So I will close now, diary. My last entry for 1977. May God bless us all, diary. And to all, a good night.

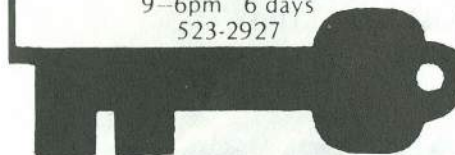

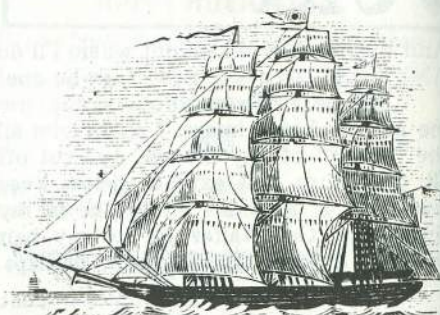

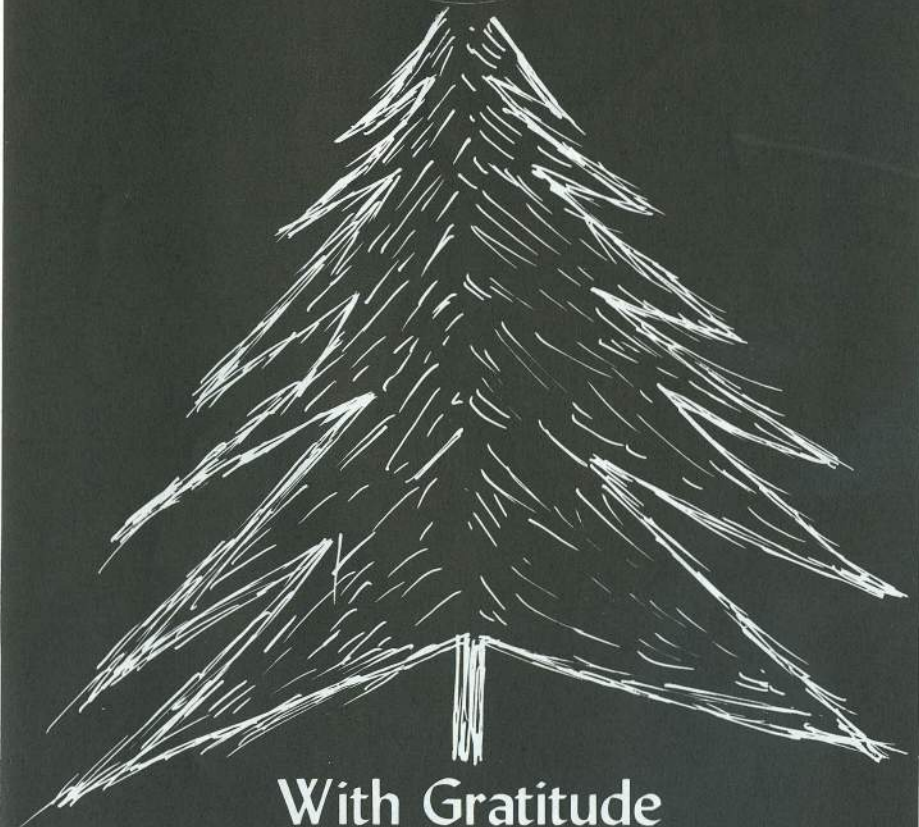

The biggest movie ever shot in New York is being filmed there now. It's the movie version of the Broadway musical *The Wiz*, which was the stage adaptation of *The Wizard of Oz*, the children's classic from which the more famous movie by the same name was taken. *The Wiz* is being directed by Sidney Lumet and, like the stage original, features an all black cast. Diana Ross, in an odd bit of casting, will play the 14 year old Dorothy, with support from Richard Pryor as the Wiz, Michael Jackson as the Scarecrow and Lena Horne as Glinda the Good Witch. The Big Apple is being transformed into the Emerald City at a cost in excess of \$15 million, with director Lumet using a wide variety of location shots. Producer Rober Cohen, who was responsible for another Ross vehicle, *Mahogany*, is expected to have his offbeat production ready for the public sometime in the latter part of 1978.

The Wiz is part of a new movie boom for New York. Noteworthy productions that are currently filming in that city include Jon Peters' production of *Eyes*, the story of a fashion photographer, played by Faye Dunaway; the first screen version of *Hair*; and *Somebody Killed Her Husband*, a comedy-mystery starring Farrah Fawcett-Majors and Jeff Bridges; as well as a score of smaller productions.

News From the Tube: The focus on competition between the three major television networks has been switched recently to the area of news with ABC's announcement that it will be concentrating on improving the ratings of news shows, especially the ABC Evening News. ABC has long been number three in the news shows ratings race and now with a comfortable over NBC and CBS in the primetime ratings is now ready to improve its news show's performance. CBS, incidentally, which has trailed other net-
