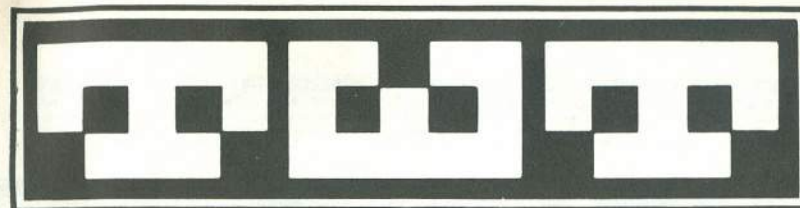

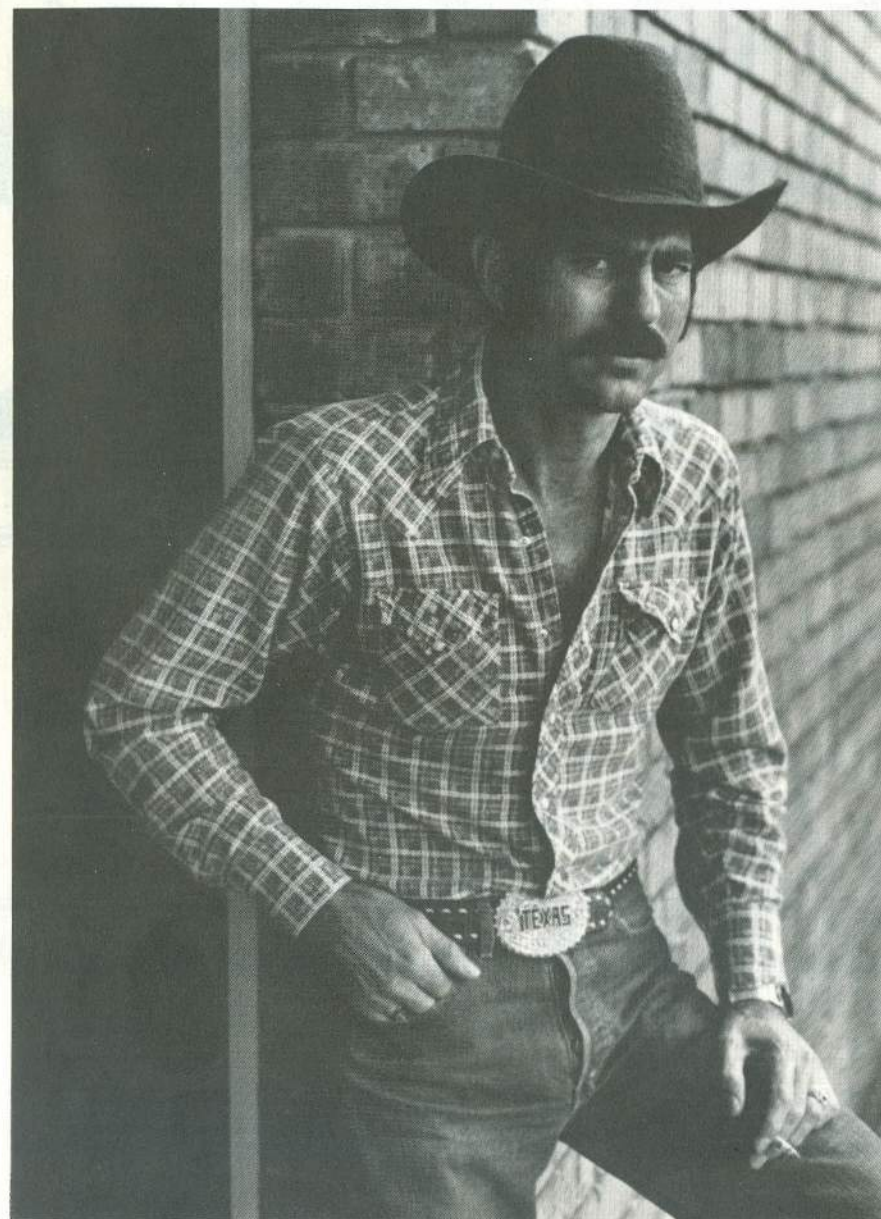

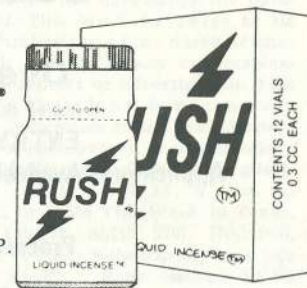

THE BOOK STORE HASSLE

Friday, February 25, Houston Police Vice Officers acquired warrants for the arrest of ten employees of adult book stores in the Houston area. Arrests were made at seven of the ten stores, including Adultz 3 on San Felipe, Mr. Peepers 1 on Telephone Road, Mr. Peepers 3 on Airline, Mr. Peepers Glory Hole on Fannin, Bellaire News, Rosalies Too on Preston, and North Houston Adult News on Airline. This current round of harassment against bookstores is part of District Attorney Carol Vance's antipornography campaign prompted by pressure from such anti-First Amendment groups as the Committee on Community Standards and the Citizens Against Pornography. TWT emphasizes that no action was taken against customers in the stores, and that, so far as can be determined at this time, no such action is contemplated. The arrests

are being made in an effort to force the stores to stop selling gay or straight films and books depicting explicit sex acts.

The owners of these stores have told TWT that they will go to court in order to prevent imposition of censorship in the form of a repressive "community standard" that prohibits the sale of hard-core pornography. TWT re-emphasizes that the recent police actions were not mass raids or busts. The police did not harass any customers or enter the arcades of any of these businesses. And TWT would also like to congratulate the owners of these stores for their strong stand against repression and censorship. Support these stores by signing the petition posted in each one, and by writing letters portesting censorship to District Attorney Carol Vance, the City Council, and to the two daily Houston newspapers.

AGGIE GAYS SUE FOR OFFICIAL RECOGNITION

Gay Students Services, an organization of more than 20 Texas A&M University students, filed suit in Federal District Court in Houston on Monday, February 28, seeking the court to force the university to recognize the group as a student organization. The action is pursuant to the university's denial of official status to Gay Students Services.

The recognition effort began on April 5, 1976 when Gay Students Services filed an application in accordance with university regulations. At that time, Dr. John Koldus, Vice-President for Student Services, told the group that rejection of the application would be soon forthcoming. Eight months later, on November 29, 1976, Koldus formally denied recognition in a letter


stating that homosexual conduct is illegal in Texas and that it would be inappropriate for a state institution to condone a student group "likely to incite, promote, and result in" illegal activities.

Koldus' official letter came only after the students' attorney, Ms. Bobby Nelson of Austin, notified the university that a suit would be filed if a response were not forthcoming. Ms. Nelson was attorney for a gay group at the University of Texas at Austin which won a similar suit several years ago.

The students' suit alleges that they are being deprived of their constitutional rights to express their views and to assemble together. It also states that the students are forced to seek off-campus meeting places, resulting in rent and maintenance payments, and that they are denied the right to distribute literature

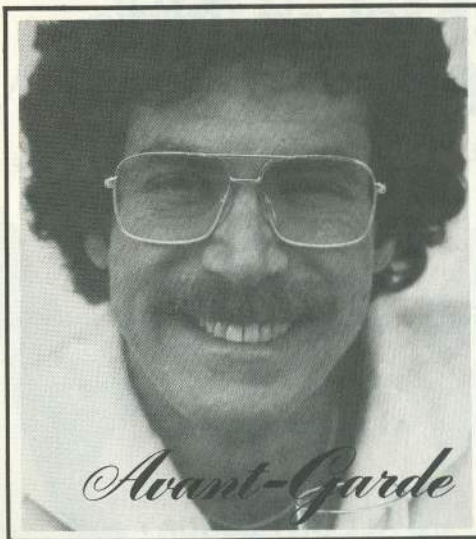

HOUSTON GAY MURDERED

After leaving a Houston Gay bar, a 22-year old Latin American Male was taken by an unidentified companion to the old Humble Road area north of Houston. There he was raped several times, sexually mutilated, and brutally murdered. His body was discovered the following afternoon. The victim was Coronado San Miguel, known to his friends as "Corey". The circumstances of his death closely parallel those surrounding the murder of Rene Guillotte several months ago. Neither Guillotte's nor San Miguel's assailant has been apprehended. Harris County Detective Jay Evans, who is investigating both incidents, feels that there is some connection between the two deaths. Anyone having any information relating either to Guillotte or San Miguel is asked to contact Detective Evans at the Harris County Sherrif's office, (713) 221-6020. Police detectives, and TWT, remind you that for your own protection you should always let someone know with whom you plan to leave the bar.

"Please, child, speak softly. There's a dying person here. In case you hadn't noticed. I decided that I didn't want

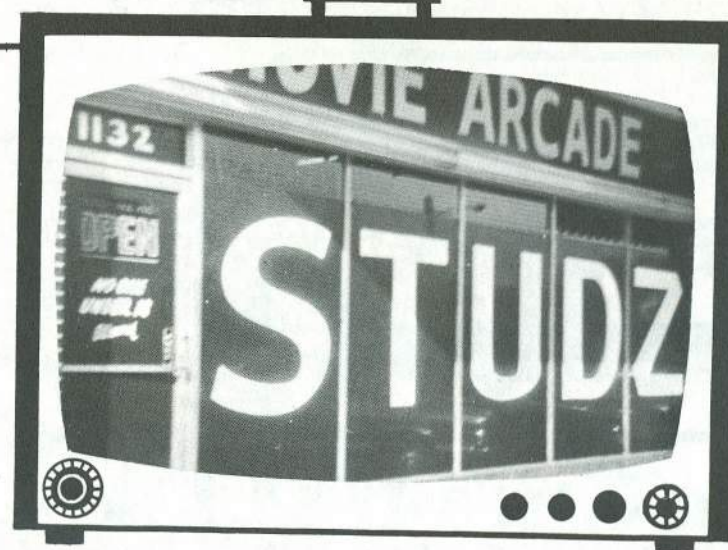

With the Academy Award ceremony less than a month away, talk in movie circles is centering around who will be the winners of this year's Oscar's. To us ordinary viewers, the selection of winners may seem little more than a popularity contest. But, there are many considerations in the minds of those who vote. Who votes? All the technicians in a particular category nominate the contenders, but the final voting is done by the Academy membership at large. To be eligible, a movie must be shown in an American theatre in the calendar year 1976. Though it does not necessarily have to be an American-made movie, foreign pictures are usually delegated their own category. Movies which receive a big publicity buildup by their studios stand a greater chance of attracting the voters' attention, and thus their votes. In the acting categories, ac-

tors who have paid their dues by appearing in a greater number of quality roles are generally considered more worthy of winning. Newcomers are more easily overlooked. And, an established actor who has never received an Oscar stands the greatest chance of winning, since to the members' minds, he has "earned" his Oscar. (Remember John Wayne's winning for *True Grit*?) Newcomers, no matter how good their performances, are often put off until some future year.

In the Best Actor category (the actual name is Best Performance by an Actor in a Major Role), the race is close. Giancarlo Gianinni, nominated for *Seven Beauties*, gave a compelling performance in a complex role. In a year that had some sterling performances by American actors, his nomination is a testament to the excellence of his work. His chances at



best are slim; it's seldom a foreign actor of any calibre can beat out our domestic product.

Robert DeNiro, too, is a long shot, but for a different reason. *Taxi Driver* was one of the earliest movies of 1976, and thus his performance is less remembered. Since he has already won a Best Supporting Actor Oscar (for *Godfather, Part II*), it's safe to say he will be overlooked.

Sylvester Stallone would have to be considered the dark horse of the race. Though he is a newcomer, his almost single-handed job of putting together *Rocky* is sure to net him some honor. That, combined with the possibility of a stalemate between the two actors in *Network*, make him a real contender.

William Holden has been nominated twice for an Oscar, winning the second time for *Stalag 17*. That was more than 20 years ago, and since then he has provided more than his share of fine performances, in films like *Bridge Over the River Kwai*, *Picnic*, and *Executive Suite*. As a TV executive feeling the pressure of his business, he was the backbone of *Network*. He may very likely win. Except for Peter Finch. Finch, an Australian actor who has made America his home, was the real star of *Network*. His portrayal of Howard Beale, the Mad Prophet of the Airwaves, would have ordi-
