HUMAN RIGHTS LOSE 2-TO-1

In last Tuesday's Dade County Florida referendum, Dade County's human rights ordinance was repealed by a 2-to-1 majority. The hotly contested election saw a bigger turnout for the county than the previous presidential election. On winning, Anita Bryant said, "...the normal majority of Miami has said enough, enough, enough." A gay rights leader remarked that the disappointing vote did not mean gays would go back into their closets because gays are now organized nationally and stronger than ever. So, Anita has won round one, but the national issue has yet to be finalized...Ironically, the National Hurricane Center in Miami announced on election day that the first hurricane of the season will be named "Hurricane Anita."

A hurricane is a destructive force of nature that is recognized as an aimlessly wandering storm without regard for human life or property.

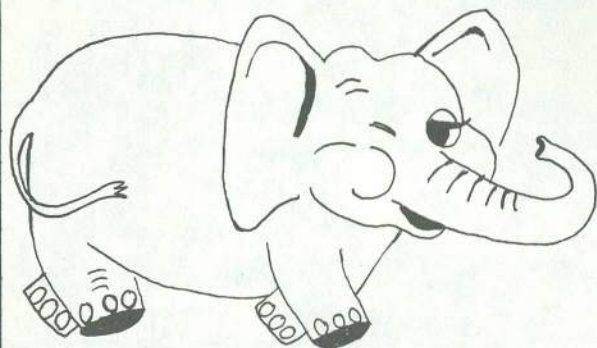

Anita Bryant is coming to Houston and this single event could affect you for the rest of your life. She does not believe that you should have the same human rights that she enjoys. It has been reported in the June 6 *Newsweek* that she "...repeatedly quotes from the Bible to support her arguments that laws protecting homosexuals from discrimination are threats to humanity..." She has also been quoted as publicly referring to homosexuals as "human garbage." These represent only a few of her remarks at degrading our human dignity and reducing us to a third-class citizenship. And if these remarks don't upset you, don't read any further — you would only be wasting your time.

However, to those of you who do resist this, there is something you can do. On Thursday evening, June 16, at 8:00pm PROMPTLY, an anticipated crowd of thousands will be peacefully assembling in the parking lot of the Depository II

(see ad on page 4 of this issue for further information). We have a rally agenda complete with instructions now being prepared and this will be distributed that same evening. (All national and local leaders are emphasizing the absolute necessity of a peaceful, non-violent rally. Anything to the contrary could do immense harm to the gay movement—locally and nationally. *Everyone's* cooperation is necessary.)

Our rally should be attended by both gay people and our non-gay friends and family members. If you know any non-gay supporters, please invite them to attend. They will be doing you and others a very big favor. Also, this is not only a gay rights rally, it is a human rights rally. We have a right to live peacefully — not just exist in overt or covert fear.

Again, we need each and everyone of you. Our success will be measured by both the turnout of our supporters and our ability to maintain a peaceful, organized event.
