# popcorn

Summer movie releases are in full swing. The major studios are continually giving us, the viewers, a wide array of choices in viewing this season, with the quality level of the films as varied as the films themselves. Quality aside, however, there's no mistaking that the summer thus far has been an immensely successful one for filmmakers. Box office smashes like *Star Wars* and *Annie Hall* have combined with enduring hits like *Rocky* to make this summer a record setter in box office receipts. And, though response to major releases like *The Deep*, *A Bridge Too Far*, and *The Other Side of Midnight* has been tepid, the overall picture has started a wave of optimism in production circles that will hopefully lead to more and better flicks.

The wide range in quality of the new releases is evidenced by two movies that have premiered this month. One is an adventure/horror story entitled *The Island of Dr. Moreau*, a remake of an earlier

classic called *Island of Lost Souls*. The story was adapted from the H.G. Wells novel, and this remake stars Burt Lancaster and Michael York in the roles originated by Charles Laughton and Richard Arlen. It is an enormously entertaining movie that would restore even the most disenchanted moviegoer's faith. Burt Lancaster and Michael York give fine performances, and the special effects are an added treat.

On the other end of the spectrum is *New York, New York*, which premiered in Texas this month after several month's delay. It was hardly worth the wait. Though Robert DeNiro is more than adequate in his role of a 40's band-leader, there are too many negative influences surrounding him to make the film worthwhile. Among them are the totally implausible plotline, the remarkably uninspiring Kander/Ebb tunes, and a reliance on cheap nostalgia whenever the movie is getting boring, which is

often. Only the most diehard Liza Minnelli fan could ignore a weak and disappointing performance whose only redeeming quality is its similarity to the singing and acting style of her mother.

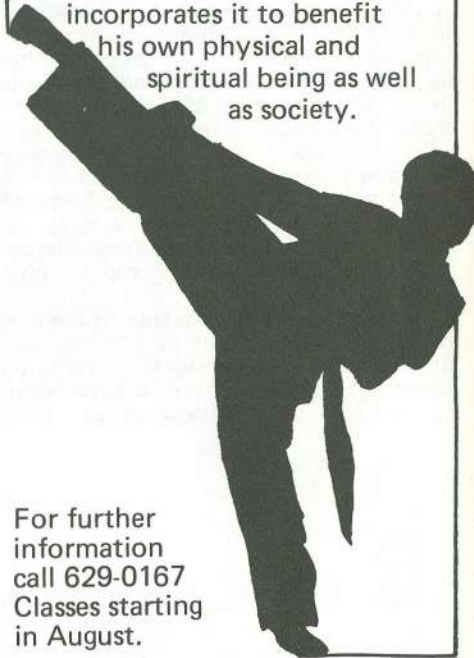
The major television networks are already plugging away at their fall lineups via prime-time commercials. The fact that this has begun in early July instead of mid-August as usual is evidence that the coming season will be a highly competitive one. That's really not surprising when one realizes that for the first time in years the ratings are close to even for all three networks.

The big winner in the ratings race last season, ABC, is currently attempting to quell storm waters surrounding their new series *Soap*. The show is an irreverent soap-opera-type story that has angered many affiliates because of "flouting of convention" in its plotline that the affiliates judge to be far too racy for TV. The biggest protests have come from, interestingly enough, the Catholic Church and several gay rights groups. The Catholics are upset over a planned segment in which a Jesuit Priest is seduced, whereas gay groups are protesting the limp-wristed stereotyping of the show's only gay character. It will be interesting to see if the show

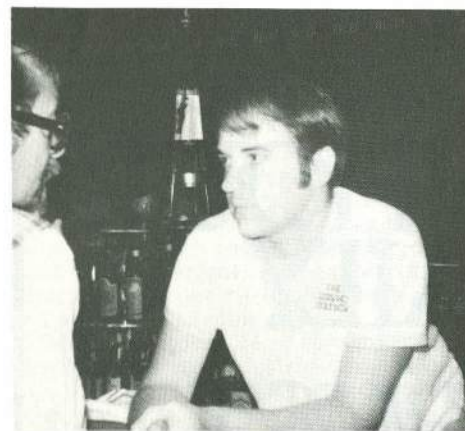



dealt instead with my open homosexuality. It seems that my recent exposure on television and in the newspapers regarding current events has made my gay client nervous. A retired part-time bookkeeper mentioned to him that she had seen me on TV and that while she didn't care what people did in the privacy of their own homes, she personally didn't like having it "crammed" down her throat. My gay client, who describes himself as closeted and living in a "glass house," panicked needlessly. His act of dismissing someone because of their homosexuality or gay activism is not any less wrong than when I was fired as Comptroller. We are what we are and we need not be afraid or ashamed.

How can we convince others to accept us if we cannot accept ourselves? Only after we achieve full self-respect might we be able to obtain our rightful place in society. Gays discriminating against gays in order to protect their own comfortable, closeted existences is as far away from self-respect as I can imagine.
