





The Club Baths of Houston will reopen on or about October 1, completely renovated and modernized after a fire virtually destroyed the place in May. 

### MCC PASTORS FASTING

The Briggs bill would prohibit anyone who is gay from teaching in schools in California.

Sloan is fasting at the front steps of the Ft. Worth Federal Building. Perry is fasting at the San Francisco Federal Building.
