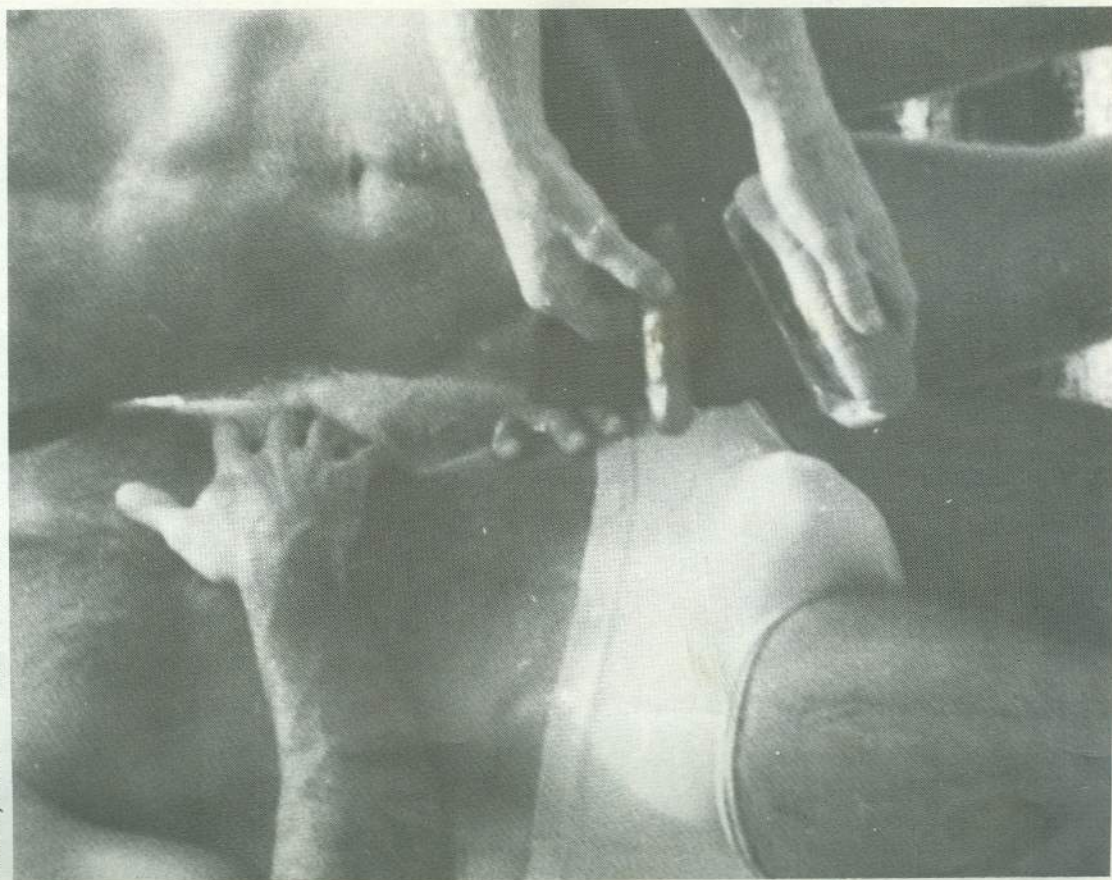

HUMAN RIGHTS LEAGUE FORMED

A coalition of gay businessmen in the Houston community recently formed a new activist organization, the Houston Human Rights League (HHRL). The organization was formed to combat official abuses of power aimed at gay people and gay businesses. The continual police raids on several gay bookstores and the recent police beating of a gay man arrested at a bookstore provided the immediate impetus for the formation of HHRL. Concerned members of the gay community see these incidents as part of a larger framework of bureaucratic negligence and abuse that directly affect the well-being of every gay Houstonian.

Coming from this background, the HHRL has taken as its purpose the representation of Houston's gay community to all levels of government and to the general public. Its function will be educational rather than political with a

long-time goal of eliminating the pervasive myths about gay people which provide the basis of homophobia.

HHRL will not involve itself in internal affairs of any gay business or organization, but will instead concentrate its energies on protecting gay institutions from attack from external sources.

At present, HHRL has one full-time paid Executive Director, Ray Hill, and a volunteer office staff. Initial support has come from several gay businesses, and the HHRL will be asking for additional contributions and support from gay and non-gay individuals and businesses sympathetic to the cause of civil rights for gays.

AUSTIN BENEFIT FOR DCCHRG



HHRL RESPONDS TO BOOKSTORE RAID

Early Wednesday morning, May 25, Carter's Warehouse on Richmond was raided by Houston vice officers. Several customers were arrested, including Rusty Kell, owner of Mr. Peepers Bookstores, who was beaten by the police. Ray Hill, Executive Director of the Houston Human Rights League, arranged Kell's release from city jail and began immediately to alert Houston media to this latest abuse of police power directed toward the gay community. In a statement before City Council, Hill vowed to remain in the Mayor's Office until such time as Mayor Hofheinz finds it convenient to grant him an audience with someone in HPD with authority to force the vice squad to obey the law.

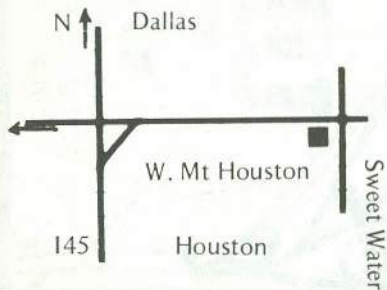



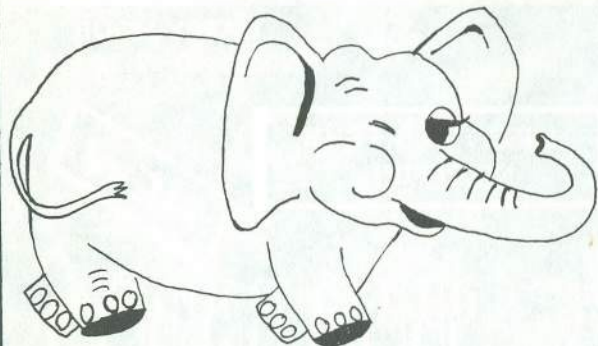

This is the first of a series of articles on gay institutions. I hope to offer an analysis of gay bars, bookstores, baths, churches, and gay organizations as formal institutions; T-rooms, street and highway cruising as informal institutionalized phenomena. I make no claim to objectivity. As a gay person, I view the institutions I use from my personal perspective.

Gay bars have traditionally been our most significant institutions. The tradition, however, only goes back to about 1900. There were European equivalents to gay bars and restaurants before that time, but they tended to be ordinary gathering places with neighborhood or select clientele that happened to be gay. There is no indication that these early examples were as important to their gay customers as their modern equivalents.

The gay bar as we know it today is primarily an American invention that at one time provided a closed, controlled

atmosphere where gay people could drop the facades they used defensively all day or assume different facades for nighttime personalities. That "safe turf" notion was the hallmark of gay bars until very recent times. That was great for most gay people because within the confines of the gay bar they could let their hair down without worrying about being seen by bosses, employees, or Aunt Mildred. But the situation had its drawbacks.

The bars catered to captive crowds. Gay people in any given city had only a few bars to choose from. Gay bars often had to be entered from alleys or other secretive means, which, of course, added to the illusion of a hidden underground. Major bar owners in many cities had developed their business expertise in illegal activities. But the myth of "Mafia-owned bars" was and is far greater than the reality. Only a few bars in Northeastern and Midwestern cities were owned by underworld figures. Politicians needing

issues to campaign with, and police officials after larger shares of tax dollars, fanned the myth until the masses believed them to be true. The gay customer was always the victim of inflated drink prices, dingy surroundings, and election-year "clean-up" raids.

The bars and the atmospheres they create are changing. Their doors now open onto busy streets and sidewalks; they now frequently have windows to see out of; the competition is stiff, prices reasonable (often lower than non-gay equivalents). But more importantly, gay owners of gay bars is the rule, not the exception. Many of the improvements can be credited to the improved social position of gay people. We no longer need to hide, so we are not prisoners of hidden institutions.

Gay bars are not now and never have been exclusively or even primarily for cruising and pickups. They are essentially specialized centers where like-thinking people gather for uninhibited communication. The atmos-

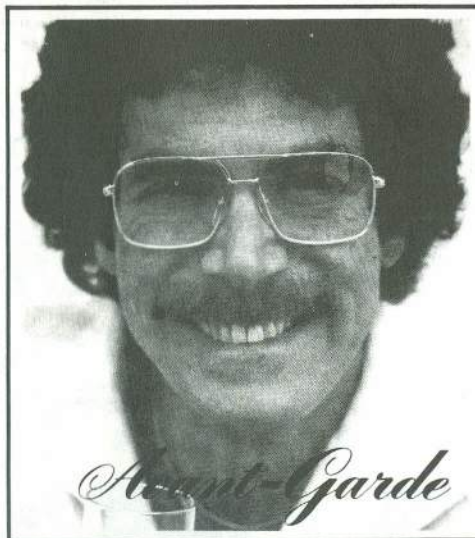
pheres are no longer the same, because gay people are widely dissimilar. We can choose from show bars, discos, leather bars, western bars, neighborhood pubs, even convenient hang-outs for the gay longshoremen and truck drivers.

The bars catering primarily to gay women are often better examples of the community center idea than the larger men's bars. The music is seldom so loud as to interfere with conversation and there is usually more light so one can actually see other people.

The big discos tend to take the opposite personality with loud music and low lighting off the dance floor, but their customers prefer the excitement and activity. Show bars focus all attention on the stage, while the other varieties are similar to the diffuse little groupings at women's bars.

The gay bar is probably the safest of the commercial gay institutions. Our society will permit gay people to congregate in bars, because they think that without bars we would gather on street corners or at junior high schools. That kind of thinking is wrong, but one doubts that it will change any time soon.

Because of the relative scarcity of supportive gay institutions, the gay bar is more important to gay people than the straight bar is to its customers. Gay-bar owners who recognize this and operate their businesses in a service-oriented manner usually enjoy good business for long periods of time, while the grab-the-money-and-run operators enjoy short-lived support.

To a degree, gay bars create ghettos containing gay people, and a lot of activists attack them for this reason. I tend to disagree with that analysis because I see no harmful effects of such a ghetto (if it exists), and feel that, taken as a whole, gay bars offer a range of supportive environments from which we may choose. A circle of friends in the bars or elsewhere does more for individual security and adjustment than anything else. The average gay-bar goer is quite young (under 22 for discos, under 25 overall). These people are yet in the maturation process, or are maturing into a new (for them) gay lifestyle. A positive and supportive environment is essential.

So, the recommendation on gay bars from here is that you choose the bar(s) best suited to your needs; get to know the management and let them know what you expect from the institution, and help make the place warm and friendly for those who come seeking a supportive environment.

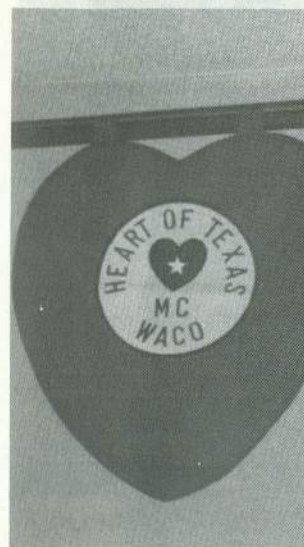

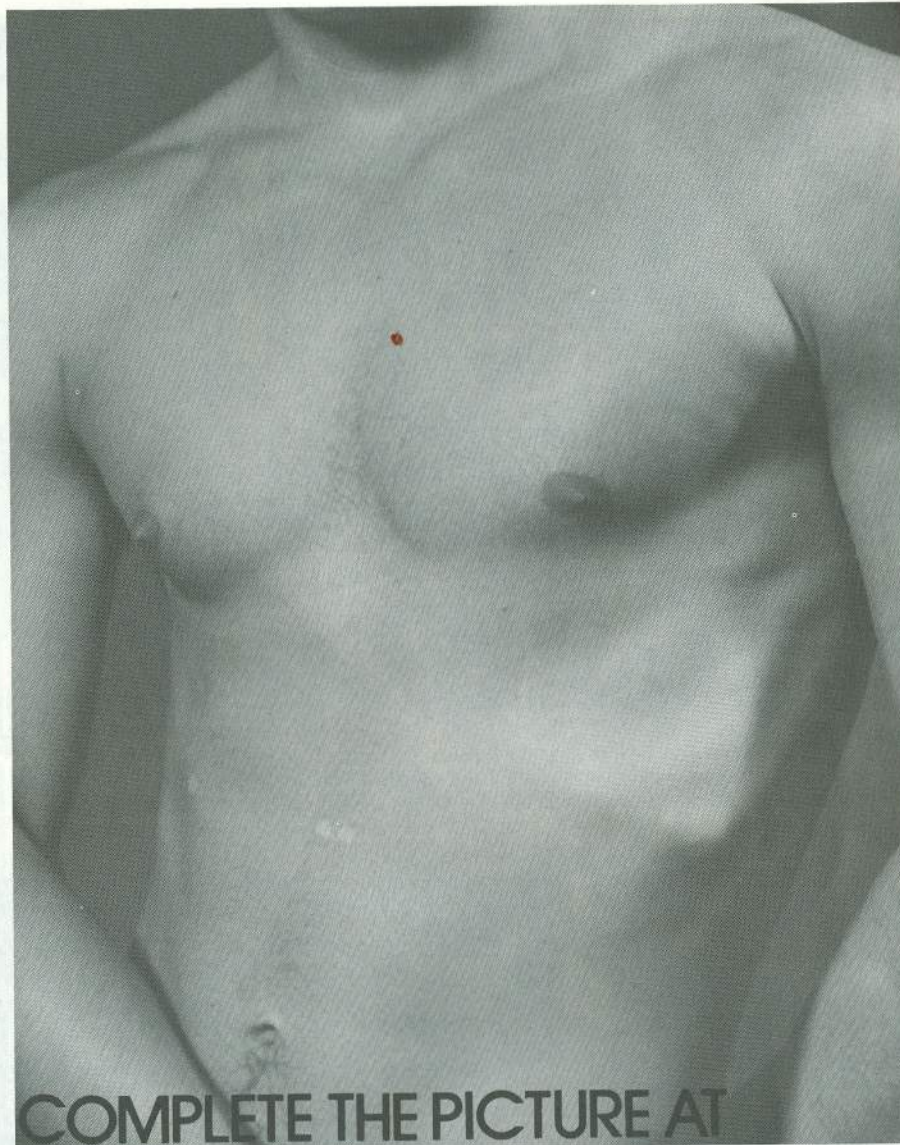

Though the temperature hasn't even hit the 90's in most of Texas, the long hot summer is already upon us in entertainment circles. Television series have gone into reruns, and in the film industry, major studios are gearing up for their major summer releases.

For the time being then, TV schedules are completely awry. Even though fall schedules have been set by the 3 major networks, there is always the possibility of last minute changes. So, the networks are pretesting their shows this summer, calling them "specials," "World Television Premieres," or simply "pilots." While they toil, the most important international film festival of the year is going on in Cannes. US entries this year include *Car Wash*, *3 Women*, and *Bound for Glory*. Winners are to be announced May 27.

Meanwhile, the following films are in production:

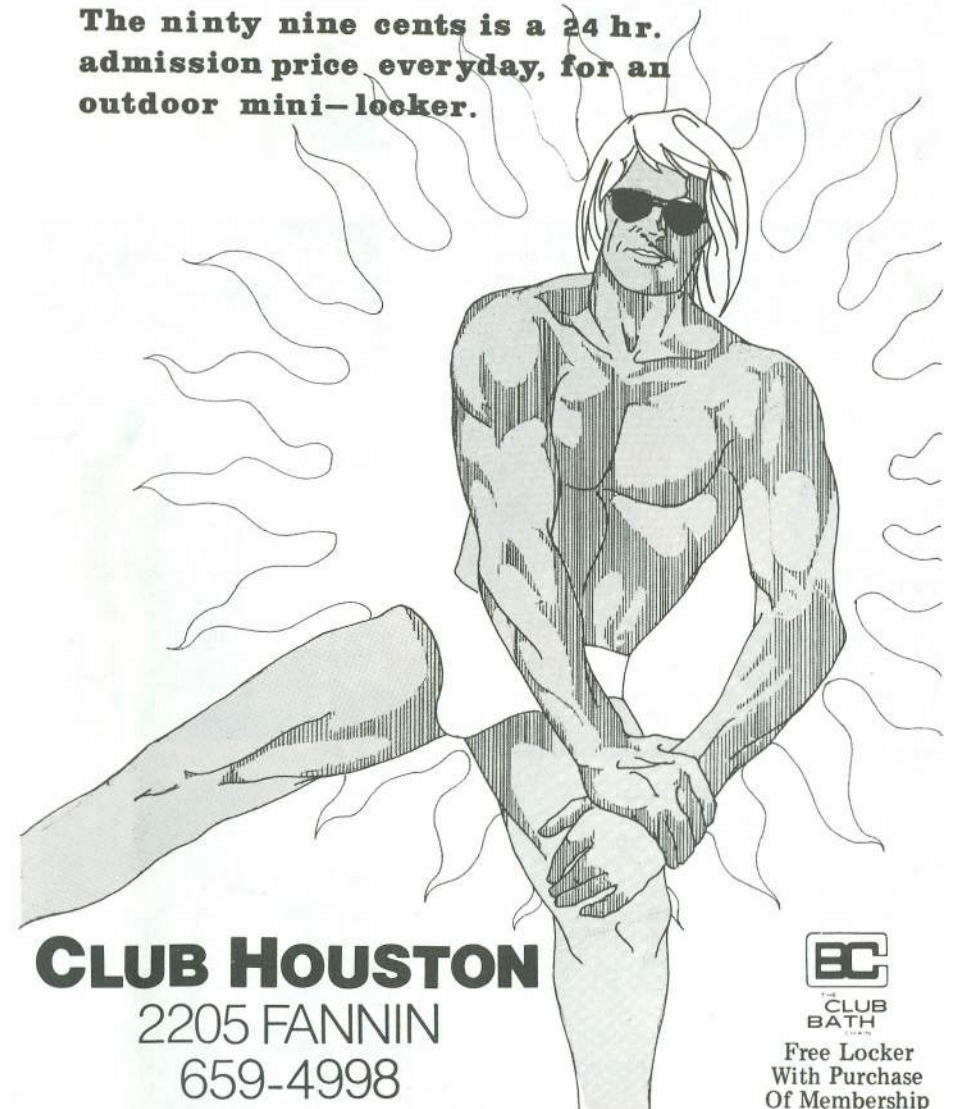

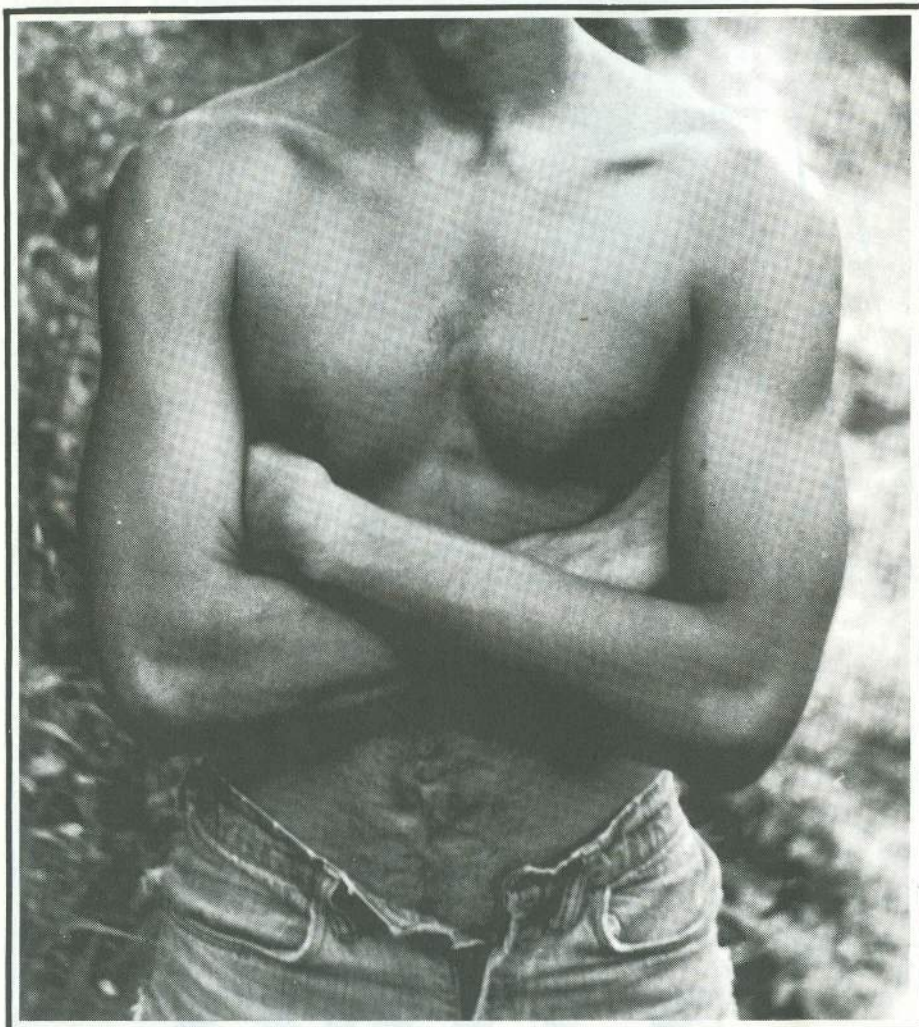

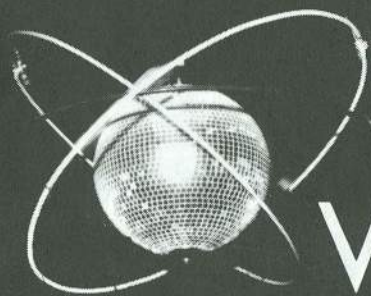
