### ABOUT THE COVER

Ms. Elaine Noble (D.-Boston) is Assistant Majority Leader in the Massachusetts House of Representatives. A graduate of Boston University and Harvard Law School, Ms. Noble is serving her second term in the 280-member Massachusetts House. She is one of the most visible gay rights advocates in the United States and was the first openly gay candidate elected to a higher office in the United States.

Noble will be in Dallas September 30 to kick off a major fundraising drive for the Dallas Gay Political Caucus. She will speak at 6:45pm at the Metropolitan Community Church, 2701 Reagan.

The D-GPC has set a goal of \$10,000 to be raised during the week of fundraising events, among which will be a picnic, theatre performance, skating party, and dance contest. The funds will go toward D-GPC's efforts in educating the community and promoting civil rights legislation.

### GPC MEETING

The Houston GPC will meet in regular session Wednesday, October 5 at 7:30

pm upstairs in the Depository II. The Screening Committee will present the results of its interviews with candidates for office in the municipal elections and its recommendations for GPC candidate endorsements. The Caucus will then vote to determine who it will endorse in each of the contested municipal elections from mayor to school board. Other business before the Caucus will be a discussion of a possible "Meet The Candidates" party to be held in October at the Depository. October 5 could be one of GPC's most important meetings, so make plans now to attend!

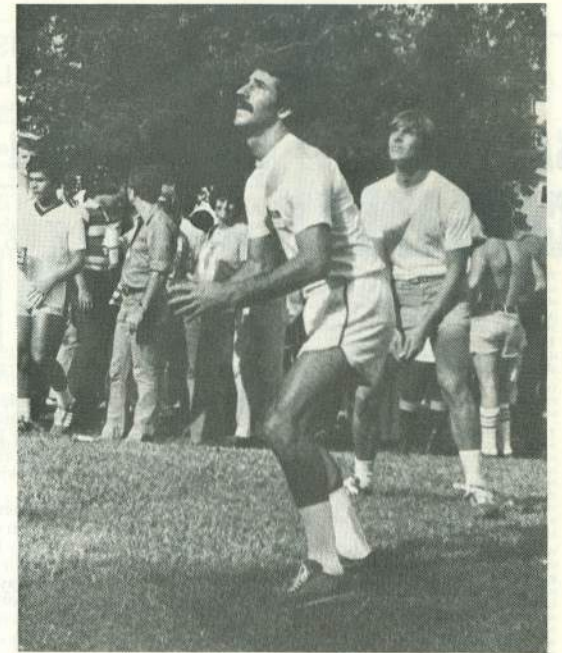

**COORS DID NOT DONATE ANY MONEY TO ANITA BRYANT**

Top management of the Adolph Coors Company of Golden Colorado, has been meeting with the Rev. Ray Broshears, longtime gay activist, and candidate for Supervisor in District 4.

The meetings began on Wednesday August 31, and continued on after top management persons flew here to San Francisco to meet with Broshears on Friday. The two days of talks took nearly five full hours of exchange of ideas, problems and the truth about the Anita Bryant donation.

Broshears, former president of the GLA (Gay Liberation Alliance) admitted to the Coors people that he had created the story about Bryant's "Save Our Children" group having received money from the Coors Company and their Heritage Foundation, in an effort to hurt Bryant.....and based upon the fact that Coors did not hire openly gay people, and the words "sexual orientation" was not in the hiring policies of Coors.

Coors has tentatively agreed to add sexual orientation to their hiring practices...they have also tentatively agreed to hire a gay person as an employment counsellor, and in addition, negotiations are still going on about Coors becoming more aware of consumer problems, and not just with the selling of the beer itself.

Broshears told how in April at the GLA demonstration at the Singer Sewing Machine Company, he had put Coors name on the pamphlet he was handing out as having given

funds to Anita Bryant's campaign. He related how Harvey Milk, who did not of course, show up at the demonstration....called him on the phone later and asked about the Coors donation to Anita....at that time Rev. Broshears said they had donated \$50,000 or so, then Harvey wrote in his column in the Bay Area Reporter, that Coors had given \$50,000 and then the Sentinel of Charles Lee Morris upped the amount to \$100,000....and then Goodstein's Advocate upped it to \$150,000 and then the National Gay Task Force upped it to \$250,000.....and it was all mythical, it had begun in the office of the GLA and was promoted at the Singer demonstration via the media there, and Harvey Milk, who is the political puppet of Alan Baird of the Teamsters Union along with Howard Wallace, militant socialist gay activists, all took up the hue and cry, for the unions wanted to break the back of Coors and saw in this issue, a way to use gays to do so.

Coors never donated any funds at anytime to "Save Our Children" or to Anita Bryant! What began as a ploy to put pressure on Anita, was taken by Harvey Milk, Alan Baird, and Howard Wallace and used to try and break Coors in their labor difficulties.

So, with the tentative agreement reached, is it not time for the gay bars to put Coors back in? We think so. Coors Beer, a family operation is moving into the 21st Century at last by changing their hiring policies. Coors yes....unions no!

"I was hoping you would be able to tell me," Phoebe replied.

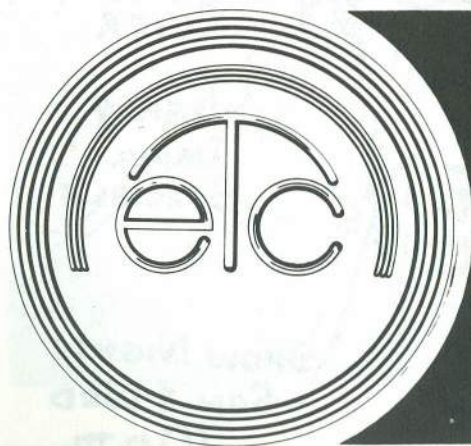

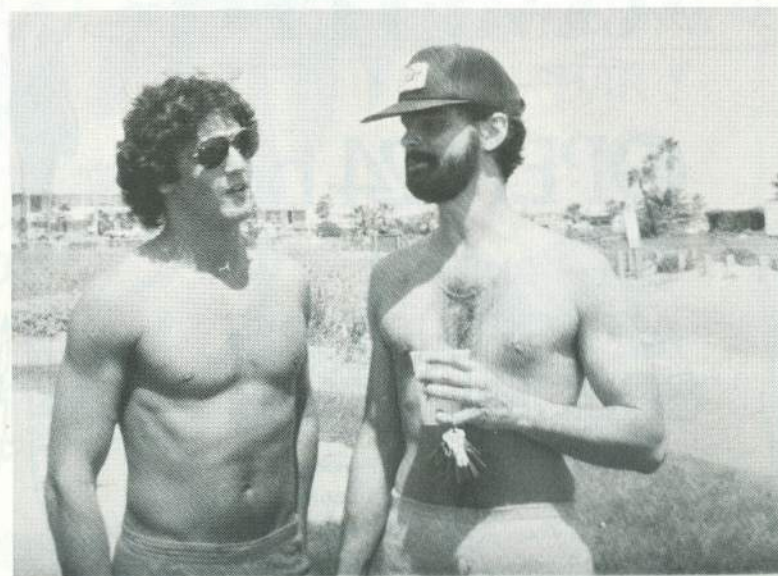
