Since becoming the numero uno network, ABC has wisely spent a great deal of time and money securing new talent to bolster its lead. The network that started its self-improvement program last year by enlisting Barbara Walters to beef up its news division and continued it this year with Redd Foxx and others, has secured various commitments for specials, movies and series from an impressive list of talented performers. Heading up this list of converts is Harvey Korman, who defected from CBS' *Carol Burnett Show* and will have his own ABC variety hour this winter. Since signing Korman, ABC has inked deals with such diverse persons as Cher, Rob Reiner, Jimmie Walker, Cloris Leachman, and Rue McClanahan, (all from CBS), LaWanda Page, (Foxx's co-star on NBC's *Sanford and Son*), and Mary Kay Place. With talent like this waiting in the wings, and more deals sure to come, ABC will probably be on top for a long while to come.

But even Number One makes mistakes. One of these, ABC's new "comedy" series *San Pedro Beach Bums* was their first big mistake of the season. They recently announced the cancellation of that show. NBC and CBS, meanwhile, each have gotten three of their shows ready for the chopping block. They are, respectively, *The Oregon Trail*, *Big Hawaii*, and *Rosetti & Ryan*; and *Raferty*, *Busting Loose*, and *We've Got Each Other*. By December, there will be a whole new set of shows on the air to replace these outcasts.

Two new theatre releases deserve mention and acclaim. One is the Sophia Loren-Marcello Mastroianni film, *A Special Day*, an Italian import. Loren is cast as a housewife and Mastroianni as a gay neighbor in preFascist Italy. Loren's performance has drawn critical acclaim across Europe and the U.S., and there is talk of a possible Oscar nomination. Loren herself considers it one of her two best efforts, the other being her

As the blimp crept past, Vera then saw that the roof of the building was




