wanted to know what to do with it. A meeting was called where the facts were reviewed and it was decided to ask the gay community to join in a call for a full investigation. A petition was drawn up and circulated. I asked a friend in the media to get a copy of the police report.

When the manager of one of the big discos refused to allow the petition circulated in his club, I called and discovered that he had been shown a police report different from the one originally filed. Another check of police files indicated that a second report had indeed replaced the original. The original could not be found.

The group met again and it was decided that pending Gary's family's approval all efforts would be expended

to get a full investigation. Statements were taken and notarized. Petitions were gathered and counted. A complaint was filed with the FBI. The Mayor's office was informed as was the US Attorney's office in Houston. The statements were presented to Police Chief Bond's office and the FBI. The petitions calling for the investigation and the suspension of the officers involved were given to the Police Chief's office.

The family announced that they did not want the matter pursued. They would rather Gary be thought of as a criminal who tried to kill a police officer than be embarrassed by his lifestyle. The original group of concerned friends fell into dissention over what should be done in the matter.

The investigations lagged or did not happen at all. Time passed. Gary's death seemed unimportant to those

who were originally concerned. There are indications that the police department did not send the statements to the District Attorney's office. So a Grand Jury considered only the police report and rendered a "no bill" in the case.

Faced with the likelihood that Gary's death would be soon forgotten and that the officer who shot him would still patrol our community, another flurry of concern arose. A check with the FBI indicated little interest. The District Attorney's office is reluctant to reopen the case.

The questions are: Who cares about Gary's death and are we concerned enough about our own safety to press for a hearing of the evidence in a court of law?

If you care, we need your help. Write or call District Attorney Carol Vance, Harris County Courthouse and ask that the case be reopened and that *all* evidence be presented to a Grand Jury.
