JIMMIE CARTER ON GAY RIGHTS

President Jimmy Carter says, "I don't believe homosexuals are a threat to the American family but I do not view it as normal." In an Associated Press interview he remarked that what has caused the highly publicized confrontations on gays is the desire of homosexuals for the rest of society to approve and add its acceptance as a normal sexual relationship. "I don't feel that it is normal but at the same time I don't feel that society, through its laws, ought to abuse or harass the homosexual," the President said.

In sidestepping a question about gays teaching school, he said, "I know there are homosexuals who teach and the children don't suffer but this is a subject I don't particularly want to involve myself in as I have enough problems without taking on another."

This year's conference offered a wide range of workshops, speeches by lesbian and gay-male leaders, a business meeting, worship services, and recreational activities.

Speakers were: Texas activists Ken Cyr and Janna Zumbrun; and Bob Kunst (photo left) and Allan Rockaway (right), the Miami campaign co-directors.

Bob Kunst spoke Saturday night saying, "Dade County's recent election was a mockery of parents exploiting teachers and their own children in the name of their own sexual insecurity. It is perhaps the most gut issue of all to deal with conditioned sexism..."

Things to do: Come out and give our brothers and sisters support and love so they too can come out. Work for the election of pro-gay candidates. Let the media know of every event. Take the Miami cause to the US Supreme Court. Boycott Florida Orange Juice until?"

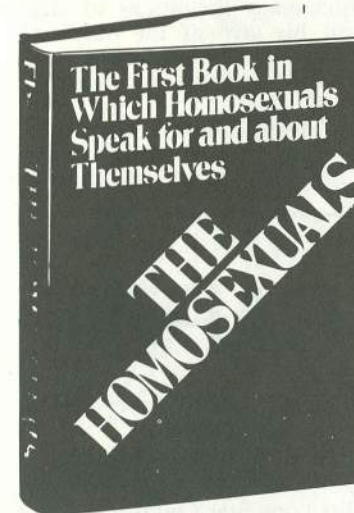
"How's it going?" Burt shouted, leaning out the back door as he watched Zach driving stakes into the backyard turf.

"Let me get the dishwasher started. Then I'll come out and help you."

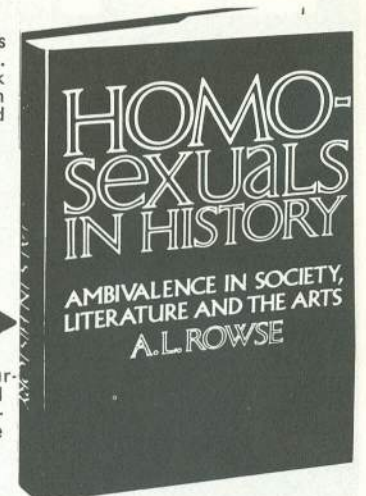
"No need. It's about finished."

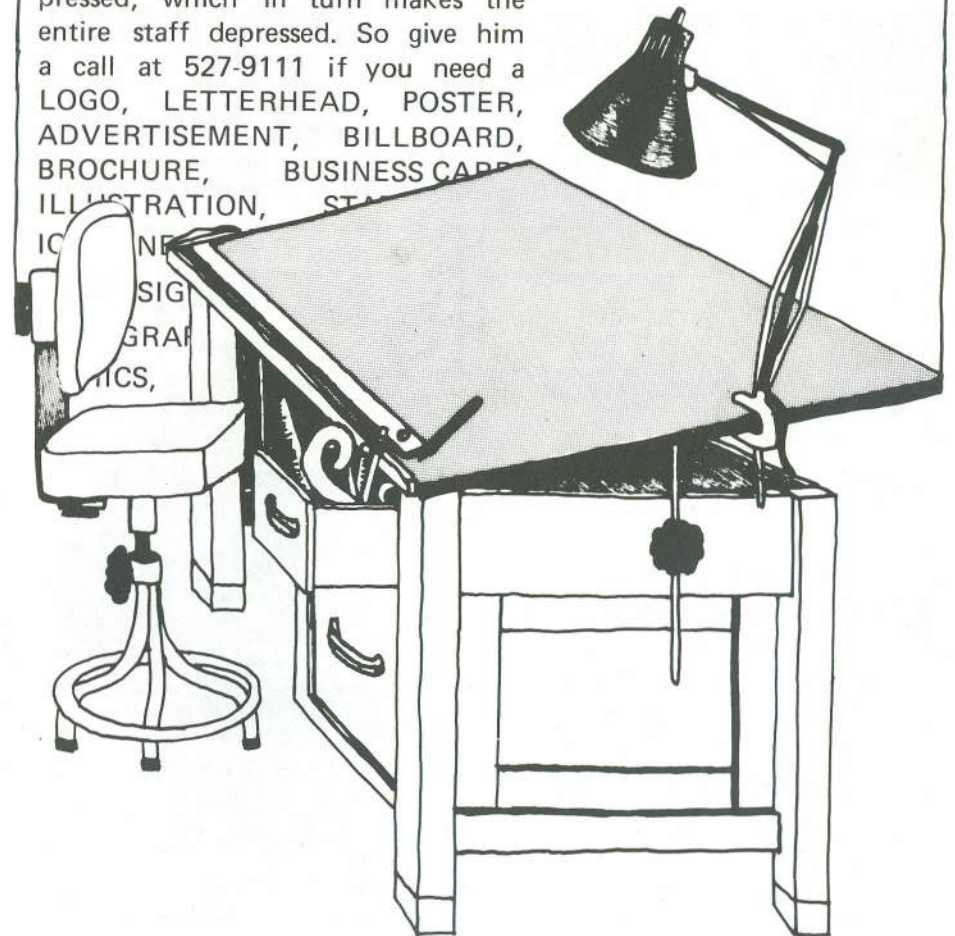

muscles from within. Memories...

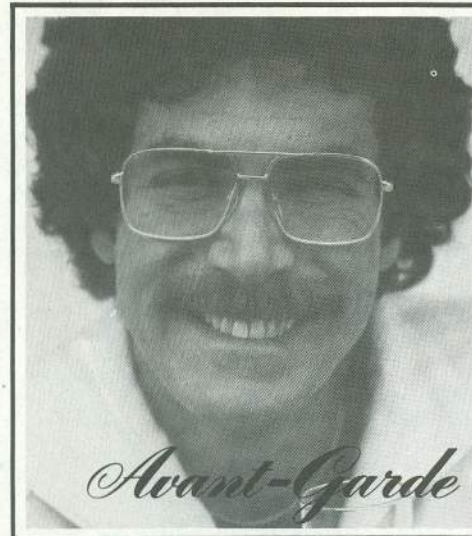
Zach drifted back into reality momen-

The largest human rights rally in the history of Texas was held in the parking lot of Houston's Depository II. The guest speakers included: Hugh Crell (local gay activist); Liz Torres (of *All in the Family*); Nikki Van Hightower (feminist); David Goodstein (publisher of *The Advocate*); Ginny Apuzzo (co-chair of GRNL); and Rev. Troy Perry (founder of UFMCC). The peaceful assembly of gays and nongays was estimated by police at 8 to 10 thousand. The walk downtown past the Hyatt Regency Hotel where Anita Bryant was performing before the Texas Bar Association Convention ended in front of the Houston Public Library with a candlelight vigil.

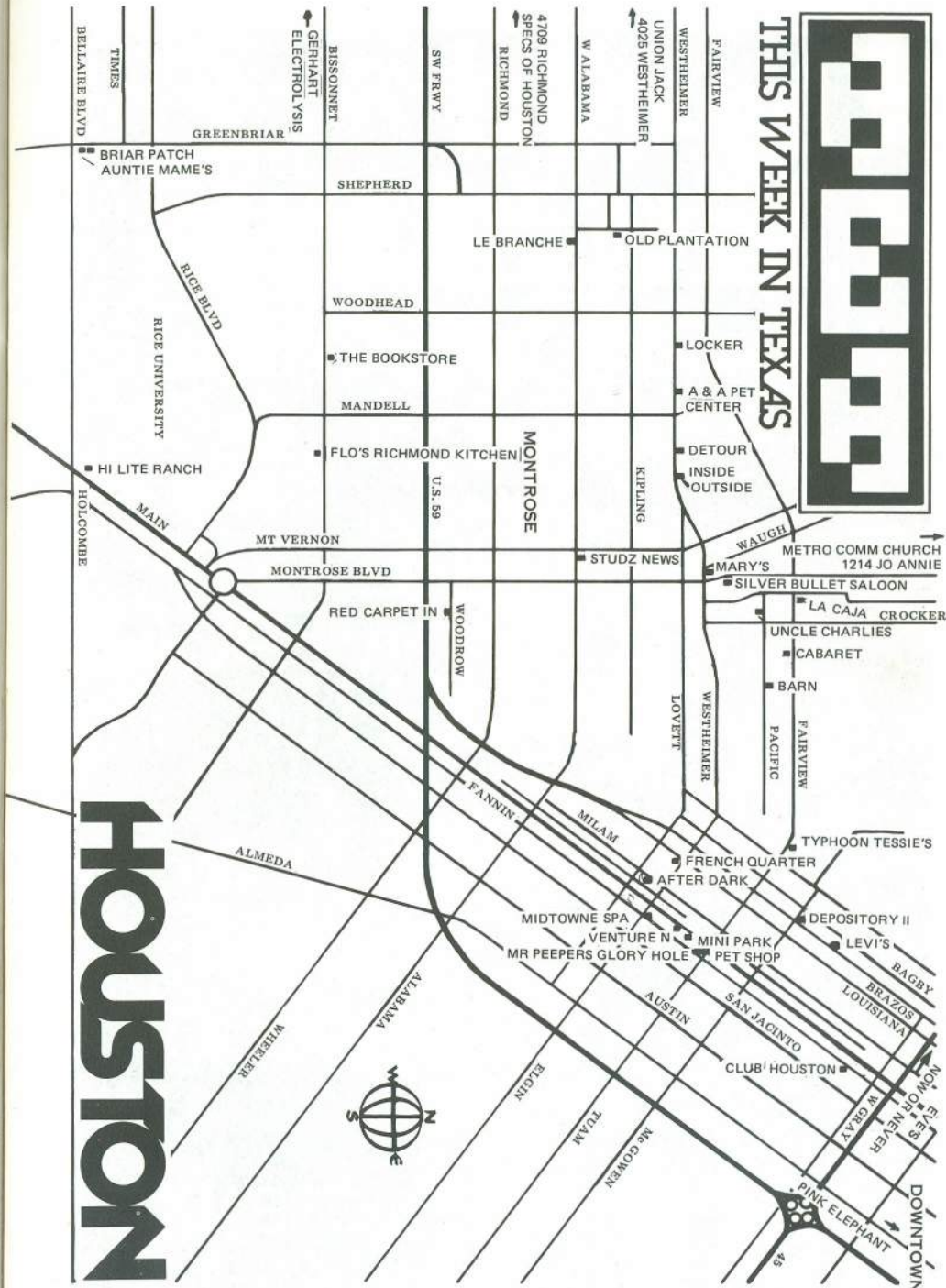



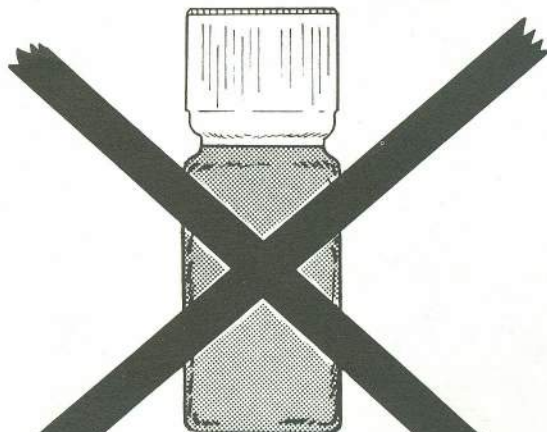
